THE MIFF 2025 HITS THE MARK AGAIN!

Every October, when that little bit of chill we crave all summer starts to roll in, and the dark seems a little scarier than normal, Terry Cronin and his crew bring the Melbourne Independent Filmmakers Festival to the beloved locally owned Oaks 10 Theaters. Every year it gets a little bigger and better, so when it came time join the fun, I jumped in, ready to sit for hours in the dark, and it was fun. For most of its existence the festival started on Friday and through Sunday. According to Cronin they started running opening night on Thursday a few years back, and it seems to work out well. This year the kickoff was a fantastic documentary called Making Mega Force. The doc centers around a beautiful disaster of the 1980's known eloquently as Mega Force. Sounds like a precursor to *The Pow*er Rangers, right? This movie was greenlit because of the amazing talent attached to it. The film was produced by Andre Morgan (Enter the Dragon) and Albert Ruddy (The Godfather) and it starred Barry Bostwick, a big star coming off of Rocky Horror Picture Show. It was supposed to be great but fell more than a little short. After the movie the festival moved over to Tide and Tonic for the traditional opening night party, once

again featuring rock violinist Char Good.

Friday kicked off with the International Program. With an early start time of 3:45pm on a workday I was wondering about attendance, but it found its way, and those who made it were set up for some real treats. Cronin procured some cultural gems from all over the world including Vietnam, Italy, France, Japan, Brazil, and Germany.

Local Wisney Fernandez did some voice-over work for a couple of characters on a new animated series for Cartoon Network by Lear Bunda. Both Wisney and Lear were on hand for a short sneak peak of what's to come for the Bed Bug Hotel. The comedy program was hosted by up and coming stand up Lisa Corrao. Lisa is a former middle school science teacher from Ft. Lauderdale who got bit by the comedy bug and never looked back. She consistently tours, has appeared on a handful of television shows and recently sold her first full length special to Amazon. About halfway through the program we were treated to a musical interlude featuring Weird Al styled parodies by a couple of the filmmakers. It was a fun break from the screen for a bit. Little surprises like that show Cronin's fun side and

keep you guessing about what's coming next. The comedy program was sensational and when it was finished, it was time for a break to the lobby so the employees could clean the theater and get it ready for everyone's favorite part of the night - Fright Night Friday - a program for horror and sci-fi.

Out in the lobby for intermission the crowd took full advantage of the red carpet to get pictures of the talent both locally and from afar. Volunteers were busy selling MIFF merch including some very special t-shirts. Did I mention that all the profits from the festival went to No Limits Academy, a non-profit Christian based school for physically disabled children ages 6-21?

This night was also the 50th anniversary of the Rocky Horror Picture Show in a different theater. Before I had this information, I was a little confused because there were teenagers everywhere dressed in underwear and drag. But it all made sense eventually.

Back inside, everyone excitedly settled in for the horror program and, man was it great! Two major highlights were a movie out of Spain called La Bonita and a film titled Flicker, written, produced, edited, filmed, starred in etc, by a local high school teen named Alyssa Lynn Marquez. Alyssa had a lot of support show up for her, maybe 20 percent of the theater, seriously. I love that a local kid can make something so creative and mature and have it shown on the big screen at her local hometown theater. It really is a beautiful thing the Three Boys Prodctions (Terry Cronin, Pat Martin, Bob Lizek and Jeff Hall) have put together. The MIFF has become an institution in Melbourne, let's keep it that way for as long as we can.

With engines revving for a 9am start time, Saturday made for a long, packed day. The Florida Film Makers Matinee is a beloved collection of films by Floridians, many of which are

very local and make up a special community that is constantly shooting and creating right around where we live and play. Every year I recognize some of the film makers in this program, and I love to see what they were working on this last year.

About half past noon there is the traditional Film Makers Q&A - a panel of directors, actors and others from behind the camera to answer questions about the industry, techniques and funny stories from the set.

After the Q&A the boys have put together something that melts my heart: the Rising Stars Filmmaking Program dedicated to films made by minors. This one hit home for me because some of the best memories I have from my youth involved my friends and I borrowing a giant "camcorder" loaded with a VHS tape and bringing stories to life. These days there is ten times more tech on my phone to film, edit and even distribute but we tried hard and felt good about what we made. These kids are on another level completely and really blow me away with their talent.

Another big documentary was premiered later in the afternoon. A film about Martin Caidin, the author of The Six Million Dollar Man and his impact on aerospace, television and some say...telekinesis.

By 7pm it was time for the VIP Program and Awards. Movie watchers were all encouraged to vote for their favorite films at the end of each program. Awards from film festivals can go a long way in boosting a film's audience and reach so this is a big deal. After another run of films, everyone moved over to Hemingway's Tavern for an after party with the Knights from Rockstar Entertainment to sing karaoke. It was another smash weekend for the MIFF and everyone in attendance. I have a feeling the Three Boys are already working on next year's festival so if you missed this one, you will get another chance in about a year. We'll see you at the movies.


