





MELANIE

Reeping up with their steady flow of legendary acts on their stage, this month Space Coast Harley will welcome the one and only Melanie Safka, known simply as Melanie, in performance. Mostly know for her hits "Brand New Key", "Ruby Tuesday", "What Have They Done to My Song Ma", and her song about performing at the first Woodstock Festival "Lay Down (Candles in the Rain)", Melanie has continued to spread her special brand of music around the globe for the last handful of decades. Most recently she has even teamed up Miley Cyrus for a collaboration.

Originally from Queens, Melanie grew up with a jazz singing mother and picked up on the family music bug early on. Starting out in highschool, in the 60's, Melanie became a staple at a coffee house called The Inkwell in New Jersey before graduating and attending college at The Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York. In college she could often be found on stage in the clubs of developing folk hot-bed of Greenwich Village. Before long she was signed to Columbia Records where she released two singles, and then Buddah Records where she found her first hit on the European charts with her song "Bobo's Party" which went to number one in

For the next few years Melanie continued to enjoy success around Europe, including a hit in the Netherlands with "Beautiful People" in 1969, leading to an invitation to perform at the first Woodstock Festival later that year. Only three solo women played the festival and Melanie was one of them. During her set, the crowd was moved to



light up the sky with matches, lighters, and candles even though it was raining. Melanie took this as inspiration to write her first American hit "Lay Down (Candles in the Rain)."

In 1970 Melanie was invited to play the Power Ridge Festival which was subsequently shut down by a court injunction. With a disappointed crowd already on site Melanie decided to ignore the injunction and played for the audience on a homemade stage powered by Mister Softee trucks. She was the only artist to play. With her fame on the rise she was immediately given slots at the Strawberry Fields Festival and the Isle of Wight Festival where she was introduced by Keith Moon and received four standing ovations. The Isle of Wight Fest was repeated again in 2010 and Melanie was on the bill.


Melanie caused some controversy when she first released her song "Brand New Key" which talks about a roller skate and a key. Some audiences took this as sexual innuendo and quite a few radio stations banned its play. During an interview in 2013 Melanie finally talked about the real meaning behind the song relaying that it actually was a song about a roller skate she wrote after a 20 day water fast. At the end of her fast she pulled into a McDonald's and ordered a meal. The aroma of the fast food brought back memories for her of roller skating. "Brand New Key"


became one of three Top 40 hits that year making her the first female artist to have three at once. In 1972 she was awarded Billboard's No. 1 *Top Female Vocalist* award.


Over the years the hits and awards kept a steady pace including an *Emmy* in 1989 for writing the lyrics to the "The First Time I Loved Forever," the theme song for the television series *Beauty and the Beast*. In 2012 Melanie took a different turn and collaborated with John Haldoupis on a theatrical musical about her love story with her husband. She both narrated and performed in the show and took it on tour throughout Australia.


Never slowing down, this year Melanie joined Miley Cyrus for her backyard series *Happy Hippie*, a charity project aiming to help fight homeless LGBT youth. If you go to her site *www.Melaniesafka.com* you can donate and help establish individual support groups.

On Saturday, February 16th Melanie will be right here in our backyard for CRockfest at the Space Coast Harley Davidson dealership in Palm Bay which is the kickstart of The Woodstock Experience. Alan Parsons Live

In October 1967, at the age of 18, Parsons went to work as an assistant engineer at *Abbey Road Studios*, where he earned his first credit on the LP *Abbey Road*. He became a regular there, engineering such projects as Wings' *Wild Life* and *Red Rose Speedway*, five albums by the Hollies, and Pink Floyd's *The Dark Side of the Moon*, for which he received his first *Grammy Award* nomination.

In 1975, he declined Pink Floyd's invitation to work on the follow-up for Dark Side, Wish You Were Here, and instead initiated the Alan Parsons Project with producer, songwriter, and occasional singer Eric Woolfson, whom he had met at Abbey Road. The Project consisted of a revolving group of studio musicians and vocalists. Unlike most rock groups, the Alan Parsons Project never performed live during its heydays. Its only live performance during its original incarnation was in 1990. It released ten albums, the last in 1987. The Project terminated in 1990 after Parsons and Woolfson split. Parsons continued to release work in his own name and in collaboration with other musicians. Since 1999 he has toured under a revised name, the Alan Parsons Live Project. In August 2018, Parsons announced that he will be releasing a studio album in 2019. The album titled "The Secret" will be his first in 15 years.

Justin Hayward

With 50 years at the peak of the entertainment industry under his belt, Justin Hayward's voice has been heard the world over. Known as the vocalist, lead guitarist and composer for the Moody Blues, his enduring talent has helped to define the rock'n'roll of his time. The band has sold 55 million albums and received numerous awards. Justin is honored with the Moody Blues on the *Rock Walk Hall of Fame* on Sunset Boulevard, and this year the band will be inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame.

