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

hen The Crazy Carls take the stage on Saturday, April 27th, at 9 pm on the big stage (east of the railroad tracks), it is party time. They are Florida's hottest band, redefining dance and party music with raw guitar and tight vocals. Alex Baugh is the band's singer and guitarist, and Alex gets the party going with high octane performances that get everyone on their dancing feet.

Established in 2008, Alex Baugh, a college student wanted to start taking

his passion for music to the next level. As an avid guitar player and versatile singer he needed a bassist. Teaming up with Carl Crumbliss, the two began playing shows in the University of Central Florida area. With a variety of influences including rock, pop, hip hop and funk, not before long, The Crazy Carls would begin playing shows all over the southeast with many acts including The Dirty Heads and Stephen Marley.

The talent of this band is undeniable

with a great range in their musicianship and songwriting. Alex Baugh calls land-locked Orlando home, but having grown up in Miami, and being rooted in Florida's Surf Culture, he's a favorite on the beachside.

MAF - A Melbourne Tradition

Livery year MAF's longtime volunteer Mark Vanstrum gives us a friendly pat on the back after the magazine comes out and remarks: "Very nice article, but I like to mention that there is an art show connected to all this great music!" And what an art show it is with top of the line fine art presented by over 250 artists! Every year this production takes many hours of volunteer effort to make it happen. The entire committee is driven by pure community spirit, friendships and support. They are always looking for volunteers, and when you join them, you'll find out that you couldn't meet a nicer group of people that carry on a now 29 year old Melbourne Tradition.

It all starts with a **5K run** which has not much to do with art but has become so popular that it attracts over 1,500 runners. It starts at 7:30 am on Saturday morning from Crane Creek and leads over the causeway and back. This is the only event within the festival with a price tag. \$25 in advance, \$30 after April 19th.

Several free **Art Workshop**s will be offered during the Melbourne Art Festival and are open to children ages 6-13. Artists that are participating in the show will teach these workshops. Class size is limited to 20 and registration is required prior to the starting time at the Art Workshop tent.

KidsWorld encourages and inspires young and old alike and is dedicated for families with children from 3 to 12. This arts and crafts center is located on the corner of New Haven and Waverly Place and is open from 10 am to 5 pm. Come prepared to explore fascinating, hands-on demonstrations, arts & crafts, experiments, and performances.

The MAF is providing **free shuttle transportation** to the festival to help alleviate traffic and parking congestion in the downtown area. Service starts at 8 am both Saturday and Sunday, with final buses departing the festival at 6 pm on Saturday and 6 pm on Sunday. The buses will run continuously. Service from Sears Plaza (Melbourne): 1050 S. Babcock St., and Indialantic Shopping Center (Indialantic): 710-890 North A1A. Festival bus stop is on New Haven Ave. at the corner of Livingston Street.

The **food court** features a variety of vendors. You will find all your favorite comfort foods from cotton candy to sausage, gyros, oriental flavors and much more..

Over 250 artist tents will line New Haven Avenue and the side streets of downtown Melbourne from the post office to the railroad tracks. Artist booths open each day at 9 am and close at 5 pm. The festival site then continues east of the tracks with a stage placed on New Haven backed up to US1. Vehicular traffic is blocked during the festival weekend.







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

THE SMASHING PUMPKINS


The Smashing Pumpkins were one of the most commercially successful and critically acclaimed bands of the 1990s having sold more than 30 million albums, and won multiple Grammy awards in the process. Formed in Chicago in 1988, they released *Gish*, their influential and platinum debut in 1991, which was followed by albums including the nine-time platinum *Mellon Collie And The Infinite Sadness* and the four-time platinum *Siamese Dream*, as well as the platinum certified 1998 album *Adore*.

Formed by frontman Billy Corgan (lead vocals, lead guitar) and James Iha (rhythm guitar), the band has included Jimmy Chamberlin (drums), D'arcy Wretzky (bass guitar), Melissa Auf der Maur (bass guitar), and currently includes Mike Byrne (drums), Nicole Fiorentino (bass guitar, backing vocals), and Jeff Schroeder (rhythm guitar).

