

JACK'S BACK!

Best known for his Elvis Tribute Shows, Jack decided to be who he's always been and bring his talent and arragements back to the stage as - Jack Smink. It's been a long time coming, and *Brevard Live* talked to him about his new show, his new CD, his new image and the causes which make this dinner concert important to him.

All your life you have successfully performed Elvis Tribute shows, actually all around the world. When and why did you decide to start performing as Jack Smink and what can your fans expect?

Jack: Actually, I've always presented myself as Jack Smink, performing an Elvis Tribute Show. Since 1977, my shows have been comprised of songs that Elvis performed, with very few exceptions. I have had the same appearance and voice since my teen vears. About 1 ½ years ago, I decided to explore other songs from that era to present day that were fun and told a story. You're going to see and hear the same person, just songs from a variety of different artists and different genres from country to rock, rock'n roll to blues, rhythm & blues to hard rock. Also, on a challenge, I rearranged a song by AC/DC and, in my opinion, did a good job with it! Other songs include my arrangements of songs by Lynard Skynard, Waylon Jennings, Billy Givens, Jace Everett, Roy Orbison, Travis Tritt, Garth Brooks, The Beatles, Three Dog Night, Aretha Franklin, Kenny Rogers, and BB King. Let it not be mistaken, these are songs from the past and present eras, performed by great artists, but now being performed myself with my own arrangements. This is not a tribute. This is a journey through songs from the past and present with my own spin ap-

plied. In the last year and a half, I have made a conscious effort to reinvent and perform this style and type of music in my own very unique manner.

You have been at Studio 101 for rehearsals and recordings. I understand you have a CD coming out rather soon?

Jack: I started arranging and recording these songs with Studio 101-owner/ sound engineer Brendon Paredes, and with some amazing Brevard County musicians, among them Larry Dewese, Mike Hostettler, Skip Gosnell, Al Brodeur, Clinton Hatcher, David Pastorius, Alex Petrosky, Tommy Craig, and Pat Travers. I also have had several background vocalists - Flo Logan, Jamalia Scott, Laura Pittman, and Mitzi Dale on the recordings. My live shows will include some of my studio musicians and some stage musicians for a total of 8 on stage musicians and 2 background vocalists, and me. My album, Jack's Back, is in the final stages of legal obligations that occur with every album by every artist. My expected release date is by the end of 2021.

What are your plans for your musical future?

Jack: I'm still working on and updating my website. I'm doing a 3-camera shoot at the October show and will use this video to promote this and similar shows both locally and farther out. Frankly, I live to perform live shows. I also intend to market some of the al-

bum recordings to commercial entities. It's kind of like starting all over again, only now I have many years of experience in this industry.

The show in October is also a fundraiser. Tell us about it.

Jack: The October 2 show is titled, Jack Smink and Lightning Strikes Twice Productions presents a Tribute to America's Medal of Honor Recipients. Along with the musical selections, we will have a silent auction with items donated by many local businesses, a 50/50 raffle, and a donation box where anyone who drops a donation in the box will receive a copy of a song that I wrote and performed entitled Just One More Time. All monies collected from the silent auction, raffle, and donations will go directly to the Medal of Honor Memorial, which will be built adjacent to the Veterans Memorial Center on Merritt Island. I am also excited to announce that in attendance will be local and national government officials, decorated military veterans, and even a Medal of Honor recipient! I will always remember, I will never forget, that Brevard County is my home. This is where my heart is, and I feel that I should always be involved with projects that will better my community. That's what this show is all about.