Cocoa Beach Art Show





Vince Cranford

aka Love Valley, The Project Orcon Revival, Bearded Banjo Trip, Catgut Stitches

Vince Cranford: "I never thought music was something I could do." Well, he's certainly proved music is not only something he can do, but he does so well, he's able to make it his full-time career.

Vince Cranford of Love Valley, Project Orcon Revival, Bearded Banjo Trip and solo gigs as "Catgut Stitches," has been a vital part of Cocoa Beach's music scene for nearly two decades. He made his debut with "Vintage," and this January will be celebrating the ten-year anniversary of Love Valley. Vince previously worked at NASA and appreciated the opportunity to work with amazingly bright men and women but a couple years ago he decided to become his own boss and devote himself to music fulltime. He can be found entertaining audiences with his soulful vocals, strumming his guitar or busting out blues rhythms on his harmonica. Vince leads Love Valley with vocals and guitar, anchored by Corey Yentz on the bass, rhythm driven by Jeremy Novick the percussionist, and Jim Pacelt who completes the lineup bringing enriching melodies on the keyboard.

"Catgut Stitches," a name often asked of its origin, was derived from a coworker entertaining the challenge of creating an old man blue's name for Vince to pass time at work, and the name stuck. Vince moved to the Cocoa Beach area after graduating from high school in North Carolina. Love Valley's name stems from a small cowboy town near where Vince grew up. A venue that held a 70's music festival that featured the Allman Brothers, a cool place with an interesting name. A Southern Rock band, Love Valley, represents Vince's grounding in classic rock, blues, and country.

When Vince found himself a resident of Brevard, fresh out of high school, he had not yet dabbled with playing music. He was just a typical teenager that listened to whatever was popular on the radio at the time. However, it was the southern rock songs that resonated with him. His dad played guitar and had bought him a bass so they could jam together. However, "playing bass by yourself gets boring pretty quick," says Vince. His dad traveled a lot, and while he was away at work, Vince stole over to his dad's guitar and started playing around with it. He then taught himself how to play. "If you just keep doing it, doing it, and doing it, you're bound to figure something out," says Vince. The first thing he ever played was "Stairway to Heaven" which

he says was stupid because it doesn't teach you anything, like chords, but yet as soon as he realized he made a recognizable sound he thought, "I just made music," and was hooked. "It blew my mind," says Vince.

He then scored a Led Zepplin DVD which he watched everyday for a year fascinated by a scene where Jimmy Page is playing "White Summer/Black Mountain Side." Vince said, "There's a part in the DVD where Jimmy is sitting in a chair with a spotlight on him in a stadium and everyone is quiet, and he's got the whole place in the palm of his hand, and I thought about just how wild that is, and I was inspired to throw myself into music. I don't have any allusions about being famous, I've never wanted that. I just want to create something that someone in the future may find interesting or inspirational."

Vince says, "Originals haven't been my thing. I'm "risk-adverse" and I'm not comfortable with writing music, but it is an area I'm beginning to focus on. When I'm singing on stage, I'm unaware of the words in the music, in my ear I don't hear individual words, I only hear a melody, so when I'm writing it's strange because it feels as if I'm writing two separate entities, I'm writing a song, but then secondly, I'm writing a story or poem."

Reflecting on ten years playing on stage with Love Valley, Vince recounts his favorite part is the brotherhood and the band's ability to evolve with the times and various members that make up the group. "One thing I don't want to hap-

pen is for me to ever become stagnant. I don't want music to feel like a job. It is my job, but I don't want it to feel like a job." He plays with various artists as his calendar permits. He says, "I enjoy mixing things up as much as I can, whether that's playing with various musicians or playing new music, I love that each night is its own journey that goes wherever the notes lead."

Vince, a free-spirited soul, says he struggles with commitments to routine. He fears falling into ruts and predictable patterns, being dull and uninspired. He hesitates to commit to consistently being anywhere on any certain day, filling up a predictable calendar of events. He recently quit a bowling league, as he couldn't stand having to be in the same place at the same time every Monday.

When asked "My favorite concert ever was Pink Floyd, the Division Bell Tour 1994, followed by every Grateful Dead Show I've ever attended, what was your favorite concert?" He responded, "Shut your face, I didn't get to see one GD show!" Laughing, I responded, "Well, I may be old, but I saw Jerry, and for that I'm eternally grateful." Vince continued, "I haven't attended many concerts. I wasn't focused on music in high school and since I've been playing gigs, I'm typically committed to playing out, so I'm not available during most concert nights. However, I am glad I got to see Joe Cocker, Charlie Daniels, and ZZ Top. I've also enjoyed Government Mule, and the trio band Aristocrats made up of Guthrie Govan on guitar, Bryan Beller on bass, and Marco Minnemann on drums, arguably the best guitarist, bassist, and drummer around. They blew my mind."