Disavowing the punk rock roots of many of their alt-rock contemporaries, the Pumpkins have a diverse, densely layered, and guitar-heavy sound, containing elements of gothic rock, heavy metal, dream pop, psychedelic rock, progressive rock, and, in later recordings, electronica. Billy Corgan (lead vocals, lead guitar) is the group's primary songwriter. His musical ambitions and cathartic lyrics have shaped the band's albums and songs.

The group built its audience with extensive touring. The constant traveling lead to internal fighting, drug use, and when record sales stareted to diminish the band broke up in 2000.

The Pumpkins returned in 2007 with their acclaimed sixth album *Zeitgeist* and they have since remained on the cutting edge of music and technology with various online releases. *Oceania* is their 7th studio album and the band is supporting it with a global tour that started in 2012.



GARY ALLAN - SET YOU FREE TOUR

66 very Storm (Runs Out Of Rain)" is country singer LGary Allan's latest hit single claiming the #1 position on the Billboard Hot Country Singles Chart. Gary Allan is back on tour with a new album out called Set You *Free.* his first album since 2010 and the 10th of his career. Signed to Decca Records in 1996, Allan made his debut on the United States country music scene with the release of his single "Her Man", the lead-off to his gold-certified debut album Used Heart for Sale, which was released in 1996 on Decca Records. A second album, It Would Be You, followed in 1998. Allan's third album, Smoke Rings in the Dark, was his first album for MCA Nashville (to which he has been signed ever since) and the first platinum album of his career. Its successors, Alright Guy (2001) and See If I Care (2003), were all certified platinum as well, while 2005's *Tough All Over* and 2007's Greatest Hits were both certified gold. A seventh studio album, Living Hard, was released later in 2007. A single called "Today" was released on June 12, 2009. It served as the lead-off single to Allan's studio album, Get Off on the Pain, which was released on March 9, 2010.

Allan honed his individual style listening to the honky-tonk musicians that inspired him – Willie Nelson, Buck Owens and Merle Haggard to name a few.

BIKES OF DAYS GONE BY

On Saturday, April 13th, the streets of Historic Downtown Melbourne will be taken over by antique motorcycles for the annual "Bikes Of Days Gone By." Show hours will be from 4 to 7pm. While part of downtown will be closed off to traffic, vintage motorcycles of all makes and models from 1978 or earlier will line both sides of New Haven Avenue. Show sponsors Matt's Casbah, Sinclair Law and ArtLab T-Shirts and Graphics guarantee that this will be a great event for motorcycle enthusiasts. View the old bikes while listening to live music, popular biker-DJ Doc Holliday will be there too.

Bikes of Days Gone By is the vision of local antique motorcycle collector Jim Kuhman. "For well over 30 years I have had a love burning in my soul for vintage motorcycles. Being a member of the Antique Motorcycle Club of America and the Sunshine Chapter of Florida, I realized that there were very few antique motorcycle events in Florida. Yes, Florida has bike week and Biktoberfest but as we all know these events attract riders of all genres."

Many cities across America have been rejuvenating their historic areas and welcoming specialty shops, restaurants and bars. Melbourne has followed the trend and has a bustling downtown. Kuhman envisioned this area as an ideal backdrop for a vintage motorcycle show. So when his friend Matt Nugnes bought Pop's Casbah and created Matt's Casbah, the idea began to take shape. Kuhman: "Matt was searching for a unique event to bring to downtown. One day I suggested he should consider having an annual event, an Antique Motorcycle show! An experience for people from all walks of life, the guy whose neighbor down the street had that cool Indian, the guy from the 60s who remembers the Sears, Montgomery Wards and Hondas of that era." It had to be more than just a biker function. They began brain storming and Jim reached out to his good friends Walt and Rose Smith of the New England Eatery in Melbourne Shores. They started building guidelines and began with the planing of a new event.

This year marks the third time that Bikes Of Days Gone By will make a come-back to Downtown Melbourne. Each registered participant to the show will receive the official Bikes of Days Gone By T-shirt designed by ArtLab T-Shirts and Graphics in Palm Bay. These Tees will also be for sale soon via the internet and at the day of the show.



