






The Surfing Santas

What started as a fun family outing in 2009 has grown to become an annual event that raises tens of thousands of dollars for local charities and draws surfing and Christmas enthusiasts from all over the planet. The event has become the biggest tourist attraction since NASA's space and shuttle program.

The first, very unofficial Surfing Santas event took place in 2009, when, on Christmas Eve, Cocoa Beach resident George Trosset and his son, George Jr., and daughterin-law Britteny thought it would be fun to go surfing in South Cocoa Beach dressed up as Santa Claus and his elves. When a photo of their antics hit the front page of a Florida newspaper, others wanted to join the fun. Since then, the number of Surfing Santas has grown almost exponentially each year.

Over the past decade, Surfing Santas has grown into one of the most unique and fun-filled charity events the world has ever seen. This congregation of costumed kahunas has grown to record-breaking numbers with over 800 Surfing Santas and nearly 10,000 spectators.

Since anyone of any age can participate as a Surfing Santa, exactly how many Santas will descend on Cocoa Beach this December 24th remains to be seen. The only requirement is to show up with your board and dressed as Santa or his helpers or any other character depicting the spirit of the season. In the past, there also have been reindeer and Christmas tree Surfing Santas, Rastafarian Surfing Santas, and even a Batman Surfing Santa. There are no rules about costumes, organizers point out, as long as one remembers this is a family oriented event. A costume contest open to the public has been added in 2017. Anyone in the crowd can participate by dressing up in a winter-themed outfit.

All this beachy holiday merriment is for a good cause.

Proceeds from donations and sales of the official Surfing Santas T-shirt commemorating this free event benefit two local nonprofit organizations, *Grind for Life* and the *Florida Surf Museum*.

The event begins at 8 am along the beach near 2 Minutemen Causeway (where the causeway intersects with N. Atlantic Avenue, also known as Florida Route A1A) and is expected to continue until early afternoon. Plenty of parking is available and numerous area restaurants will be open to serve Surfing Santas participants and spectators. The Mighty Flea Circus Band will be performing along with Hawaiian Dancers.

After the success of The Book of Mormon, he later became known for co-writing the songs featured in the Disney animated films Frozen, its sequel Frozen II, and Coco, with his wife Kristen Anderson-Lopez. Parker and Stone are best-known for their animated television series South Park for Comedy Central.

THREE DOG NIGHT

Legendary band Three Dog Night, now in its 6th decade, claims some of the most astonishing statistics in popular music. In the years 1969 through 1974, no other group achieved more top 10 hits, move more records, or sold more concert tickets than Three Dog Night.

Three Dog Night hits weave through the fabric of pop culture to-day, whether on the radio where they are heard day in and day out, in TV commercials or in major motion pictures; songs like "Mama Told Me (Not To Come)", "Joy to the World", "Black and White", "Shambala" and "One" serve to heighten our emotions and crystallize Three Dog Night's continuing popularity.

Boasting chart and sales records that remain virtually unmatched in popular music, Three Dog Night holds a *Billboard Magazine* record for releasing 21 consecutive Top 40 hits, including three #1 singles "Mama Told Me (Not To Come)", "Joy to the World", and "Liar". The chart success drove 7 Platinum-selling singles and 12 straight RIAA Certified Gold LPs. The hits appeared on best-selling charts in all genres (pop, rock, rhythm

& blues, and country). Its records continue to sell around the world, reaching beyond the boarders of the U.S. into Japan, Canada, Holland, England, Germany, Spain, and elsewhere. Tens of millions of Three Dog Night records have been sold through the years.

Created in 1968 by Danny Hutton, Three Dog Night maintains an aggressive, year-round touring schedule of over 90 dates a year, performing their hit filled concerts for multi-generational audiences. The band's now-famous name refers to native Australian hunters in the outback who huddled with their dogs for warmth on cold nights; the coldest being a "three dog night."

The band recorded songs of the best and largely undiscovered new songwriters of its time including Harry Nilsson, Randy Newman, Elton John, Laura Nyro, Paul Williams, and Hoyt Axton among many others. The group's eclectic taste, combined with its ability to recognize and record hits in a unique, distinctive, and appealing style, resulted in Three Dog Night dominating the charts for years. The band's music transcends time, bringing together both new and longtime audiences alike.

Three Dog Night demonstrates its eclectic song choices once again with the new material being recorded for an upcoming album release. One of the new tracks, "Prayer of the Children" was discovered by Hutton who created an a cappella arrangement, so that for the first time in the history of Three Dog Night, the vocals of all six members of the band are featured. The song is currently part of their live concert set and quickly becoming an audience favorite.

Marking over 50 years on the road, Three Dog Night continues to grow its fan base by keeping up a full schedule of concerts at theaters, performing arts centers, fairs, festivals, corporate events, and casinos. Since 1968, the band has performed nearly 3,000 shows including two Super Bowls.

During decades of fame the band has changed multiple members. In 1993 a young drummer named **Pat Bautz** was hired to replace Mike Keeley who drummed from 1985 to 1993. Pat was (and is) a "local" who attended Eau Gallie High School and has lived on the Space Coast most of his life. He's known to many local musicians as a mentor helping several bands with their recordings. In 2024, after 31 years, Pat Bautz resigned as drummer of Three Dog Night and their intense touring schedule.

In a conversation with *Brevard Live* Bautz confirmed that he will attend all Florida live shows and perform - as a percussionist. "We are in constant contact," he says about his band mates.

In his "retirement" Bautz is still performing on a local level enriching our local music scene. "It's a trio with a couple of friends, we call it *3 Peace*. I am also still writing cues for *Warner Brothers*," he added.