Mike Reilly Interviewed

Thave a lot of memories about spend-Ling evenings with my step-father learning guitar and soaking up songs he had picked up over the years. It was a special time in my musical career as it was the very beginnings and the songs he taught have always held a tender place in my heart. He was a rock n roller of the 60's and 70's and so were the legendary songs he was exposing me to. Jackson Browne, Bob Dylan, the Eagles... a lot of stuff like that. One night he brought out a song I'd never heard before and he explained how he had known it for years but it would be better if I heard the original recording because of the harmonies and guitar work. So, I went and found

it and he was right, I loved it. The song was Amie by the Pure Prairie League. Pure Prairie League, named by Mc-Grail after a 19th century temperance union featured in the 1939 cowboy flick Dodge City starring Errol Flynn, was formed in Columbus, Ohio but takes Waverly, Ohio as its city of origin. The first line-up of the band was Craig Fuller, Tom McGrail, George Ed Powell, Phil Stokes and Robin Suskind with John David Call coming on a little later that same year. That was in 1970 (can you believe that was around 52 years ago?) and since then the band has gone through changes and players more than any other band I've ever heard of. They took a 10 years hiatus in 1988, but by the early 2000's they were back on track and rolling around the globe bringing their particular brand of country rock back to their fans new and old.

Mike Reilly, current singer and bass player, took some time out to talk with Brevard Live about the past, present and future of Pure Prairie League.

What was your first step into rock n roll and how did you gravitate towards bass?

MR: To be honest I wanted to get into music because being in a band seemed to be the coolest thing around. I wasn't sure bass was my calling but I found myself listening to bass lines in my favorite songs. I zero musical training, but at 14 years old I went down to Sears and bought a Danelectro Silvertone Bass. The amp was actually built into the case. I took it home and started teaching myself how to play and never looked back.

That's great! I'd love to find that somewhere now. One of my first guitars was a Silvertone too. When did you start playing with other people?

MR: In 8th grade a couple guys and I started a band called Marc IV. We were a cover band and back then we could get gigs at dances and public get togethers. It was a blast.

What kind of band was it?

MR: Mainly covers off of the radio of whatever records were popular. This

was back in the mid 60's so you can imagine. Basically anything we could handle that would get the girls dancing.

I've heard your brand of music be described in several ways, but I guess it would be best to get the goods from you. How would you describe PPL's sound?

MR: Yeah, I've heard of people calling us rock, country, folk. It doesn't really matter as long as they like the songs though. If I had to I would call it country rock. I always thought the Eagles had the west-coast and we had the mid-west.

Word has it you lived in Woodstock, NY for a while. Can you talk about that a bit?

MR: I remember that as a pretty good period in my life. There were quite a few musicians coming in and out of Woodstock back then and there was music everywhere. I had a band called the Robert Lee Band and Michael Conner and Billy Hinds—keys and drums for PPL—were out there too. We were getting ready to open for Ziggy Stardust when Pure Prairie League asked us if wanted to record an album in London. So we did that instead and actually that's how I ended up joining PPL.

So Amie. Everybody wants to know who Amie was... if she was a real person that is.

MR: Sorry to tell you but no, Amie was not a real person. Just like a lot of songs titled with women's names, Amie was an amalgamation of a lot of different people that inspired the song. Basically the name Amie was taken from the French verb, amier, which mean "to love."

It's pretty well known now that Vince Gill is kind of an on-again-off-again member of the group. Vince has such a great voice and feel for music, it must be something to play with him.

MR: I can't even tell you what a joy it is to play music with that man. He just such a great all around musician and such a good guy to boot it really is a treat. He's actually been playing with us since 1978 if you can believe it. Can't Hold Back was his first album with the band.

I did not know that. That's something I definitely need to check out!

For those that don't know: Vince Gill is a legend in the country and blues grass arena. He's had enormous success with his solo career as well as his foray filling Timothy B. Schmidt's spot in the Eagles and of course with Pure Prairie League.

I was down at the songwriter's festival in Key West one year and word was spreading that you guys were there somewhere, but I never found out where to see you. I've always regretted that.

MR: Well I'm happy to tell you your regrets are over. We didn't play that festival. You're actually not the first person to ask me about that, believe it or not. A couple of our guys were down there just to participate in the festival, but it wasn't the band.