It was the summer of 1979, when his multi-million-selling "Year of the Cat" and "Time Passages" were staples of FM radio, and he was touring with saxes, synths, singers, and all the accourtements pop stardom brings.

Al Stewart came to stardom as part of the British folk revival in the 1960s and 1970s, and developed his own unique style of combining folk-rock songs with delicately woven tales of characters and events from history. Though *Year of the Cat* and its 1978 platinum follow-up *Time Passages* brought Stewart his biggest worldwide commercial successes, earlier albums such as *Past, Present and Future* from 1973 are often seen as better examples of his intimate brand of historical folk-rock - a style to which he has returned in recent albums.

Stewart was a key figure in a fertile era in British music and he appears throughout the musical folklore of the age. He played at the first ever Glastonbury Festival in 1970, knew Yoko Ono before she met John Lennon, shared a London apartment with a young Paul Simon, and hosted at the legendary *Les Cousins* folk club in London in the 1960s. Stewart has released sixteen studio and three live albums since his debut album *Bedsitter Images* in 1967, and continues to tour extensively around the US and Canada, Europe and the UK.

He has worked with Peter White, Alan Parsons, Jimmy Page, Richard Thompson, Rick Wakeman, Tori Amos and Tim Renwick and recently has played with Dave Nachmanoff and former Wings lead-guitarist Laurence Juber.

CHRIS BOTTI

Since the release in 2004 of his critically acclaimed CD, When I Fall In Love, Botti has become America's largest-selling jazz instrumental artist. His success has crossed over to audiences usually reserved for pop music and his ongoing association with PBS has led to four number one jazz albums, as well as multiple gold and platinum records, and Grammy awards.

He was born in Portland, Oregon and raised in Corvallis and spent two years of his childhood growing up in Italy. His earliest musical influence was his mother, a classically trained pianist and part-time piano teacher.

Botti started playing the trumpet at nine years old, and committed to the instrument at age 12 when he heard Miles Davis play "My Funny Valentine." In 1983, he was selected as a member of McDonalds' *All American High School Jazz band* which marked his first Carnegie Hall performance.

Over the past three decades, he has recorded and performed with the best in music including Frank Sinatra, Sting, Josh Groban, Michael Buble, Paul Simon, Joni Mitchell, John Mayer, Andrea Bocelli, Joshua Bell and Aerosmith's Steven Tyler. Hitting the road for 250-plus days per year, Botti and his band have performed with many of the finest symphonies and at some of the world's most prestigious venues, including performances at the *World Series* and *Nobel Peace Prize* ceremony. *People Magazine* named him one of the *50 Most Beautiful People* in 2004.

BOZ SCAGGS


Grammy-Award winning rock legend Boz Scaggs is both a musical seeker and a man of sizable talent as a singer, songwriter and guitarist. With respect for a wide spectrum of American roots music, Boz Scaggs has combined rock, jazz, R&B and blues to create a trademark sound producing a lasting work and a career that has brought with it acclaim, a loyal following, and an enduring respect among musicians. Scaggs showcases both original songs and choice covers in his newly released album, *Memphis*.

After learning guitar at the age of 12, he met Steve Miller at St. Mark's School (Texas). In 1959, he became the vocalist for Miller's band, the Marksmen. The pair later attended the University of Wisconsin-Madison together, playing in blues bands like the Ardells and the Fabulous Knight Trains. Leaving school, Scaggs briefly joined the rhythm and blues scene in London. Returning to the US, Scaggs promptly headed for the booming psychedelic music center of San Francisco in 1967. Linking up with Steve Miller again, he appeared on the Steve Miller Band's first two albums, Children of the Future and Sailor. In 1976, he recorded Silk Degrees. The album reached #2 on the US Billboard 200. and #1 in a number of countries across the world.





The "Internet Café"

It was a long, long time ago in another era. A period of time when I was 30 pounds lighter, had much more hair, still had some brain cells left, and built my own computers. That was in the Eighties. RAM was \$100 a meg, 16 color graphics were the latest innovation, and the internet was accessed through a phone wire at agonizingly slow speed. Back then we dreamed of ubiquitous wireless internet access where we could go anywhere and connect to the internet on a quick reliable connection, on a device with a high definition screen. What a crazy idea, huh?