In spirit of Thanksgiving, I asked Vince about his favorite Thanksgiving food. He replied, "I'm a ham guy, not a turkey guy, and I love canned cranberry. I can sit and eat a whole can all by myself, the jelly stuff, not the real stuff, the "ridged for your pleasure" stuff, and yes, I get judged on this all the time. Thanksgiving day, for me, means an early start and set up at Jonathan's Pub to play for the annual Turkey Trot held in Cocoa Beach, followed by relaxing evening at home.

When asked what message he has for his fans, Vince replied, "I hope our fans understand how appreciative we are of the symbiotic relationship that occurs, on stage we feel the crowd's energy and when you're vibing with us, whether its sitting quietly nodding along to the notes, dancing, or singing along with the lyrics, we feel it and it positively influences our music."

Lagoon Loyal Movement Grows

Country Walk At Suntree Shows What's Possible!

The Lagoon Loyal program is building momentum across Brevard County, and neighborhoods are stepping up to protect the Indian River Lagoon in creative ways. An enhanced Lagoon Loyal website and program is launching soon, with new ways for both residents and businesses to get involved. The updated platform will feature improved tools to track progress and new rewards to celebrate everyday actions that make a difference for the health of the Indian River Lagoon.

One inspiring example is Country Walk at Suntree. In 2024, the 111-home community entered the Lagoon Loyal Neighborhood Competition and won a floating wetland for their stormwater pond. Resident Meghan Murphy describes it as both practical and inspiring: "We started this journey to reduce erosion and landscape costs, but discovered so many deeper benefits." And: "We now see turtles, wading birds, and dragonflies—and the water is so clear we can spot clams and fish."

The project builds on years of effort: native plantings, pond buffers, volunteer workdays, and collaboration with Brevard County, UF/IFAS, and Keep Brevard Beautiful. Their success has sparked interest from other HOAs looking to follow suit. Everyday actions for the Lagoon Storm drains connect our neighborhoods directly to the Lagoon. When it rains, pollutants like fertilizer, pet waste, and grass clippings wash into the water - untreated. The good news: small steps at home make a big difference.



In 2024, Country Walk won a Lagoon Loyal Neighborhood Competition prize—a floating wetland designed to naturally remove excess nutrients and improve pond health.

Here are five simple ways to help:

- Skip summer fertilizer. No fertilizer during the summer rainy season, June 1st thru September 30th. The rest of the year: 0% phosphorus and at least 50% slow-release nitrogen, only if needed.
- **Scoop the poop.** Pick up pet waste right away to stop bacteria and pollution from washing into the Lagoon.
- Leave the clippings. Blow or sweep grass clippings back onto your lawn so they act like a natural fertilizer instead of washing down storm drains, where it becomes harmful muck.
- Secure your trash. Keep bins covered; loose litter harms dolphins, manatees, and birds.
- Wash Lagoon-friendly. Use a commercial car wash where dirty wash water is treated, not sent into storm drains.

These everyday actions support seagrass recovery, protect wildlife, and help keep our waterways clear.

Murphy sums it up: "Our neighborhood has become a model for other communities on the Space Coast. If you're thinking about joining Lagoon Loyal, do it. Start small, ask questions,

and bring your neighbors along." Join Lagoon Loyal today at LagoonLoyal. com to receive updates on the launch of the new program and website. Share your feedback at LagoonLoyal.com/ Survey to help shape the enhancements and rewards coming soon.

- Floating wetlands soak up nitrogen and phosphorus, keeping algae-feeding nutrients out of the Lagoon.
- A native shoreline buffer replaces turf grass, creating habitat and filtering out chemicals, clippings, and soil.
- Cleaner water and healthier stormwater ponds.
- More turtles, fish, dragonflies, pollinators, and wading birds.
- Protects property values while protecting the Indian River Lagoon.

Wy Aunt Katie

Hush Puppies. If prepared and cooked correctly they are the food of the Gods. If not, they're just another piece of fried filler. We were at a local restaurant recently and I ordered hush puppies as a side and boy! They were terrific and brought back some sweet memories of good old southern meals I had as a younger person. So this time I'll reminisce about some great vittles that my aunt Katie whipped up when we visited her home in Live Oak.

Aunt Katie was in her seventies when I was a wee lad and I absolutely loved the food that woman cooked! I spent four or five summers at aunt Katie's helping her son Billy on his farm. He had beef cattle, corn fields and watermelon fields. and I was expected to do my part while there so... I harvested watermelons as I wasn't old enough to handle more dangerous chores. It was back breaking in the sweltering hot summer days but the meals that were prepared for us were incredible and worth the work that we put in.