He joined the Moody Blues in the summer of 1966. Hitting his stride immediately with the single "Fly Me High," he followed it up with the classic hit songs, "Nights in White Satin," and "Tuesday Afternoon," from the seminal album, *Days of Future Past*.

Justin created other classic hits such as, "Question," "The Voice," "I Know You're Out There Somewhere," "The Story In Your Eyes," and "Your Wildest Dreams." These laid the foundation for the success story of the Moody Blues, as well as his solo work. While releasing solo albums, DVDs and working on many different projects, Justin continues to tour all across the world with the Moody Blues.

Special guest at this show is Mike Dawes who is hailed as one of the world's finest and most creative modern fingerstyle guitar performers.

David Forster

David Foster is a Canadian musician, record producer, composer, songwriter, and arranger. He has been a producer for musicians including Chaka Khan, Alice Cooper, Christina Aguilera, Andrea Bocelli, Toni Braxton, Michael Bublé, Chicago, Natalie Cole, Celine Dion, Kenny G, Josh Groban, Brandy Norwood, Whitney Houston, Jennifer Lopez, Kenny Rogers, Seal, Rod Stewart, Jake Zyrus, Donna Summer, Olivia Newton-John, Madonna, Mary J. Blige, Michael Jackson, Peter Cetera, Cheryl Lynn and Barbra Streisand.

Foster has won 16 *Grammy Awards* from 47 nominations including three for Producer of the Year, an Emmy Award, a Golden Globe, and racked up three Oscar nominations for "Best Original Song.". He was also the chairman of *Verve Records* from 2012 to 2016.

Currently Foster is taking on Broadway with several projects. These include writing the music for a new musical about the iconic, animated character Betty Boop. He is writing the music for a musical based on the Amy Bloom novel and New York Times bestseller *Lucky Us*. Foster is also developing a scripted narrative one-man show based on the story of his career that he will perform himself. Take a walk down memory lane to some of his favorite hits!



Brevard County's New

VIBE

t does not happen often that a band has its debut performance on the biggest stage in the area opening for a national act, but this band did. VIBE performed for the very first time at the King Center for the Performing Arts opening up for Everclear in 2017. Truth be told, band leader Mikk Peace knew the show's promoter, but it takes a lot of trust nonetheless - and some impressive music history on Mikk's part. Since then there have been some changes in the lineup of musicians, and VIBE, once a little 3-piece-side-project for Mikk, has turned into a powerful 6-pieceband with ambitious plans. On Saturday, February 16th VIBE will perform a concert at Open Mike's, and this spring they will record their first album of original songs in a Nashville studio.

The story of VIBE is wrapped around a life-long music career of singer/songwriter/guitarist Mikk Peace who ran into Zac Dall, son of Poison rockstar Bobby Dall during the 2016 "80s In the Park" festival. They started talking and something clicked between Zac, who was in his early 20s and played drums, and Mikk who approached 50. They decided to meet in Mikk's jam room at his house. Bass player and friend Ricky Cook was invited and on the playlist was Mikk's extensive catalog of original songs. "We had fun," says Mikk about the first version of VIBE, and Zac wanted to be the manager, after all he had the best connections. And so it happened. A friend of Zac and Bobby Dall came over to film the band. The video was presented to rockstar father Bobby - and there was interest. There was some talk about Mikk

writing some songs together with Bobby who at that time considered a solo project. "Then Poison went on a long tour and I haven't heard back since," says Mikk. Besides that, Zac's father was concerned about the age difference between his son and the band, so VIBE had to look for a new drummer. The chapter one of VIBE was closed. But it wasn't the end. Mikk's positive and energized personality had just started to take interest, and in 2018 the revamped VIBE opened once again for a national act at the King Center - Ace Frehley, founding member of KISS.

The music quest of Mikk Peace started in Staunton, IL, a small town with 5,000 population, where Mikk grew up as Michael Stewart. His father played guitar in a 50s/60s rock'n'roll band called The Wanderers, and young Michael developed a good ear for music early on. There were plenty of guitars around, so he picked them up and started playing. Michael was a hard worker, in his early teens he picked up a pa-

per route with his bicycle, soon he was organizing the entire schedules for the delivery people. "I am a people person," says Mikk about himself. "I like to make people feel good. I am like 'The Little House of the Prairie' guy." Indeed, sitting down with Mikk and talking about his life is a humbling experience, and my observation of "the bigger the talent, the smaller the ego" proves itself once again.

