





PAT BENATAR NEIL GIRALDO

our time Grammy winner, mezzo-soprano Pat Benatar has always done things, unapologetically, on her own terms. Benatar was the undisputed queen of rock in the 80's. By the time the decade was over she was sporting two multi-platinums, five platinums, three golds, and nineteen top 40 singles including top 10 hits "Hit Me With Your Best Shot," "Love Is a Battlefield," "We Belong" and "Invincible." You could scarcely turn on MTV back then without seeing one her heavily played videos. Flash forward to 2019 and Benatar is still killing it on stages around the world. On May 5th she will be killing it on OUR stage at the King Center in Melbourne, Florida with her ever present husband and lead guitarist Neil Giraldo.

Born Patricia Andrzejewski in Brooklyn, New York and raised in Lindenhurst, Long Island, Benatar started singing early on in elementary school and locked in for life. All through her formative years she was obsessed with honing her craft and developing her vocal skills. In '73, Benatar was working as a bank teller when she saw an inspiring concert and decided to quit and pursue her music full time. Very quickly she signed on with a local band called Coxon's Army. By '75, Coxon's Army had reached the height of popularity in Richmond, Virginia and were about to break into the national scene



when Benatar left the band and moved to New York, New York on her own.

One Night, after moving to the big apple, Pat decided to sign up for open mic night at the famous Catch a Rising Star. She was 27th in line to go on and didn't end up on stage until 2am. When she finally got to perform she sang Judy Garland's version of "Rock A Bye Your Baby with a Dixie Melody" and the crowd went wild. Rick Newman, the owner of the club, went out to see what was going on and stayed to watch the rest of her performance. He was floored, and afterwards introduced himself. That same man would go on

to become Benatar's manager for the next 15 years.

In '78 Benatar was headlining at Tramps nightclub where she impressed Terry Ellis, co-founder of *Chrysalis Records*, one night and subsequently signed with the label. While working on her album in the studio producer and writer Mike Chapman introduced Benatar to a young up and coming guitarist who had just secured his spot in her band after beating out 200 other hopefuls in auditions. The young string-slinger was none other than Benatar's future husband Neil Giraldo.

Neil and Pat had an instant connection and before long he was doing more than just leading the band. He began writing and producing for Benatar and within the year they were inseparable. Benatar's album *In the Heat of the Night*, and consequently the world's first chance at Giraldo and Benatar's collaborative work, was released to great approval. The album, which included the classic "Heartbreaker," as well as the Giraldo-penned hit, "We Live For Love" went platinum.

By the time Benatar released *Crimes of Passion* in 1980, it was becoming clear to everyone that, even though the albums and concerts were executed under the name Pat Benatar, Pat and Neil has become a duo in every way. *Crimes of Passion* won Pat her first Grammy while the process saw Giraldo arranged, played keys and guitar, and added vocals to nearly every track. And in 1981, with the release of *Precious Time*, Giraldo had an official position as producer and arranger...as well as guitar, keyboards, and vocals.

In the 1980's there were ten years of nominations for Best Female Rock Performance. Benatar was nominated for 9 of them, and won 4 of them consecutively...she's basically the Meryl Streep of rock. For over two decades Benatar, with Neil in the captain's seat, couldn't seem to release an album without receiving Grammys or at least nominations.

Finally, after all these years, the perfect pair is touring together and Neil's name is right up there on the billboard next to Benatar's. This is going to be such a good show. Two artists completely entwined in their love and work. Most couples wouldn't survive, but the first couple of rock n' roll has defied the odds and lived a working marriage with grace. May 5th, the King Center in Melbourne, Florida... don't miss it!



Platinum-Selling Musician Award-Winning Producer/Mixer And Songwriter

Stuart Richardson

Stuart Richardson is a rock star. Go ahead, Google him (I did). He is also one of the most modest and nicest guys around. Although he has only been in Brevard County for a few years, he plans on putting down his roots and enriching the music scene here one band at a time.