I am so glad I asked you about that! Speaking of "a couple of our guys," can you tell me a little about how many players you have had throughout the years.

MR: Oh man. How much time do you have? I'm not going to rattle off all of the names - that's what Wikipedia is for - but the last guy to enter the band is our current keyboard player and he makes 50 players in 52 years.

So what's next for Pure Prairie League? Any new music in the works... not that we don't like everything else you've already done, but I thought I would ask.

MR: No, it's a good question. We are actually recording new material right now, so you may see a some new released PPL come your way soon.

Excellent! And what can we expect from your upcoming show in Melbourne, Florida with Orleans and Fire Fall?

MR: You can tell everyone that they have my word, it's going to be a great show and we are all going to have a great time!

The life of a rock star is busy so he eventually had to get back to it, but my conversation with Mike Reilly was as pleasant as could be. I'm always amazed when talking to people that have traveled the world, more than I've traveled in my city, just how down to earth and cordial they can be. Mike's a real gentleman and his band Pure Prairie League is doing better than ever.

hatever it is, it's got to be funky!" Lou's Blues will be alive with music, laughter and memories on Sunday, October 3rd starting at 1 pm as Billy Lee's friends, family, and fellow R&B / Funk music lovers gather to celebrate his life. Billy had made it abundantly clear that when "his time came" he wanted a party! Under the guidance of his long time Music Director, Dave Clark, the Billy Lee Soul Revue will be center stage as part of the entertainment. Ana Aguiar of Switch will also be singing and helping organize the activities. The list of musicians who will perform is long, evidence of the love people had for this Billy Lee. There will be more than a few surprise guests along the way many coming from all four corners of the U.S.

It will be a year on October 2nd since Billy Lee headed out to his final gig on the big stage in heaven. He wasn't ready but it was "his time." There were so many sides to him: recording artist, entertainer, composer, songwriter, and producer; but above all, he was the most descent human being.

He was a deep thinker, full of life stories and wisdom that he loved to expound on. A split second later, he'd tell you a tale of life on the road and it would always end with this raucous laugh. Life was never dull or predictable with Billy Lee. His wife Liz remembers: "One Saturday evening we went to the Home Depot for "a quick trip." We were filthy from working in the yard and Billy broke the golden rule by leaving the house in his yard clothes. Billy was looking down the aisles when he stopped and backed up. There stood Danny Terrio of Dance Fever fame from the 80's. Next thing, Danny is showing him some John Travolta moves that Billy managed to do in his steel toed boots while singing a Bee Gees tune. A favorite spot of Billy's was Petty's on Babcock. He loved picking up steaks to grill and they played great music there. It was nothing for him to start singing along while folks were waiting in line. Another highlight was Billy singing "Higher Ground" a cappella with Steven Tyler in a van on the way to a Shuttle launch. Life was one long party."

Billy was always up for lending a hand in the recording studios to lay tracks or offer sage advice. He could not read music but had an amazing ear which often challenged members of the Soul Revue. He was a perfectionist and true to the original sound. He ran band rehearsals like he was preparing for a spot on the American Music Awards. When




Billy pulled the second version of BLSR together, he had all the band members over to his house, prepared a meal and then they viewed a mandatory showing of the movie "Standing in the Shadows of Motown" about James Jamerson. The band still talks about how that laid the foundation of the band's performances.

And the clothes! Billy believed that "image is everything" and every time he stepped on the stage you knew he was meticulous in his appearance. He changed complete outfits for every set; not just the shirt we're talking the entire suit, tie, hat and shoes. It was part of the show, the event, the happenin', the experience.

Long time friend and musician, Chris Elliott from Portsmouth, New Hampshire, shared his thoughts shortly after Billy's passing. "Billy Lee was the finest vocalist I ever worked with, and more than that, he was a philosopher. He was like Yoda, except six feet tall, handsome and with a capacity for singing soul music the New Hampshire seacoast hadn't seen before and since. Billy was such an outsized figure to me, I had to break him into two characters. One was a hand-shakin', back-slappin', wide-smiled R&B impresario, and the other a soul music songwriter and jazz innovator... One thing he said every night at the end of the show was, "Don't drink and drive. We like talkin' TO ya, not ABOUT ya." Well, Billy, I will never stop talking about you."