Mikk was fascinated by the 80s rock'n'rollers, so for his 21st birthday his step-father bought him a one-way ticket to Los Angeles, CA. It was 1986, Mikk took a taxi to Sunset Blvd., and there he was with very little money in his pocket. For a short time he stayed in shelters, out every day to meet other musicians, and finding a place to stay - mostly with other musicians. "I ran into a lot of famous people, even met Cher," he remembers. Mikk stayed for four years, worked odd jobs and played music. Then he went back to Illinois, "I missed my family." In St. Louis he played with an original band

called Kidd Wicked. They were doing well. Then the guitarist and his girlfriend got murdered one night at their home. It was the end of the band and this dream.

Mikk moved on to New Jersey where he played with drummer friend Dino Castano, a well-known name in the metal scene. In 2004 he joined White Lion with Vito Bratta and Mike Tramp for a short time. "When they wanted to go on tour I declined," says Mikk, and this turned out to be a big mistake. It was the beginning of 3 albums, 2 world tours, and the first show packed 24,000 people into a stadium. Mikk explains his decision: "I worked at a great music center in New York, and from 26 teachers I had the most students. I just didn't want to give up that steady income."

Mikk needed a little break from music and back in St. Luis he worked the furniture and carpet cleaning business. "I have good work ethic," says Mikk. "I am never late, get along with people, don't mind getting my hands dirty, no drugs." And there was that ringing in his ears—Tinnitus, an annoying condition that is rampant among musicians. But after four years Mikk was back on stage with the band Drivin Rain, touring, playing festivals and opening for a lot of famous acts.

In 2010 Mikk decided to move to Florida. "I was tired of ice and snow," he confesses. He stayed with a friend in Merritt island and was determined to be an independent contractor. He supports himself with land-scaping, treasure hunting on the beach, and he works - as always - as a guitar instructor. For one year he joined Absolute Blue but the Tinnitus got in the way of playing loud music 4 nights a week.

Then in 2011 Mikk found himself on an unintended night out at Lou's Blues where he met the love of his life - Robyn. "We dated for two months and got married. She's my best friend and my life is wonderful and complete with her," marvels Mikk. Robyn made everything better and encouraged him to pursue his original music, writing and playing it. It is his second marriage, his first one ended in divorce decades ago and Mikk has two children, his daughter Jayde and his son Alex.

For the first time VIBE will perform at Open Mike's as a 6-piece band with Mikk Peace on guitar/vocal, Fred Hicks on rhythm guitar/vocals, Joseph Mercurio on guitar, Brad Bates on drums/vocals, and Robert Theodore on keys/vocals. The show will include many originals but also some cover tunes from Journey, Led Zeppelin, Billy Idol, Def Leppard and more. The admission is \$10 at the door and this money will pay for the band. Pree admission, free parking, over 125 crafters exhibiting, live continuous entertainment, along with a scrumptious menu of succulent seafood makes this a weekend no one wants to miss. This is Grant's 53rd annual festival, and it is the biggest fish fry in the south-east..

What sets this seafood festival apart from others is that it runs through a 100 percent volunteer effort. All preparation, whether it be on the grounds or with the purchasing, cooking or serving of the various menu items is accomplished by volunteers of the community. No regular food vendors have ever been on site. All booths are run with volunteers: many booths are made up of family members, often times having several generations working along side one another. It is this complete volunteer effort that makes this festival unique. The total commitment of the community and all their volunteers make the Grant Seafood Festival a time honored tradition unlike any other.

Sammy Hill

mong local musicians or music fans, the name Sammy Hill is well-known. One of the most sought after drummers in Brevard. he has played in many bands, mostly in more than one at a time. He currently keeps the beat for the pop dance band Switch, the punk band The Day After - "That's the most fun for me!" - and another reggae side project he started about a year ago called Top Hill Crew. As busy as Sammy is, it's hard to believe that for the past three decades he's endured a lot of pain in his knee caused by a sports accident when he was 19 years old and a passionate BMX gamer. That's why this year's Sigfest has pledged to raise some funds for Sammy Hill's (k)needed surgery with a high deductible that will put him out of work for a while.

Sammy Hill is not just a popular drummer but also a heck-of-a-nice guy. He's donated his talent and time to many fundraisers, among them Brevard Music Aid. Back in the days when *Brevard Live Magazine* held its annual Brevard Live Music Awards, Sammy was the drummer of the house band at most shows. In 2009 he won the *Favorite*


Drummer Award - and asked not to be put on the ballot again - to give other drummers the chance to win this popular vote. (And yes, his huge fan base nominated him every year.)