45 year old Richardson is from England originally. He began working as a recording engineer in his native Wales in the mid-'90s, cutting his teeth with bands and musicians who would go on to become breakout artists, such as Funeral for a Friend, Bullet for my Valentine, The Blackout, and Kids in Glass Houses. In 1998, Stu joined the LostProphets as bass player and primary songwriter for the band, who in 2000 signed a record deal with Columbia Records/Visible Noise. The band found success as well in the United States with hits like "Rooftops" and "Last Train Home". Stuart and the LostProphets spent 2000-2012 on constant album and tour cycles earning No. 1 albums and sales of more than 3.5 million units, multiple industry awards, millions of YouTube views and music streams, sold-out shows in clubs, arenas and headlining music festival shows on stages across the globe.

Then the bottom dropped out. Almost overnight, an arrest report for lead singer Ian Watkins surfaced (Google at your own risk). He would plead guilty to child sex offences and be sentenced to 29 years in jail. The band immediately dissolved stating they had no previous knowledge of Watkin's actions. The remaining members found themselves guilty by association, and it took some time before

Richardson and his family regrouped. "I moved here after the worst band breakup in history," he recalls. "I basically had my head on my pillow for six months until I decided what I wanted to do next." He and his family left Los Angeles in 2013 and moved to Florida - and his future in music seemed dire.

During the last years of the band, Stuart had begun mixing and recording more in the studio. First in a home setup and then eventually branching out to his own studio. High profile clients began calling. His family - wife Marisa and their daughters Cada and Sally adjusted to life in Melbourne Beach, where Marisa grew up. "We would visit Florida and each time we went I'd say 'this wouldn't be so bad to move to'", he remembers. The Richardsons were now Brevard County residents and making new friends. He also started picking bass gigs with bands.

"Stu was playing bass for SWIMM, and my former band The Knick Knacks did a show with them," current Zeddemore guitarist John Robert Bridges recalls. "He reached out to me not long after to see if I wanted to come and check out his new studio. I ended up recording an original song on both drums and guitar, and he laid down the bass part.

It was through Bridges' introduction that I got to know Stuart. I was

aware of LostProphets and their untimely demise. He then sent me songs from a new project he had been working on. No Devotion is a five piece band not really anchored anywhere. Singer/producer Geoff Rickly is best known for being the driving force behind the band Thursday. Together with the remaining members of LostProphets (guitarists Lee Gaze and Mike Lewis and drummer Luke Johnson), they recorded their debut album Permanence. Each member lives in different cities, either in the US or in England. With only a handful of live shows under their belt, they were nominated and ultimately won British Kerrang! magazine's "Album of the Year" in 2016, beating out such veterans acts as Asking Alexandria and Iron Maiden. "It felt like validation after all the previous success fell apart," he said. Richardson and the band flew to London to accept the award. Currently the band has been writing new songs with the intentions of recording a new CD, but no touring plans are in the works.

Back home in Brevard, he was getting more domesticated, away from the spotlight. He had met his wife Marisa in 2003 at a club in Los Angeles. She was working as a music writer at *People Magazine*. Love happened and eventually they would move to Melbourne Beach. Richardson set up *Mosswood*

Studio in a Melbourne Industrial park. Unbeknownst at the time, Fata Recordings was just a few miles away. Anthony Fata was splitting his time recording bands, doing live sound and playing drums as he still does today in local band Dull Blades.

Another local band Evil Virgins, had just released a new album, recorded and produced by Fata. Impressed with the finished result, Richardson tracked him down online and invited him to talk shop. The two had similar interests and techniques and good chemistry together (evident with all the tech talk between the two as we conduct our interview). Soon the two were ready to join forces and launch a new studio - Rocky Waters.