Billy Lee's celebration of life is also an effort to raise funds for the Billy Lee Music Scholarship for disadvantaged music students in Brevard County high schools. Billy's niece, Samantha Giel, came up with the idea and it couldn't be more appropriate to memorialize Billy. His love of music is only surpassed by his love of teaching especially musicians trying to find their sound. There will be a 50/50 Raffle and a silent auction to help raise funds towards the scholarships which will be presented in May 2022.

He's the creator of some of the finest power-pop of the '80s, a Grammy winning singer, songwriter, and musician who has sold 25 million albums and scored 17 U.S. Top 40 hits, including "Jessie's Girl," "Don't Talk to Strangers," "An Affair of the Heart," "I've Done Everything for You," "Love Somebody," and "Human Touch." He's an accomplished actor who has starred opposite Meryl Streep in the feature film "Ricki and the Flash," gave a chameleonic performance as the creepy Dr. Pitlor in HBO's prestige drama "True Detective," earned great reviews for his portrayal of Lucifer on the CW hit "Supernatural" and most recently played Pastor Charles on "American Horror Story." In 2014, Springfield was honored with a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, located around the corner from the first apartment he lived in when he first arrived in the U.S. from Australia in 1971. 



Or maybe a slowed down, bluesy version of Squeeze's "Tempted" might be more your style. These are going to be some of the highlights of the Vinyl Tap tour. "An entire album of incredible 'covering' of great songs .. instrumentally. And the more times you listen, the better they get," comments jazz radio host Art Good.

They have accomplished this due to a forward looking approach combined with the work ethic of an underdog, always challenging themselves to do something new while never resting on past success. It has proven to be a recipe for longevity for this jazz group while music has gone in and out of styles in ever shorter cycles.

Frequencies

Many of us have heard the term of the standard dization of tuning, where the note A is vibrating at 440 hertz. This has become the standard since it was agreed upon by the "American Federation of Musicians" in 1917 and finally globally accepted in 1953. That's why a piano in Pismo Beach will have the same pitch as one in Mauritius. Before this standardization, the frequency of the note A was variable. The most popular throughout history was 432 hz. Why 440 was picked as a standard still is not really known. Why 432 was so popular, on the other hand, is handily evident, though varied. One theory was 432 was picked to keep middle C at 256 hz. This meant that every octave above and below of the C would resonate at a whole number. In other words, middle C is 256, an octave lower is 128 hz. No need for pesky decimals. Another reason was something quite different. Many think that the frequency of 432 hz has universal healing properties, "a pure tone of math fundamental to nature", vibrating with Phi, the golden ratio, and resonating with the electromagnetic "beat" of the Earth. It also stimulates the heart chakra, increasing spiritual development. 440 hz is considered unnatural and harsh and is said to irritate the soul. Hmmmm.


Throughout history, all cultures were aware of frequencies and their harmonious or non-harmonious nature. Some believe the use of frequencies was used to build the pyramids. We are constantly bombarded with frequencies, whether we can hear them or not. I'm reminded of the story of a whole office building getting sick, only to find that it was caused by the constant frequencies being emitted from the AC unit on the building next door. The unit emitted a frequency of 7 hz, which cannot be heard by the human ear. People affected felt nausea, headaches, fatigue, and even liver damage. To this day the maladies from the frequency of 7 hz are called Sick Building Syndrome.