Siggy's American Bar is Sammy's favorite place to hang out and play drums with his bands. "The Sigafoos family is like my family," he explains. "I call Amy Mom, and her late husband David and her late son Shawn were my friends. They gave my first band the chance to play at Siggy's. We have a wonderful relationship and I am thankful for that." In fact, Sammy Hill has performed at every Sigfest, and his longtime girlfriend Merissa (who is also an officer at Brevard Music Aid while working as a rocket scientist during her day job) has worked those events full force. Sammy has a lot of kind words for Merissa. "She's my back bone," he says. "She's supported me and my music ever since we met 11 years ago. She even helps me set up and break down my drum set because she knows my knee has been giving me more and more problems." Sammy is grateful for the people in his life - his family, his friends and his fans.


Sammy Hill Jr was born in Leesburg, Florida, to a father named - Sammy Hill who was also a drummer, played with The Commodores for a while and worked as a warden in the State Penitentiary. "My father was strict," says Sammy, "and I thank him for that." He and his brother were not allowed to play sports outside but he taught him to drum and didn't object Sammy Jr taking on the BMX bike in 7th grade. "My dad bought me the first bike and took me to the comeptitions around the state. I was really good at it," says Sammy who has a room full of trophies to prove that. Playing drums and riding BMX bikes were Sammy's hobbies until he graduated highschool. In the meanwhile the family had moved to Tampa, and instead of going to college with the scholarships he was offered, Sammy decided to start working for British Airways at the airport. What followed were some life changing experiences which Sammy now calls "a blessing" since he learned valuable lessons.

Growing up 80s was a high energy sensation. BMX riding was a thrill - and so was the party drug ecstacy. It was the end of the decade when Sammy fell off the bike while training for a stunt and hurt his knee. In 1990 he underwent his first surgery, a year later he fell again. That was the end of his sports career. A couple of years earlier he had lost interest in drumming, so the new decade had no real focus. While Sammy has never taken drugs in his life, he started selling ecstacy. What Sammy Hill Senior tried to prevent the most had become reality. His son got in with the wrong crowd and was making easy money. And since there is no longtime merit in criminal activities, Sammy got caught. Five years penitentiary, his life was over - or maybe it just began?

Five years are a long time, and Sammy needed to figure out what to do. Then one day he saw Danny Carey, an American drummer and instrumentalist best known for his work in American Grammy Award-winning progressive metal band Tool. He has also contributed to albums by artists such as Zaum, Green Jellö, Pigface, Skinny Puppy, Adrian Belew of King Crimson, Carole King, Collide, Lusk, and the Melvins. Carey was in prison for drug charges as well and was allowed to play drums, Sammy watched him through a window. It was a WOWmoment in his life. Long story short they became friends, Sammy started to pratice his drumming skills again. "It was a blessing," says Sammy. "All day every day I was playing drums." And soon he was running the music department. This jailhouse rocked!

A free man again in 2005, Sammy Hill was back on track and focused on a future that included drumming along with another line of work that he enjoys. He builds audio systems for customized cars in his own shop. He's become so good that other shops call him for some specialized work. Sammy is a happy, and fulfilled man - "I just do me!" - if it weren't for that hurting knee that requires him to get gel shots every week now. It's time for a knee replacement, an operation that he's pushed away for several years. 2019 is his year to become pain free again, so he can keep on drumming.

The Column

Street Life

I scour the streets looking for that perfect spot to throw open my case. A place of visibility, in the midst of the bustling metropolis, avoiding those places too remote so as to not attract the riff-raff who lie in wait to abscond with anything that they can get. Ironically, to many I would appear to be included in the aforementioned group. A traveling minstrel perhaps, but a scoundrel to none, I work here. I carry a badge. I am... a street musician.

Earlier in my life, I spent a few years just traveling around, following the sun, and playing music on the streets of wherever I happened to land. I could fit everything I needed in my backpack, guitar case and trumpet case. At the time, guitar cases were made out of plywood and were extremely strong, albeit very heavy. Besides my guitar, I could fit two changes of clothes, including socks! I hitchhiked around the country with this set-up for a few years. Needless to say, I was in much better shape back then. One time, I was stuck in a rainstorm in the middle of Kansas somewhere. Seeing the storm roll in, I made a beeline to the closest under pass, which was a few hundred yards away. I would take refuge there until the storm passed. As I sat there listening to the cacophony of trucks whizzing by overhead, along with the pounding of the rain and the thunder, I started to ponder. Taking a Pall Mall out of the top pocket my faded jeans jacket, I fumbled for a match. Luckily they were still dry. Savoring my first drag, pondering how long it would be before I could get back on the road. It was then I realized that it didn't really matter. I wasn't on any time schedule. I didn't have to be anywhere, ever! That was a revelation to me. I didn't have to be anywhere ever! I could stay under that bridge forever if I chose to. It was a freedom rarely experienced in life. The rain stopped about an hour later.