The new venture combines Richardson's many years in the business along with Fata's time in the music scene. "We're more than just a place to record and collect our money," he explains. "We want to help the bands we record with a business game plan," A grand opening party took place in July 2017 including an intimate acoustic performance from Richardson's No Devotion band mate Rickly.

Richardson is quick to share his vast industry knowledge, all you have to do is ask. "Don't focus on making an album necessarily," he offers. "Make one killer song. It may cost you more than you intended but it will last forever." Many local performances have been tracked and produced at Rocky Waters since their opening. Much of the songs on *Harbor City Vol 1* music compilation including Men Against Fire, October's Flame and Tank Top were done there.

"We started by recording our debut single with him, *Don't Fear My Love*," says Zeddemore's Bridges. "The entire experience was a dream come true, the song came out great, and is still one of the best recordings I've ever been involved with. He's also the fastest producer I've ever worked with. The man consistently does 15 and 16 hour days

and moves a million miles an hour the entire time. He's a beast. Not a second gets wasted." Zeddemore would eventually record four songs at Rocky Waters with Richardson. The end-result not only sounds great but has taken the band to the next level. "We won 95.9 FM The Rocket's statewide *Next2Rock* competition, we've gotten to play in Orlando a couple of times," Bridges continues. "I got to have songs I wrote pressed onto vinyl for the first time, and I have musicians that I look up to coming up to me saying how great our album sounds. I'm extremely humbled by the response we've had to this record and a lot of that has to do with Stu."


Richardson has kept his bass playing chops up as well. In addition to guest spots with SWIMM, he has joined a reunited Thursday on the road periodically including an Australian tour with Quicksand last year. Most recently he has finished a US tour where the band played two nights in each city, including Orlando at The Abbey. While he enjoys playing he says that he misses being with family for weeks at a time.

Throughout his career, Stu has worked with a variety of producers and mixers both as an artist and as a colleague including Dave Fridmann, Eric Valentine, Bob Rock, Alan Moulder, Ken Andrews, John Feldmann, Randy Staub, Heba Kadry and Jesse Cannon. He's produced and mixed for labels such as Sony Europe, Sony Japan, Columbia, Epic, Fearless, Visible Noise, Dine Alone, Animal Style, Collect. His work and compositions can also be found on many video game and film soundtracks.

So what does the future hold? I ask Richardson where he sees the studio in five years time? He responds quickly: "It's not as much about what it sounds like or my skills, it's about mentoring people and helping them move up the ladder." Working with bands, both local and beyond. Helping them find their purpose, creatively and business wise. They agree that a new venue for bands to rehearse and play shows would be ideal. Bridges seems to sum up what his moving here means in saying: "That guy is the best thing to happen to this town in a long time."

Melbourne Art Festival

For the 35th time the Melbourne Art Festival puts on a top ranked fine art show during Saturday and Sunday, April 27th and 28th, from 9 am to 5 pm. Usually, around 250 artists have their work on display; there will be a Kids World, student competition, art work shops, a 5K run, a vendor village, continuous live music, and a concert in the park on Saturday until 7pm featuring The Wicked Garden Gnomes. For the third year the festival is held at the scenaric Wickham Park. There is free admission, free parking, and easy access for everyone.

The Melbourne Art Festival is a juried Fine Arts Show, drawing artists from throughout Florida and the United States. Originally held in the Downtown Melbourne for its first 32 years, the Festival moved to Wickham Park in 2017 due to downtown congestion, and space limitations for artists, sponsors, and food vendors.

What makes the Melbourne Art Festival so popular is its "down-to-earth approach," and it is MAF president Elise Vaughn's agenda to keep the event a volunteer effort with free admission to the public and reasonable prices, even for beer, wine and liquor. This was definitely one of the culprits why the MAF committee decided to move the festival from downtown Melbourne to Wickham Park three years ago. Parking had become a severe problem with more and more visitors every year, city lots were charging hefty fees, and the free park and ride service that the MAF still offered to its visitors was a big expense in a time when sponsors tightened their budgets.