Fast forward to the current "Age of Aquarius." That wild and crazy idea seems to have almost come to fruition. So it's not too surprising to see "internet cafés" popping up on every street corner and strip mall. I went to do my laundry at a laundromat that had one of these establishments next door. "Cool!," I thought, "While my stuff is in the dryer I'll go next door and get a croissant and a latte whilst I peruse the internet at blazing speed on my hi-def tablet!" I hastily threw my stuff in the dryer and headed to the café. I opened the door and walked into a room filled with what looked like electronic slot machines! WTF?!?! I walked up to the counter and asked politely, "May I have a croissant and a latte, please?" Bewildered, the elderly attendant raised her head. "I'm sorry sir, we don't have that here. Would you like to buy a card?" "Well I guess if I could wash it down with a latte...." "Sir!", she interrupted, "we do not serve latte! Would you like to buy a card?!" Since I didn't know anybody whose birthday it was and it wasn't my anniversary or anything, I declined. I asked if I could just hang out and surf the internet at blazing speeds while I waited for my laundry. I could see the attendant was getting perturbed. Her voice sounded as if she had too many Lucky Strikes the night before. "Either buy a card or get out!", she bellowed. Thus ends my first foray into the seedy world of the "internet café."

What an internet café has come to be, these days, is actually a place where you go purchase a card, put it into one of these "electronic slot machines," play one of the various "sweepstakes" games, then go return you card to collect your winnings. In the state of Florida, the legal-

ity of these establishments is being vehemently debated. This week, the plot thickened.

Allied Veterans of the World is a non-profit organization. Starting in 1979, they ran bingo games and held bake sales to raise money for veterans. Now, they have almost 60 of these "internet cafes" around the state. From 2007-20012, the company made about \$290 million! Of that, about \$6 million went to Jacksonville attorney Kelly Mathis, who was running the operation. A vast majority of the money also went to non-profit organizations, individuals who operated Allied Veterans, and of course, lobbying efforts. International Internet Technologies, an Oklahoma company who supplied the software to the cafes, is also involved. Allied Veterans gave at least \$490,000 to various political campaigns and International Internet Technologies paid \$1.2 million to lobbying groups.

As of March 13, 2013, all of the lobbyists involved have resigned. Florida Lt. Gov. Jennifer Carroll has also resigned after being questioned by investigators. Carroll co-owns a public relations firm that worked for *Allied Veterans*. Although she has not been charged with anything yet, she says she resigned so that her "ties to the organization would not be a distraction for Republican Gov. Rick Scott's administration." (Don't even get me started on why HE should be in jail!). Rick says all the money that was "donated" through this organization should be given back. Really!?!? To who?!? Why don't you take all those millions and actually help the veterans who were actually supposed to be the beneficiaries in the first place?!

As for me, I've learned my lesson. I'll hang at my usual jaunt. I walk into the *Sun Shop* downtown. "May I have croissant and a latte?", "Sure, Chuck," is the friendly reply. I surf the web at blazing speeds on my high def tablet. "That'll be \$7.80". I'll put it on my card.

EXPOSE YOURSELF

Over the last four months we've tried to cover various means of getting an artist's or band's name out there in order to gain notoriety and hopefully, gigs. It should be fairly obvious to those of you that are more experienced that this column was not intended for the seasoned professionals. We've had a few laughs with some of you concerning that.

We've also heard from some artists that have been around for some length of time that had no idea what a press pack was. Lissa is an expert at building an impressive press pack and is a present developing a couple of them for some folks. The goal of 'Expose Yourself' was to help up and coming young artists get a handle on the publicity game. If this four part series has helped in any way, then we did what we set out to do. At the bottom of our columns it states that we're "shameless self promoters" and that's the absolute truth. As such, we stay busy. Very busy. Neither of us works "day jobs" any longer, and somehow manage to keep our bills paid along with the ability to enjoy a reasonably stress free existence while doing what we enjoy.