The next day I ended up in Denver, where I hooked up with Bob. Bob and I grew up together and played music together for decades to come. He had a place in downtown Denver which was right across the street from Cheeseman Park. If you ever needed weed, that's where you would hang. We met Sam, another singer/songwriter, at a coffee house we would frequent. We started a trio so we could have three part harmony. Believe me, a major selling point on the street was three part harmony. We started playing

on Pearl Street in Boulder a few times a week. They were just building Pearl Street back then. Each side was a brick walkway lined with shops. The middle was a grassy knoll. Every day when the weather was nice, people would come out of their shops about lunchtime and enjoy their lunches on the grassy knoll. We would play for about an hour to our captive audience, our harmonies reverberating throughout the "mall". People loved it. We would make more money doing this than actually playing 3 or 4 bar gigs. Then I met Rosie.

Rosie played 12 string guitar and sang. We would play everything from Greatful Dead to Billy Holiday. We started living together, we got a puppy. Harate (who's name meant excellence of mind and body) was a border collie with 1/8th golden retriever. He was the smartest dog I've ever known. We called him Harry. So after our stint in Denver, Rosie, Harry and I decided we needed to go to Seattle. That was a trip! Hitchhiking with 2 guitars, 2 backpacks, a trumpet, a dog, and a 20lb. bag of food was going to be a challenge. Somewhere in the heights of the Rocky Mountains, the sun was setting and we were ready to make camp for the night. A car pulled over, a scraggly looking guy leans out the window. "Where you going?" he asked. "Seattle", we replied. "Me too!" was his answer. Totally shocked, we piled everything in his car and off we were. We made it into Seattle and found some friends of Rosie who happened to be managing a house that was turned into 4 apartments. We had a place to stay until we got on our feet! We started playing at the Pike Place market. There, you had to have a badge, be registered as a street musician, and only could play where there was a music note painted on the street. Many other towns were like this too. Within a month, we could afford one of the apartments in that same house. Sometimes, one of the drunks on the street would try to take money out of our case. A quick kick of the plywood top would leave his hand impaled by the top latch. They wouldn't try that again! Soon Bob came out and we started a band with a bunch of other guys. We had a fiddle, dobro, drummer, string bass, and clarinet with Bob and I covering the guitar parts. The band was called "Home Cooking." Again, we found we could make more on the streets that we could by playing gigs. We had a great time and played whenever we wanted to. The golden rule of the streets: play loud, sing even louder! In 1979, Home Cooking won the Seattle street band competition, leading to radio shows, gigs and a trip to Alaska.

From New York to New Orleans, from Boulder to Seattle, we played all across the country. There were so many unbelievable moments, too many to recall here. And still I ponder that day in Kansas, sitting under the bridge, wondering if I'll ever be able to once again say... I never have to be anywhere ever!



couldn't sleep the other night and I **■** started watching *YouTube* videos... and I went down the rabbit hole. If you have ever gone down the YouTube rabbit hole, and I know you have, then you can relate to what I'm talking about. Earlier in the night I found myself listening to music and following whatever was suggested to me by the site. (that's how the rabbit hole starts) and eventually I was party to the one and only 'We Are the World'. Let me be clear - I was tuning into the original cut, not the faux remake that came after the Haiti tragedy. Not taking anything away from Haiti's heartache...I feel for their plight, but the remake didn't hold a digital, over-produced, autotuned candle to the original 'We Are the World' written and produced by Berry Gordy, Lionel Ritchie and Michael Jackson. Anyway...continuing down the rabbit hole, I started watching clips of Lionel Ritchie on his own and let me tell you, I was both excited by his talent and charisma, as well as embarrassed by the fact that I hadn't paid much attention to him in the past.

For some reason I hooked onto Lionel. Like all of us, I have heard a gagillion songs by the man, but this time I wanted to really listen and see what he had to say. So often, I think, we get used to hearing common songs and we take them for granted, never really dig-

ging into what is going on. This time I wanted to "hear" everything he had to say. I wanted to understand the lyrics, the arrangement, the instrumentals... everything. And so, I put my headphones on and ventured into his musical world. After listening to a collection of his greatest hits I took a trip back in time. I found a concert from the mideighties...his heyday and started there. I wanted to see what old Lionel was like in his prime and compare it to what we know of him today. In a capsule - it as charismatic, melodic, energetic and full. It was everything you could hope from an artist of his tambour.

Then, I jumped ahead in time and I watched a concert from just a year ago. Two things stood out to me. The first was that he started the concert the exact same way as he did in the eighties. Before he appeared onstage there as a sample from 'Hello' that went like this: "Hello, is me you're looking for?". After that he appeared and started the show. The second thing I noticed was that he was so on with every note and change it was as if he hadn't aged a second. Nowadays there are any number of artists from 20, 30 years ago still trying to stake a claim on relevance...or at least trying to make a buck on what they did yesterday. Lionel Ritchie still carries the flame he lit all those years ago when you were playing his music during your first college hook-up.