Breakfast; The day always started off pretty much the same. There in the dining room the big table was literally covered with steaming hot platters and bowls of fresh oatmeal that came with gravy boats of fresh sweet cream and ice cold freshly sliced peaches to add to the delicious oats, Yum! To this day

that's the only way I'll eat oatmeal. In addition, there were platters of southern smoked ham and, boy, was that stuff salty! As a result I drank gallons of milk and orange juice while eating the stuff! Platters of fried eggs fresh out of the hen house, and fried potatoes with sauteed onions, pork chops, and a large bowl of scrambled eggs as well. There was always a big ol' pot of steaming coffee and hot tea, too. Dad and his family were of Welsh descent and aunt Katie only drank hot tea. There were freshly made hot biscuits with freshly churned butter from one of a few milk cows on the farm (Ice cream was churned as well). There were large fluffy pancakes with homemade fresh butter and syrup, toast and home canned jams and jellies, and although I've never been a fan of bread this stuff was fantastic as she made everything herself! Even the bread!

After the morning meal the menfolk and my scrawny self headed out to the fields to tend to the days chores. In the watermelon fields I walked on one side of a large flatbed trailer while another slightly older youth did the same on the opposite side. While a tractor pulled the trailer and moved slowly, we were required to pick the ripe melons and place them on it. Occasionally there would be critter encountered. You don't want to pick up a rattlesnake by accident so we were always keeping a sharp eye out. My cousin and his wife were staunch supporters of the Florida Boys Ranch and some of the youth were paid ranch hands as well. They were always seated at the table along with our families.

Dinner time. In the south dinner was at noon, supper was later in the early evening. Dinner consisted of a heaping platter fried chicken, bowl of sweet hush puppies, hot buttered corn on the cob, mashed potatoes, homegrown veggies such as butter beans, collard greens, squash, fried green tomatoes, and biscuits. For dessert there could be sweet potato pie, or banana pudding and any variety of cupcakes,

or cakes and pies! Oh, and did I mention the ice cream? It was always hand churned meaning ice, milk, cream, sugar, and fresh strawberries were placed in a small wooden barrel that had a series of blades in it with a hand crank atop.

Suppertime! After a hard days work all the ranch hands and helpers went through the ritual of washing up before entering the house (the washing ritual was also done before dinner) Outside the big wooden house we would line up and soap our hands, arms, and faces generously, then rinse off and towel dry.

Once seated at the table we were treated to a meal fit for kings! There would be golden brown roasted chickens, steaming hot roast beef, and some type of delectable pork roast that was so tender that it could be cut with your fork! The vegetables were always present in bowls and platters. Keep in mind that none of the food at aunt Katie's came in tin cans. It was all grown in her garden without the use of pesticides or any non organic substances. Her food was always incredible! There would be fried okra, collard or turnip greens. And although I've never had a taste for turnips, the greens when simmered with bacon, salt and pepper were a delight to eat. There was large bowls filled with sweet buttered carrots, snap peas, broccoli, and an assortment of freshly gathered vegetables along with hot buttered biscuits and breads.

I've neglected to mention one very important part of any meal at aunt Katie's home and that's prayer. We were always asked to pray prior to eating and to thank the lord for the food and our families and friends. As far as I am concerned that was, and still is a wonderful thing!

Aunt Katie is long gone. I am blessed to have the opportunity to write and preserve some great memories and stories of my youth and the folks that I worked and played with.

That's my Flori-Duh. Happy Thanksgiving y'all.













Movie Review

One Battle after Another

2025 · Comedy/Drama

Writer director Paul Thomas Anderson brings this dark political action, dramedy to the big screen. With films like "Boogie Nights", "Magnolia", "There will be blood", and "The Master" all critically acclaimed and Oscar nominated, I couldn't wait to see this film. Finally the powers to be made an original movie. I'm sick to death of remakes, prequels, sequels, franchises (past their expiration date) and super hero movies. It's long overdue. I really didn't know much about the movie, I knew that a father was looking for his missing daughter. But I knew the director and the cast. This film focuses on a radical revolutionary group, a white supremacist cabal, and the consequences of violence. With dark comedy and fantastic action sequences, I personally did not set out to see a political film with politics being in the forefront of absolutely everything right now (I find it exhausting). And at times the messages throughout seemed heavy-handed and the pace uneven. I'm wondering if people aren't seeing this film in bigger numbers because they want a break from politics? It needs 300 million to break even, and it only just crossed 100 million globally.

Regardless, the standout performances, cinematography and energetic direction will make this film a strong Oscar favorite. Please keep going to the theater!