As we are writing this final installment, we realize that there are a couple more things that bands and artists can do to increase their fan base. Table tents at the show location. For a reasonable price one can have these printed. They are basically a small questionnaire that will aid in getting information to you, and out to your new fans. Ask for Email addresses and first names. Last names should be optional, you may also ask for phone numbers and mailing addresses, but be sure to let them know that the personal data is an option and not necessary. Be sure and have someone collect the table tents after the show so that the data can be placed in your electronic files. Mass Emails can be sent out prior to upcoming shows. Utilize everything at your disposal. Merchandise. Tee shirts, baseball caps, and rubber wristlets can be designed and purchased at many printing companies at low cost and sold reasonably. Stickers, bumper stickers and posters are also an option. People love them and the cost of printing is at an all time low. Remember to shop around for the best price. Every once in a while, throw some merchandise from the stage, a couple of Tee shirts and stickers will do. Oftentimes, a person that didn't get the desired freebie will purchase one. But remember... Keep the prices reasonable. You don't want to price your product so high that people can't afford it and always remember that it's basically them advertising your act.

One final thought on keeping and building a fan base: Word of mouth! Always has been and still is the best form of free advertising available. Treat people well, be nice to them. Shake their hands and smile sincerely. Try to remember names and thank them for coming to the show. It's a well known fact in many industries that when someone does something good, people tell an average of four other people about it. When someone does something bad, the number of people told rises exponentially. So, remain upbeat, work hard at perfecting your product and get out here and expose yourself! We want to thank for allowing us to do this series and hope that you will continue reading *Brevard Live*.



SUPER BIKES

Motorcycles were originally invented in Germany in the 1800s and now are modern stylish machines of transportation. Motorcycles are engine propelled vehicles similar to bicycles with their two or three wheel design and front wheel steering. The first motorcycle, called the Petroleum Reitwagen, was powered by petroleum and lacked a useful steering mechanism. Today, there are over 200 million motorcycles worldwide which have been designed for various tasks, such as riding on road and off road.

One local motorcycle shop, Brevard Super Bike, has been supplying our area with the latest and greatest motorcycles for the past four years at "your performance edge." Brevard Super Bike also sells all of the essential motorcycle equipment including helmets, tires, gears, and much more. Todd Keesee, the owner, compares his business to the popular show Pawn Stars because much like the show, his business is family run.

Keesee explains that the greatest time of year for his shop is also the greatest time to ride, the Spring.

Todd Keesee, is very fond of motorcycles. Keesee particularly enjoys

riding motorcycles with "more speed and more horse power." Keesee rides on the street but also enjoys participating in the races along the east coast. He enjoys racing with bikes ranging from Kawasakis to Harley Davidsons.

"[Riding a motorcycle] almost feels like flying," says Keesee.

Keesee originally started riding motorcycles at age 10, when his father, also a motorcyclist, bought him his first motorcycle. Keesee now has three sons who have all been riding motorcycles since age four.

"I like working with motorcycles and being associated with the people who also enjoy motorcycles," says Keesee.

Another passionate motorcycle rider, Dave Duthie, enjoys the serenity he feels when riding a motorcycle. "Riding a motorcycle clears your head and you really can't think of anything else," says Duthie. Duthie originally started riding at about the age of 12 and has ridden everything from "minibikes to motorcycles." Duthie currently rides a KTM motorcycle with a 200 cc, two stroke engine.

Duthie prefers riding off road because there is no one else on the road and that minimizes the chances of getting hurt. "Trees never jump out in



front of me," says Duthie.

Duthie recently participated in a 70 mile race called, "Straight Arrow Enduro." During this race he suffered multiple broken ribs in a crash, which resulted from his bike losing control in a mud pit. Although injured, Duthie was still able to finish second place in the over 50 age group. Duthie describes this as a "good and bad day."

One event that occurs in our area every year in March, is "Bike Week." This event lasts 10 days and is surrounded by festivities and concerts. This event is considered one of the most popular motorcycle rallies in the United States, with several hundred thousand attendees.

A TASTE OF SPACE COAST CULINARY HISTORY

Baja Tavern and Eats is located at one of Brevard's busiest tourist spots - Port Canaveral. Despite that, it remains one of the Space Coast's popular dining destinations where locals meet, eat and enjoy the spectacular view. That's because it is owned and managed by the Kolsch Brothers, Norm (photo), Hank and Gene who have been proprietors of several successful local restaurants since the mid-80s. Baja is more than good food and a view. It's a taste of Space Coast culinary history.