The magical word has been "community involvement" and that's why the MAF happens every year despite of all struggles any festivals of this size experience. At the end it all comes together with a great art show and a lot of entertainment. Back To The 80's Future


The '80s was a decade of people, decisions and inven-L tions that changed our future with iconic moments. It was 10 years of nonstop glamour, unchecked excess, ruthless ambition and explosive technological innovation that combined to produce the historic changes and global events that made us who and what we are today. The fingerprints of the decade best known for Pac-Man and the personal computer are everywhere in our daily lives: The first launch of NASA's Space Shuttle triggered a technological explosion in global communications that now makes our worldwide love affair with smart phones and the Internet possible. Many who lived through those glorious 10 years get a nostalgic expression on their face when remembering those "good old days" - and Walter Gregg Young is one of them. And contrary to those who just wail in those memories, Gregg, that's what his friends call him, kept these moments alive. You might say that he took the past with him into the future; never let go; the man who took the 80s into the 21st century.

So how does it feel being a true 80s man? A look at his smiling face leaves no doubt - Gregg is a happy person, still fascinated by electronics that he encountered first as a teenager; and he soon discovered that he had a knack for it. "I loved to take things apart and put it back together," he remembers. "Once I was consigned to my room and I discovered I could listen to TV via the Walky Talky. I was fascinated by the new technology."

His family owned an arcade on Apollo Blvd in Eau Gallie in the late 70s when Gregg was 18 years old. Before that Gregg worked at Winn-Dixie on the corner of Aurora and Wickham Road. "I used to go across the street in my lunch break to Snider's Ice Cream Parlor that had two pinball machines," says Gregg. Then one day he noticed that the ball kept sticking and offered to fix it. The owner gave it a shot, Gregg fixed the machine and got a free lunch that day.

In 1980 Gregg started collecting arcade video games, he bought the broken ones, fixed them and kept them first in his garage, later in a warehouse. And while the golden years of the video arcade games started to dwindle down in the mid-80s, Gregg was holding on to his toys. One day - he knew it - people would re-discover this kind of fun.


Young Gregg became a TV repairman, still doing what he loved the most which was electronics, but his fascination for pinball machines never ceased. Now, almost 4 decades later, he's ready to share them with other folks. His new arcade, the Pinball Palace, is tucked away in a commercial complex right off Badcock Street close to Palm Bay Road, in the Auto Service Plaza. Pinball Palace offers refreshments





while you play Gameboys, Starwars, Nintendo, Super Nintendo, Atari 2600, Turbo Machine Racetracks, watch MTV videos and look at other memorabilia like Alf, the Smurfs, a talking teddy bear, Arnold Schwarzenegger etc.

"It might not be everyone's favorite pastime, but there are quite a few folks who love the classic video games," says Gregg. "I can see grandfathers and grandchildren come in to show the youngsters where electronic games had their start. There is no admission fee, check it out and play what you like. Pinball Palace is open from 7 to 11pm Mondays thru Fridays, and from 11am to 11pm on Saturdays and Sundays. Visit them on Facebook at Pinball Palace of Palm Bay.





Don't be a Dick, Be a Cartoon


Being in the music business can be difficult at times. Practicing, putting arrangements together, practicing harmonies, or rehearsing the rhythm section takes a great deal of time and patience. Then there's the promotion, booking gigs, and trying to make a decent living which also requires a great deal of perseverance and patience. However, nothing tests my patience more than unruly audience members. We've all dealt with inebriated "fans" falling into P.A. speakers, knocking over mic stands, etc. Sometimes when I was playing with the Puzzlers we would put up a "police tape". You know, that yellow ribbon that they put around crime scenes emboldened with the words "DANGER! DO NOT CROSS THE POLICE LINE". That seemed to alleviate the situation a little bit. Perhaps the most annoying situations is when people find that the best time to discuss things with you is in the middle of a tune. Really?!? What compels someone to come up to you and start trying to have a conversation with you WHILE you're playing a tune? How do you deal with that?