People can generally hear between 20-20,000 hz (although under ideal conditions, this can range from 12hz-28khz). So if you are buying headphones or ear pods, make sure they go from 20hz-20khz, or you'll be missing some frequencies. There are frequencies that are beneficial to us, like 432 hz. Some are said to have healing proper-

ties, some are related to chakras, some to mental acuity. Here's a list of some of them:

- 110 hz This frequency is sometimes know as "the human pitch". 110 hz, by the way is a low A note in music. It has been found to be the pitch Hindus and Buddhists use in their chanting of mantras. It is said to stimulate right brain activity including creativity, sensuality, feelings, and imagination. One of the most powerful frequencies, some say that parts of Stonehenge vibrate at 110. It is also connected to
- **Solfeggio Frequencies** These are the 9 frequencies to create positive shifts in our nature. This has been known and used for centuries.
- 396 hz Associated with healing feelings of guilt and fear, which blocks the path to realization. Associated with the root chakra.
- 417 hz Said to erase all negativity inside us. It is a powerful frequency that can also reverse or heal negative happenings. Used to balance the sacral chakra.
- 528 hz Known as the love frequency or miracle tone, it reduces stress and increases energy. It is also known to bring transformation and miracles to your life. Balances the solar plexus chakra.
- 639 hz This frequency is used to balance and connect harmonious relationships, be it family, friends, or romantic. Increases tolerance and love. Balances the heart chakra.
- 741 hz Solving problems and gaining intuition is this frequencies job. It also cleans cells from toxins. Used for cleaning the throat chakra.
- **852 hz** Will raise awareness and returns spiritual order. It also awakens inner strength and raises cell energy. Balances the eye chakra.
- 963 hz This frequency is used in activating Pineal Gland and also called Pure Miracle Tones. The Pineal Gland is also known as the Third eye. It is used to return to your natural state, "When crown chakra awakens and opens, we reach to the highest vibrational state and it opens the access to that infinite cosmic energy." It balances the crown chakra.

There are many more relationships between us and frequencies, too many to list here. Hopefully this will get you started in that quest. It is not inconceivable that frequencies could be used for healing, building, exploring and communicating. I think we could learn from our ancient forefathers as they seemed to have much more incite into the use of frequencies. And of course, they can be used for music, as long as it is based on A=432 and your headphones have a frequency range of 20hz-20khz.



When did you decide to write a book? When were the wheels set in motion?

MBDM: Writing a book was a life long vision of mine. I recently had a Facebook post from 12 years ago come up in my memories, where I was inquiring about publishers. I had planned for the book to be finished years ago but in the last year I had met a publisher and we became great friends. I am still shocked that it is happening! Or happened? See,



I still can't believe it (laughs). I do the book coming out now instead of a few years ago has changed the entire thing. I am grateful for the delays. It was meant to be now, not then. I had a lot more healing to do.

You have lived many lives and this book touches upon most of them. How does it feel to have it tangible in your hands for people to read?

MBDM: Unbelievable! I am still in shock and nervous. It is a strange feeling knowing that people will know more about me than I do them. I used to be very private but I felt becoming transparent about chronic illness and mental health may help others. I needed a purpose for my pain. It couldn't have all been for nothing. My purpose is to share it so that others don't feel alone. Growing up with these issues prior to Social Media, I truly felt alone.

There is a lot of good advice in the book without coming off as preachy. How was the editing process?

MBDM: The editing process was great although I was nervous about that. I was like, 'what if it's terrible?' But a lot of the editing was mainly minor typos and formatting. There were a few suggestions but mostly having someone make sure everything was good to go.

I love the team at ImagineWe LLC. I actually flew out to Buffalo, NY and met my publisher Jessica and it was like we were long lost friends. I ate wings every night, I loved it there! I saw Niagara Falls.

'Garden of Blu' chronicles McDermott's journey from Missouri to Florida. Her relationship with her father, first husband, kids and second husband Blake McDermott are all documented. The book dives into her medical issues (heart conditions, chronic pain) as well as her entrepreneur endeavors in business and journalism.

Any fond memories of writing for Brevard Live?

MBDM: I loved writing for Brevard Live! I really enjoyed it. My favorite memories are when people would come up to me and mention an article that I wrote. It is so cool connecting with people and realize that other people can relate.