The port itself is quite an attraction. You can sit right over the water watching the huge cruise ships and the smaller fishing boats. Baja Tavern is open and airy with vinyl enclosures in case it gets cold and breezy. There's a large dining room and a huge bar, nothing fancy but a lot of personality. The menu offers a selection of seafood dishes, steaks, lobster, oysters, just everything the Space Coast is known for. "These are all favorite recipes that we have collected throughout 30 years of hospitality business," says Norm.

Baja's clam chowder has won 17 awards. This dish has been most popular since the Kolsch Brothers have operated another popular restaurant called Chowders. Another favorite is the Lobster Dip, you have to be careful not to fill up before the meal arrives. The oysters are huge. "We buy one size up from anyone else," explains Norm. No kidding,

these were the biggest oysters I have seen in a while!

We order the Mahi-Mahi Casino and the Garlic Steak. The portions are plentiful, more than we can eat. The Mahi chunks are thick and fresh, smothered with bell peppers, onion and bacon. The dish is served with rice, black beans and plantains along with a coleslaw that definitely deserves an award, too. I usually don't like coleslaw but this was very tasty. The garlic steak was cooked just right, loaded with garlic and served with tender green beens and red potatoes.

The prices are reasonable. "Priced for locals," explains Norm. Baja Tavern also features live music on weekends and will sponsor this year's Brevard Live Music Awards. Great place, great people!



New Record Store In Downtown Melbourne

VINYL MAKES COMEBACK!

Saturday, April 20th, is *Record Store Day!* And yes—we're talking 2013, this month! If you think that individual record stores are a thing of the past ever since *Best Buy* and *i-tunes*, you're in for a surprise. What started as an internet business for collectors is now a thriving record store in Downtown Melbourne. And here's another surprise: the store is filled with vinyl records. Not just old collectors items but brand new releases as well. "Vinyl is making a comeback," says Chris Lanza, proud owner of *Vinyl Request Records*. "And so do the individual music stores." His store has been chosen to participate in "Record Store Day," the nationwide celebration of music with special limited releases, many on vinyl, that will only be available in individual stores.

A Saturday morning at *Vinyl Request Records* reveals another surprise: no ancient rock album junkies, the clientèle is rather young. 20-year-old Caylee shows up and looks through the stacks of albums outside the store. Then Will (24) walks in. I ask him if he's a musician? "No," he says, "I'm a mechanic and I love music." He tells me that he listens to the Beatles, Steely Dan, Led Zeppelin, all vinyls that he plays on his turntable. Will has a nice collection at home, albums he got from his mother. Now he's looking for more. Another young man enters the store with 4 albums that he might want to sell. Chris offers him \$100, the customer considers, a little more music talk, and then he decides to keep his records. The atmosphere is friendly and the customers are cool. They all know that they share one compassion - the love for vinyl albums. "There's just something special about owning a record, taking care of it and listening to it on a turntable," explains Chris. "CDs have a tendency to become background noise."


Chris Lanza fell in love with music when he was 18 years old listening to the Beatles for the first time. "It blew my mind." Then he discovered other bands and music became his lifelong passion. About five years ago he started dealing in vinyl. First out of his father's garage, who is also his partner, then the inventory was moved to a storage unit, then they needed two units and past October Vinyl Request Records opened a store in Downtown Melbourne.

Beginning 2013 his business started to boom. "All the high school kids were coming in. It seemed as if everyone got a turntable for Christmas," he laughs.

Little Reggies Sweet 16

The year is 1997. Local music enthusiast Josh Benfield starts his own concert promotion company called Little Reggies Productions. Named after the dog in the movie Armageddon, he wanted kids to have a place of their own to go to shows. Churches instead of bars. Rec centers instead of wrecked centers where you could get into trouble. One place, the Jaycees club located on Post Road in Melbourne, became their mainstay for over a decade. I was living down the street and will always marvel at the crowds that would show up. Their mantra was clear: don't bring your drama inside. No drugs, no alcohol, no problems. As the crowds grew, so did the schedule. "We have a copy of a show schedule from 2005", quips current leader Zachary Davis, a volunteer who had just started that year. "We had 30 shows in one month." Although the heyday maybe over, the need for an organized scene has never been greater.