After I he had me at "Hello" and the songs were in my brain I started replaying them and listening to the arrangement. If you take the time to really listen, you will start to hear influences and membranes from the earlier parts of his career. The bassline on 'All Night Long' for instance, is so tell tale of his funk past with the Commodores, and please pay attention to the keyboard/horn part in the breakdown...it's insane. The piano on 'Easy' is an amazing example of simplicity carrying the torch for greatness. By the way, that's the song that got him kicked out of the Commodores. Apparently, they were tired of him writing slow love songs

since they were originally a funk band. But, it's also the song that launched his solo career.

Since then, the man has gone on to write some of the most beloved songs that soundtrack our lives including 'Endless Love', 'Say You Say Me', and 'Stuck On You'. He has been nominated for, and won, a ridiculous amount of Grammy's and Globe awards and has even been honored with the Johnny Mercer Award which is the highest honor in the *Songwriter's Hall of Fame*.

I know you have heard Lionel Ritchie...who hasn't? But if you haven't really taken a close look at his work, then I think you are missing out. His voice, his melody, and his arrangements are intrinsically woven into everything we listen to on the radio. Not only is Lionel Ritchie a forefather of our modern music, he is still a relevant staple in our musical realm. Take it from me audiophiles...listen to Lionel Ritchie. Listen hard, and listen with completely open ears and you won't be sorry.



CD Review

Lydia Can't Breathe Taste New

This month's CD review is for the Metal/Rock band Lydia Can't Breathe CD "Taste New". They are from Florida and have been active since 2010. They consist of Kyle Bolduc (Lead vocals, guitars), A.J. Murphy (guitar), Josh Runfeldt (drums), and Shad Roundy (bass). Their music has an exciting mixture of growling vocals, natural vocals driving an overtone of heavy phrases, breakdowns and catchy progressions. My now inactive band RPG had the pleasure of sharing the stage with LCB a few times. I'm not easily impressed but on one show as we were setting up for our set, they came out for a sound

check that actually blew me away! To be quite honest, I'm not that big of a fan of the growl style of Metal. Doesn't mean I can't give an unbiased review. As I listened, yes, there was the growl and respectable detuning but LCB can play their instruments as good as anyone! They are very technical. There's not a Metal band in the area that puts on a better live show than these guys! Their originality and sound is unique compared to the usual genre.

The only thing that raised a quick eyebrow was, I kept waiting for more leads. Not knocking the talent of the guitarist at all. There are some very cool leads on this CD. I just wanted more.

There are 12 tunes on this CD. All are expertly written, recorded and performed. All songs are in the 3:30 minute range and come right after another in a way that makes you feel you're on a heavy metal journey. "Rise As One" has some nice double guitar at 01:11. "Adventure Out", my favorite tune, has it all. Natural vocals starting out at the 00:13 mark then some Limp Bizkit rap rock like stuff at 00:38. Some growl follows and resolves into some sweet subdued vocals and music. All through the tune the band is smoking, playing Dream Theater like changes and progressions. The next tune "Liberator", I must tell a little story. I was listening to this tune on my way home from work in my hot rod. Windows down, A1A, (Patrick AFB) ocean breeze and southbound when this idiot in a Camaro going northbound decides he wants to do a 360 and head south regardless of traffic. I usually get ahead of guys like this or hang way back. Well, I'm listening to LCB so I pull a little ahead of traffic and settle down. Next thing I know this guy is right on my tail! Scary close! So he pulls out beside me and starts to race away. "Liberator" is blazing and I decided I wanted to be liberated. I'm pushing almost 700HP and proceeded to blow him away. Won't say how fast I was going. My wife, kids and grandkids may be reading!

"Victims" really shows what great songwriting is going on. Check out how the song switches gears at the 02:08 mark along with a sweet lead. The rhythm section (bass/drums) kill it during this song. In fact, they nail it throughout the whole CD. Tightest rhythm section I've heard or reviewed in awhile. The title track "Taste New", another favorite, exemplifies once again how good LCB is. I could write several paragraphs on each tune. This CD is definitely on top of the genre. It has clean parts, nice acoustic guitar parts and heavy guitar tones throughout. I must add, LCB is one of the hardest working bands in Central Florida. They write, tour, then write and tour some more. Always plying their trade.

If you are into Tool, Killswitch Engage and the technical prowess and songwriting of Opeth. You will absolutely enjoy Lydia Can't Breathe. LCB has a lot going on.