What was the timing of the deadline for the book and Red's passing? (McDermott was very close with local body piercer Alicia 'Red' Capetelli, who was murdered earlier this year in Merritt Island)

MBDM: My deadline was the same but I still had to make some finishing touches. I ended up not touching the book and delaying it a month when she passed. Fortunately, the timing still worked out to stay on track. I ended up adding a chapter, because I was not just grieving the loss of my father but now one of my best friends. She was such an amazing and strong woman. I hope to continue to honor her for as long as I can. I felt that it was necessary to bring it up since so many others have also experienced major loss recently.

Is there anything on your bucketlist? You seemed to have done everything?

MBDM: I live my life with a bucketlist. I recently hiked in Arizona. Travel is always like therapy to me. Writing a book was on my bucketlist. Life is so short so always do the things you want to, even if they seem too big. I definitely want to travel more. I have a National Parks pass so I would love to see more.

How is your health currently?

MBDM: Ugh, it isn't the best. My surgeon said that I am ready for open heart surgery now but it can wait another 6 months. I choose to wait another 6 months, so that will be in January. I wanted the time to mentally prepare and to travel more, since I will be down for a few months after. I feel exhausted every day, due to my Ehlers Danlos Syndrome. I am also in pain daily. I hope the energy levels improve after I get my new heart valve. Last time it did!

Will there be a sequel?

MBDM: Not necessarily a sequel, but there will definitely be more books. I have a children's book in the works as well. My next book is going to be about issues in Healthcare, and how we can make it better. I will be using my Biomedical Science degree to help inspire it.

Any parting words of wisdom?

MBDM: Just remember that even during dark times, there is always a silver lining. Hold on. Use your pain to grow and evolve as a person. I used to always feel that it was me against the world, but we are never alone. Reach out if you need help. Everyone matters.

FISHING REPORT AUGUST FORECAST

et's get the party started in Brevard! This is the Lmonth that all dynamics change. The northern migrations commence. I'm talking fish. Large acrobatic tarpon and tough bottom hugging permit. We are talking 100 pound scales a flying as we call the "Poons". In the Keys, back in the day, we would keep the 5 inch scales for adornments and ash trays.

Permit are in the pompano family. Incidentally the pompano genre is quite interesting. It includes jack crevalles and lookdown. Google these fish ID's for some cool and strange fish designs. Pomps range from 1.5 to 5 pounds. They are the "most sought after" surf species on both, the east and west coasts of Florida. Super tasty and just a total blast to catch them. Permit are the champions of the genre. Quite tasty up thru 10 pounds then they get a bit tough. The September permit will range 5 to 25 pounds. They require a fresh crab bait and a custom rig. But quite a few are caught on standard pompano rigs with a sand flea for bait.

So where do I go to catch all these fish? Simple: Sebastian Inlet State Park. Naturally there are other beaches, but for a shot at all plus some bullish redfish, drum and sheepshead, the Park is the PLACE!

The Inlet Park has a wonderful tackle shop that has a great history. Big Tom Turowski owned it for 30 years. The 700 foot fishing jetty is like 75 feet behind the shop. When Tom was 16 he caught a 20 pound Kingfish off that jetty. Big Tom surfed his youth on the beach just north of the jetty. A beach that is famous for its swells and surf fishing tournaments. Tom nailed some of the largest sharks fishing that jetty fishing at night. The park is open 24 hours a day.

I love this place cause you can bring an RV and camp. Or just a tent for an overnight. Plus there is a marina on the bayside. Catch a charter boat and get offshore for some great fishing. The beautiful and spectacular dolphin will be chasing flying fish around the Sargasso weed beds.. Your Captain will spot the action spotter birds: The Frigates. These grey sea birds have a sixth sense in locating dolphin. They know there are freebie meals once the mahi start a melee on a pack of sardines. Range 5 to 30 pounds, this is an adventure that is truly vacation worthy!