I spent a great many years learning the finer points of playing ragtime guitar. It's a very demanding style because not only do you have to be playing 2 or 3 completely separate lines at the same time, but you also have to syncopate them! Personally, this is the one reason I find ragtime guitar to be more difficult than classical. I used to do shows playing all delta blues and ragtime guitar at a places that served alcohol. Once I was playing one of my original ragtime pieces which, to this day, is the most difficult piece I play. Invariably some inebriated person comes up and decides this is a perfect time to strike up a conversation. He starts babbling something about my guitar and asks about what strings I use, bla, bla. I try to explain, without missing a beat, that I'm kinda busy right now. I have three lines going on at the same time. He doesn't understand that. He keeps talking. I explain to him that what I'm playing is extremely difficult and that the only thing more difficult is playing this and talking at the same time. He found that very amusing. So, I finish the tune at which time he's yelling at the same volume as when the music was playing "Do you play any Jimmy Buffet?" (The bane of being an acoustic guitar player). I told him "Look, I know Jimmy personally (not true) and we have a deal. He doesn't play any of my stuff and I won't play any of his stuff". He stumbled away. The audience thought it was funny. Win, win situation.

Then there was the time I was playing a gig with the band. The place we were playing didn't have a stage, so we were set up on the floor. We had a sub, mid and horn on each side. I was set up on stage right next to the speaker stack. On this particular song I was playing trumpet. We started a calypso tune and the dance floor filled up quickly. During a break in the horn section, this guy comes wobbling up to the stage area. He's standing right in front of the speakers; I have a ride cymbal next to my right ear and a monitor blaring in front of me. I had no idea what this guy was saying. I motioned to him that I couldn't hear him at all and he should go away. Apparently when you're really wasted, go away means come closer and yell in my ear as loud as you can, because that's what he did. Now I could have just pushed him away, but then he would have fallen backwards into a packed dance floor. So I put down my trumpet and grabbed my microphone. "STOP!" I yelled. "Stop the music!" The band stopped playing and the whole dance floor turned to stare at the band. "This guy apparently has something really important to say!" and I handed him the mic. He looked shocked and embarrassed. He turned and stumbled his way into the crowd. A catastrophe averted.

On yet another occasion my brother and I were playing a jazz gig together, twin guitars. Invariably any time we played together somebody would come up and ask us to play Buffet or Neil Young. Now my brother had no patience for these things and his standard response was to point at the door and tell the requester to just get the f&*k out now! I always explained to him that we were getting paid really well and shouldn't say those types of things on the microphone. So we had plan B and plan C. Sooo... we're playing this rather upscale party a another drunk idiot comes up and says "Play some Neil Young!". Before my brother could go into his standard response, I explained to the guy; "I can understand that, after listening to us for an hour or so playing jazz, you would think we know some Neil Young, unfortunately we do not." We started playing another song and this guy wouldn't give up. "Play some Neil Young!" seemed to be his mantra for the night. Ok, we'll play you some Neil Young. Now we had been doing this routine for decades, and this seemed to be a perfect time for it. We started playing "Needle of the Damage Done," a classic. I would start singing in the whiniest, nasally voice I could muster; "I've seen the needle of the damage done, a little bit of it in everyone...", at which point my brother would bellow; "Yo Neil! Quit whining, will you! Yo made 50 million last year!" The crowd was cracking up; the drunk guy was visibly pissed! He stammered off.

We've all had situations similar to the ones above. Sometimes it doesn't even seem real; it's very cartoonish, a caricature of a situation. When dealing with them, we always tried to get a good laugh out of the situation. So my advice is, don't be a dick, be a cartoon.