"It filled a much needed void in everyone's life at the time. It brought exciting shows and activities to the area," remembers Cameron Brintle. "A classic example of 'build it and they will come'." Brintle, a member of local legends Boys Go To War and currently of the United Divided and Trash City Rockers, grew up and participated in Little Reggies' prime. "Little Reggies started as an after school activities group led and organized by Josh and his church the Tabernacle on Aurora Road." Benfield has since "taken a step back," according to Davis. "He's still available if I have a question or I need his help with something." Working his way up from the office intern at age 14, Davis now shares responsibilities for the group with a handful of volunteers. Gone is the Little Reggies' office space, replaced with social media sites and good old fashioned word of mouth.

Davis, now 22, shares Benfield's vision of creating a safe haven for the Brevard youth. "When you went to a Little Reggie show, you knew you were going to stay out of trouble for those four hours. You weren't doing drugs, no fighting...no teen pregnancy," (laughs). Davis admits that things have slowed down considerably in the last 4 to 5 years for the group. The loss of the Jaycees location had an impact on the show schedule as well. "We renovated that space a couple of times; built a stage, replaced the a/c unit." Although he wishes not to comment on the de-



tails, he does admit that the group is done with the space for the foreseeable future. "We had to find new places to hold shows."

New venues include some of the same ones Benfield seemed to be rebelling against. Rock clubs in Coca and Melbourne. Open Mike's inside Florida Discount Music. It's a new time for the group for sure. One event remains; Loganfest. Named after current volunteer/sound man Logan Rivera, the fourth installment of the festival was held earlier this year in Melbourne. Boasting over 20 bands, attendance wasn't like in had been. "We had fun", remembers Rivera a few weeks after the event. He doesn't seem to mind the difference in venues, commenting "new faces, different places." Davis is commended by the bar owner for his chivalry. "They are great! They even care enough to stop and help clean up when it is needed. I was outside picking up cigarette butts when Zach got out of his car just to help me. They always take care of us and I love working with them."

Members like Davis and Rivera are keeping alive a movement that continues well after the teens that helped before grew up and moved away. *Loganfest*, named after Rivera because of the number of bands he's played with on the same show, is a reminder of the multi band shows that used to be common events. **Best Supporting Actor** once played at the Jaycees as part of their new talent showcase. After explaining to someone over the phone that I worked til 5 pm and couldn't come before then, they delayed our 2 pm start time. To 2:30pm. When we arrived, it was quite apparent that we were the oldest band on the show. I think that inspired us more and we got a lot of high fives after our sweat soaked set ended. I remember being really impressed

with the diversity of the bands and the eagerness to come inside to watch each band's set.

Rivera, currently in the band **Gillian Carter**, has a busy year ahead of him. Starting himself with Little Reggies in 2003 at the ripe age of 15, he excels in what Davis calls "his creative DIY counterculture." The band is about to release a CD both here in the states as well as in the United Kingdom. He briefly struggles to remember all the details of their two week tour in California, followed by a more extensive run of the Northeast. He proudly boasts of the 10 inch vinyl aspect of the release, taking me back to my heyday. I am almost twice his age but we share the same respect for the music and the lifestyle. Davis proudly recalls his start on the group's Facebook page; "I really admired the family values and the friendship. I feel that at the end of the day, what we are doing is a good thing."

As that next day approaches so to speak, what is the future of Little Reggies? "We've been holding shows in New Smyrna, there's a lot of great kids in that area", says Davis. "I see a lot of brothers and sisters of the people I grew up with coming to shows as well. As long as the bands are here and there are people who want to see them, we'll keep doing what we're doing." When asked about how promoting shows at bars differs from the past shows, Davis gives a well thought out response. "I'm not going to hand out flyers at a high school for one of our upcoming shows at a bar. I'll go to the mall and hand them out to everybody. If we're doing a show at a rec center then it's different. Kids are less likely to go to shows as often as they used to. They have access to the internet and IPODS to listen to music." It may be a new day for music, but the idea of Little Reggies continues on.