An Aquarian Exposition **BeachSide Retro**

Where do I start? This is not just a question for this article but for anyone who visits BeachSide Retro in Satellite Beach. Once you enter the store the magnitude of impressions is overwhelming: hipster clothing, vintage records, vinyls and CDs, posters, jewelry, artifacts, a gigantic butterfly above it all, with little "air guitars" hanging from the ceiling. If you once were a "flower child," you will feel transferred into the past, about 50 years ago when hippies roamed the earth with the message of love, peace and happiness. If you are of younger age, this is an Aquarian Museum where you find the relict of a kinder and gentler world when rock'n'roll was born. BeachSide Retro is by no means one of the many thrift stores but a place where you can actually "turn back time."

Mandy Herndon is the owner and soul of this retro store, and she knows this era from personal experience. She was 16 years old when she attended the 3 days of Woodstock's Peace & Music Festival in 1969 held on a dairy farm in the Catskill Mountains, northwest of New York City, which attracted an audience of more than 400,000 (only 50,000 people were expected). "I still have half of my ticket," she smiles. (Back then the tickets were torn into half at time of entry.) Then she adds, "And I left a piece of me there." What she took with her was more than a memory of a great music festival, it was the Aquarian spirit which translates to "spread the love." And that's what you feel when you enter the store.

The "good old days" are very much alive at BeachSide Retro. "I want to bring back customer service along with bell bottom pants," says Mandy, and this is no joke. Indeed she wears bell bottom jeans - looks great! - and she spent the past Christmas season wrapping a lot of gifts for customers. "Especially the male population appreciated this service,"

she smiles. No doubt, Mandy wants to spread love and happiness in her store. And the good old fashion customer service is part of the entire concept.

BeachSide Retro was a retirement dream of Mandy and her husband when they moved from Virginia to Florida two years ago. "We were tired of the cold and wanted to change the latitude," she remembers. They bought the business, collected inventory, cleaned the shop - everything was planned out. Mandy, a skilled diamontologist, would take care of the merchandise, her husband would do the paperwork. Then six weeks after buying the shop, her husband passed away unexpectedly. Mandy was devastated but struggled through the hard times with the help of her family and friends. The first location in Indialantic didn't work out, so she decided to move to Satellite Beach. In the Skyview Plaza right on A1A she feels that her business found the right home. "The other business owners are friendly and welcoming. It's like a little village," she says.

Just like they did in the "good old days" Mandy and her employees drag a nice display of posters, clothes and T-shirts outside of the store to attract attention. Find them on Facebook and read the reviews, no unhappy customers here. One word is used in every comment - COOL! No matter if you look for a certain band T-shirt, a long lost vinyl album, a record player (they sold 20 of them during Christmas season) or just want to spend some time browsing through old memories, this retro shop has what you are looking for. This year celebrates the 50th anniversary of Woodstock, and after all these years this "counter culture" is very much alive.

I've been able to accomplish a lot of things in my life. Some seemed far fetched, but many were just being able to capitalize in the right place at the the right moment. For the past 3 years, my band Best Supporting Actor has been able to bring together different bands (mostly from Brevard) to entertain you fine people.

Best Fest was a pipe dream for me and my soon-to-be 12 year old original rock band. Wouldn't it be cool to be a rock star and have a day long festival headlined by some amazing long lost reunited band? Well, I'm not quite the rock star and Best Fest has been greatly scaled down from its grandeur daydreams.

What it has become, however, is something to look forward to. Our first one, in January of 2015, embodied what we were looking to set out to do. We had a rap duo, Celtic rockabilly, hard hitting rock and even a now defunct straight up punk band from Vero. It was diverse and it confused a lot of people. Mission accomplished.

Let me take this opportunity to say thank you to the core people/businesses that make Best Fest happen. Ashley Turek not only owns and operates Ashley's Sportspage in Satellite Beach, but has trusted in me to make original music shows a reality. We may not always agree but she is supportive in our vision and the overall direction of Best Fest. Also thank you to our sound companies - Tritt Productions and Punch Records - for giving us sound to make our noise.

One of the key changes we made early on was the dropping of the cover charge in lieu of obtaining sponsors. Having local businesses involved was always more than the revenue collected to pay the bands playing. Now we have a bond to promote and recognize these willing to support our creativeness. We've had a lot of diverse sponsors; from 80s music festivals to cab companies to clothing boutiques. Some stayed around, others dropped off. It was one of those spontaneous moves that made perfect sense from the get go.

So here we are in year three. Our eleventh show is on the books and we plan for number twelve. Bands are now reaching out and requesting to play. That makes my job a little easier. I get so much satisfaction seeing the finished line up come together. Introducing the audience and many times the musicians themselves to new sounds that they may not have discovered on their own. Best Fest has and should always be an audio version of my music columns for both the musicians and fans alike.