CD REVIEW

Hailing from the mid Atlantic, John, now based locally, performs and fronts John MacDonald and The Mango Men. He can be seen solo, duo, trio and quartet. He performs up and down the Gulf and Atlantic coasts. They recently performed at The Space Coast Seafood and Music Fest. The music is a blend of reggae, calypso, rock, latin, jazz, and world beat.

You know I always begin with something that gives me pause or will ponder on. There may be lot of keyboard generated instrumentation going on here. I'm sort of old school. It might be that I'm just not tech savvy enough to be able to do it myself. But anyway, it certainly doesn't take anything away from this flawless effort.

I mention flawless because there is not one bad note, musically or vocally on this CD. The first tune on this 11 song gem starts out strong. Appro-

priately titled "Come Alive". I love albums that grab you right from the get go! "I Keep My Feet Moving" has a David Bowie Young American feel to it with a twist! The guitar playing on this tune as well as all other songs is never forced. Relaxed and smooth. Listen to the intro solo at the 00:17 mark. Stay In Your Lane, Part 2

Last month I wrote about how important it was for people to be mindful of their feedback, opinions, and advice when it comes to recovery from drug and alcohol addiction. I focused on the professionals in the field of addiction treatment and those already in recovery. Full disclosure, I fit both categories. However, being in remission since 1988 and practicing in the field since 1991, still doesn't automatically protect me from crossing lanes either. We can all be guilty of this, which is what makes it even more important to talk about.

This month I will speak a little more about the importance of staying in your lane, as it relates to Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT). This has been a very hot topic of discussion 'in the rooms' and anywhere the opioid crisis is talked about. But what is it?

Basically MAT is exactly what it says; treatment being assisted by use of a medication. Not such an unusual concept, is it? Aren't most, if not all, diseases or medical problems treated with medication? The why is this a topic?

Medication Assisted Treatment is a topic in the addiction treatment world because of a lot of misunderstanding, fear, stigma, and distrust. Misunderstanding of the brain, how it functions, how it's effected, and how it heals. Fear of going from one addiction to another. The stigma of addicts appearing to be zoned out zombies just looking for a replacement, and the distrust of 'big pharma'.

What medications are considered Medication Assisted Treatment for Opioid Use Disorder? There are three types of medication used as MAT therapies. The first and oldest of them all is Methadone. Methadone is an opioid, a full agonist, and first approved in the US in the 1940's. It attaches to the opioid receptors in the brain and therefore can be used instead of illicit street opioids like heroin. This allows those using this medication to manage their opioid use while being compliant to a program.

The second is Buprenorphine which was approved for clinical use in the early 2000's. Products containing Buprenorphine and sometimes with Naloxone are sold under the names like Suboxone, Subutex, Bunavail, Zubsolv, and Sublocade. These are partial agonist that are used as an al-

ternative to methadone. They too are used for pain as well as a MAT for Opioid Use Disorder. This is also an opioid and used for short term and long term opioid replacement.

The third and most recent is Naltrexone. Although available in oral form since the 80's, the injectable form most effective for the treatment of Opioid Use Disorder is Vivitrol. Vivitrol became clinically available in 2010. Unlike the others Vivitrol is an antagonist and cannot be used to treat pain. This is a recovery medication. It attaches to the opioid receptors and blocks them. It is not an opioid, not addictive, doesn't have the potential for abuse, and NOT a replacement. Vivitrol is not used in detox settings and can only be used once you are already free from all opioids in your system. It's the only one of the three indicated by the FDA for the prevention of relapse to opioid dependence because it isn't a maintenance program. This medication carries an indication for Alcohol Use Disorder also.

Which one is best for you?

Transition from street heroin to methadone or buprenorphine is easier. You might have even tried these on the street. You only have to be in withdrawal to start. However, the detoxification from these are longer and many report it as more difficult to discontinue. Since the fear of withdrawal and returning to street drug use is so great, many individuals stay on these medications for long periods of time. Unfortunately tolerance still exists and the patient may actually need higher doses as time goes on. These are some the reasons people may view this as continued use.