Space Coast Renaissance Fair





This brought her to another important lesson learned: Always remember that the other musicians in your community are your co-workers and friends, not your competition. Local musicians are not rivals but rather family.

Sweetwater Memories

I write quite frequently of Sweetwater. As I should because it no longer exists. Oh, the ground it was on is still there but its physical existence is gone. Its history is falling into oblivion as well. Where once stood sweeping vistas of strawberry, sugarcane, and tomato fields now stand vast clusters of cookie cutter homes and strip malls filled with bodegas, Latin cafes and various other small Latin businesses.

The spaces where Jimmy's Bar and The Bilmar Lounge stood directly across the dusty road from each other are now occupied by two massive high rise dormitories for students of the Florida International University. The residents will never know of the seemingly never ending fights, knife fights, and shootings that occurred on Friday and Saturday nights in what was once a frontier town on the very edge of the Everglades.

A few yards south of the bars were several homes built by Sweet-water's earliest settlers, The Royal Russian Midgets (as they were called back then). The homes were small in scale as were their occupants. In nine-teen forty the Royal Russian troupe (they were internationally renowned acrobats) were directed to the site by their manager Joe Sanderlin who later became the town's first mayor. My

siblings along with myself were sometimes kept in the care of Aunt May, as she was known in her home. Its ceilings were much lower than those that we are accustomed to. And yes...She was a little person and a daughter of one of some of the original settlers, as well as a truly wonderful and interesting woman. It should be known that her son Frankie stood over six feet in height and was later killed in action during the conflict in Vietnam. He isn't remembered by many either, yet, deserves recognition in my opinion.

All of the street signs, parks, and buildings that were named after and dedicated to original founders and benefactors of the small town have since been changed to the names of the new politicians and residents of Nicaraguan and other Latin descent. The empty fields and lots that we played in as kids are crammed shoulder to shoulder with walled homes bearing bars on the windows to deter crime in what was once a quiet little village of friends and neighbors.

When I referred to the two bars that no longer exist and the almost nightly altercations it should be known that the majority of the civil issues and unrest were the result of folks coming from the larger burgh of Miami looking to raise a bit of hell in an out of the way place.




My wife Lissa and I went to Sweetwater a few years back to visit our friend, the sitting chief of police, and afterwards I drove around my old hometown looking for landmarks and places that I haunted as a youth...I got lost. I only recognized a few old buildings that still remained; other than that I couldn't really find my way around. The town has become a city with expanded boundaries and is now the most densely populated place in Florida. Look it up.

History gets lost and sometimes completely erased. Metro Dade County is notorious for changing and destroying its history without a second thought in the name of progress, and let's face it, cash. There are uncountable bits and pieces of important and interesting history all over our nation that fall into oblivion but it seems as though South Florida leads them all in its race for relevance. I miss the old days as most of us boomers do, and some of the changes that have come to pass in my old stomping grounds leave a bitter taste in my mouth.

I saw it coming, that's one of the reasons I moved to Brevard in the late nineteen seventies. Melbourne reminded me a little of Miami in the sixties. And now...It's racing to catch up. Look around your county. There are countless plots of natural Florida being cleared for huge housing projects in almost every corridor. Why? Because people want to live in a better place, but watch out because years from now the same thing will happen here. As Brevard's population grows (and folks, it is!) Our natural beauty and landscape will become much like my beloved South Florida: A thing of the past in the name of progress and cash. That's my take on my Flori-Duh!

Movie Review

Bruce Springsteen:
Deliver Me From Nowhere

On the cusp of global superstardom, New Jersey rocker Bruce Springsteen struggles to reconcile the pressures of success with the ghosts of his past as he records the album "Nebraska" in the early 1980s.

Springsteen (The Boss, as he was being called by then) is played by Jeremy Allen White. Manager/friend Jon Landau played by Jeremy Strong. And a cameo by Jimmy Iovine playing himself. I was Impressed with Jeremy Allen White's portrayal. He did a good job playing the Boss and sang in the movie, no lip synching, I personally don't think Springsteen has a sensational voice, He's more of a "package", a very good songwriter, story teller, a great stage performer and consistently puts on a physically demanding live show. If you're a huge fan or someone who has a handful of songs they like, his singing isn't the "catch", it's the whole package that makes Springsteen. Springsteen has had 21 studio albums starting with "Greetings from Asbury Park N.J" in '1973. Coming off his fifth album "The River" with his first top five hit on the Billboard hot 100 with the hit "Hungry Heart", he returned to his home in Colts Neck, N.J to start writing songs for his sixth album. Upon returning (without giving to much away) to the place he grew up, Springsteen becomes very retrospective and is struggling with the fame he is starting to acquire.

This film deals mainly with that sixth album, "Nebraska". In the bedroom of his home he recorded seventeen songs unaccompanied on a 4-track recorder. They were supposed to have been re-recorded with the E Street Band. But Springsteen decided to release them exactly as they were. Which turned out to be a problem in a modern recording studio. They released the album on 9/30/1980 with no press, no tour and his face not on the cover, with ten of the songs. The other seven songs were full band renditions on the follow up album "Born in the USA" (1984) or as B-Sides. It also delved into the troubled past with his father. And the toll mental illness and depression takes on a family. And how it can manifest through your entire life or a fraction of time in it. The movie lagged here and there, and I got bored. I did enjoy the performances of the actors and the parts at the famous "Stone Pony" (live music venue in Jersey).

If you're not a fan of Bruce Springsteen (his music or him personally) going to see this movie will not convert you into becoming a fan. The movie really is for fans (or music buffs). If you are a fan, the movie will give you some interesting insights as to why he decided to write an introspective, dark acoustic album as he was on the cusp of super stardom.