We didn't invent to local music showcases. My intention was to turn it on its ear. I'll be honest, some bands we book I don't know a lot about. It's not about what I like or don't like. Heck, you may not like them by the end of the night either. It's reminding the many music fans in this area, as well as educating new fans, that this music exists. That the person next to you at work, or the pizza delivery person you see once a week also play music. They have dreams. They have aspirations. They come home from work, from school. They go to band practice. They write guitar riffs and or lyrics in

their head and repeat it enough to write it down later. They deserve a shot. I often find myself not watching a band perform at Best Fest but rather watch the crowd watch the band to see their reaction.

We've done a lot of shows with a lot of bands. We are coming up on our twelfth Best Fest this spring. Each show with at least four bands playing with very little repeat players. It is purposeful for us not to the headline the show although that has happened sometimes more out of circumstances rather than design. The irony of that regarding our name being Best Supporting Actor didn't register until well into our tenure. Finding the right date that everyone is available has added to my gray hair. It inevitably comes to pass that we book and announce the show only to find out that there is another show down the street or three more across the causeway. Too many local original music shows in Brevard? We should be so lucky.

So what happens next? If you build it, they will come. Attendance is always a concern as at the end of the day it is a business venture with profits and losses. Lineups I thought would have killed have come up short. Bands that I had little faith in have packed the venue. I have written in previous columns and articles that the scene relies on you. I stand by that statement each time I write it. I've met some great, loyal people over the years that come out regularly. I've also met people who have come in almost by happenstance and have their mind blown. Honestly I'd sleep better knowing there would be a flow of both but that is the nature of the beast...

I've learned a lot when it comes to promoting the shows over the years. I am a big project wrestling fan. They have monthly shows on pay per view. Growing up I would remember wrestling shows pumping up next ppv as a

Take It To Heart

There are songs that I feel have only one problem and that is that they are too short. You know the ones I'm talking about. They seem to be over long before you are ready for them to be. They leave you wanting more. January is a month like that. It just really gets started and then....it's over. In a bit of foreshadowing, his picture graced our article description of the Artworks Festival aka Eau Gallie Arts Festival last November. It was here that I was able to pick his brain about his instantly memorable collection of paintings.

His booth at the festival was just down the street from his most recognizable work; The Lego People. "The location was chosen based on the business and whether the business owner was receptive to the concept. A kids eye doctor was just a perfect fit for my mural concept." The mural boasts portraits of everyone from Prince, The Ghostbusters, Andy Warhol. I could go on and probably would if not for prompting you to go see it for yourself. Almost immediately after my infatuation came the question. "How does he get away with it"? Surely there has to be potential legal issues? "With pop or fan art copyright and intellectual property rights are always a concern. With my Lego inspired pieces I was pretty sure I had my bases covered by parody law", he says. That feeling was about to be tested as a tourist visiting the US happened to come across Meagher's work in O-town.

"I was approached by a client that asked me if I could ship to Denmark (location of the Lego headquarters). He then informed me that the David Bowie Lego piece he was buying was for his wife who is the president of the Lego Foundation. He assured me that the president of the company was a family friend and that he would love my work. He later informed via Instagram message that the piece is hanging in his wife's office and the President of the Lego company indeed loved it."

My personal favorite part of the mural is the least famous, at least outside of Brevard, character in it. Eau Gallie Florist resides in the building just past a small courtyard. Link Johnsten's portrait is visible from their front door as you're walking in. Johnsten died unexpectedly in April of 2015 but his influence on EGAD is still felt to this day. "I had known Link for years after showing some of his pottery at a space I was curating", he said. My wife Rebecca wanted to get into floral design, so I called him to see how she should go about getting into the business. He hired her as a shop girl and mentored her until she was their lead designer. Honestly I'm not sure there would be any murals in EGAD were it not for Link's efforts to turn the area into and arts district."

Meagher has been keeping busy as of late. "Currently I'm working about six festivals a year mostly local with the exception of one in Atlanta. The goal is to increase those out of state shows in the next couple years. I also have two new murals coming up; the first is my largest non Lego inspired mural to date. It's inside 28 North Gastropub at The Avenues at Viera. The second is for the Sam Flax mural wall project in Orlando. It's such an honor to be chosen out of hundreds of submissions. That project was particularly special and one I really wanted. It's huge to have my work in such a visible location and on the premier art store in Orlando. Definitely a goal I was working toward."


I ask what advice he has for aspiring artists of all ages. "Get comfortable talking about your work, have an "elevator pitch", he says. "Don't be afraid to ask about being involved in a show or project just because you weren't invited. That doesn't mean you won't get in". He really epitomizes the work and dedication needed to succeed. "There's no set path or method to making it as an artist. It takes some experimenting to define your style and the audience for what you do."