Even though this may not be the preferred method for many people, they are still treatment options and we should be very careful to not accuse someone as not being in recovery. For those suffering from lifelong pain due to injury these are viable options. Their goal may not be to be opioid free, but instead be employable, back in the real world, and productive again. If methadone and buprenorpine offers them that opportunity then we have to respect that.

If you are considering these options be aware that methadone & suboxone clinics don't appear eager to wean anyone off of the medications. Detox units may use them to transition you from heroin or other opioids. However the longer you stay on them without weaning off, you risk having a much more difficult time weaning off completely. Maintenance programs and are not focused on weaning you off. This is another reason people have such a problem with it. Other negatives are that they are narcotics.

People tend to give less grief to those on Vivitrol because they know it's not a narcotic and doesn't have a street value because there is no 'high' attached to it at all. In fact, many times people judge those not choosing Vivitrol over the others as a person still wanting to use because of this fact.

Tatoos, Marine Life & CrimeSeen

It is a Sunday early afternoon in the Eau Gallie Arts District. It is busier than normal as a crowd gathers nearby to honor and raise money for a local family. Inside Blue Moon Tattoo, artist Tim C. Shubert is busy sketching away.

Much of his work, as abstract as it may be, centers around his environment. "I was born in Melbourne as was my mom", he said. "My grandparents and my great grandparents lived here as well." Bright colors highlight marine life and animals in general. I tell him how much I enjoyed his wood cutout wolf design he did a while back.

"I received the handwriting award in third grade and it went to my head. Subsequently, a little encouragement gave me the drive to create," he remarks when asked how he got into art. "I didn't really paint until I was 17 and my style of choice was influenced by Dali, Escher and Picasso."

As he puts it, he "started tinkering with tattooing in 1992 but I didn't work in a shop til 1998." Currently the owner of Blue Moon Tattoo, Shubert also brings other artists together to collaborate on art shows in EGAD. Last month saw the show entitled "CrimeSeen" which included artists Lisa Murphy and Ruth Anne Heinly among many others. "Crimeseen was an unique local art experience and social experiment/commentary. Many artists submitted their versions of crime scene photos shot a century ago in NYC," he explains. "Twenty nine artists with varied backgrounds, different styles and empathy tackled reinventing a vintage crime scene photo. These almost lost photos were salvaged before they were sent to the dump and compiled into a book by Luc Sante simply called *Evidence*."


Shubert's artistic mind is unlimited. He regularly posts his designs online for all to see and marvel. Vibrant bright colors seem to be his trademark. From realistic dog portraits to abstract marine life creatures, there's something to appeal to everyone.

Other local artists also appreciate Shubert's talent and passion. "He has a unique way in that he is highly knowledgeable of a multitude of techniques and philosophies which you can see seep into his artwork," explains local artist Kyle Heinly. "His charitable nature stems from that knowledge of spiritual philosophy He is his art and his art is him. There is no separation. It's sort of a zen state of being an artist. To talk to him about art, life or anything is almost akin to speaking to a guru. One who ponders on life, finds his answers and then shares it with everyone through his tattoos, art and poetry."

Shubert cites local artists as well as inspirations. "I like a tattoo artist and painter named Rob Figueroa. His attention to realism and detail helps him to serve up visual goodness." Shubert can remember a time not long ago where the local artist scene was not as vibrant as it is today. "Ten years

ago any semblance of an art scene existed as manicured Florida scenery and trendy flamingo renditions," he said. "I achieve great satisfaction with the lifestyle of an artist. As I dispense tattoos, painting ideas occur and my down time is spent making art in my heavily vegetated back alley art studio that's enclosed by canopies in the Eau Gallie Art District." As thriving as the scene is now, he does offer this advice; "have a sense of confidence and humility with a descent work ethic. Accept that your first fifty paintings are crap and create, create and create".
