





## LIL ED & THE BLUES IMPERIALS

Lil Ed & The Blues Imperials are not new-comers to our area. Since their introduction to the Blues world by *Alligator Records*, they have toured regularly introducing their new releases since the late 80s/ early 90s. This concert, produced by *Brevard Music Group*, is presented on the stage of Cadillac Cove. Ticket prices start at \$20 and are available at www.BMGConcerts.com.

In Chicago, a city overflowing with unrivaled blues talent, world-renowned Lil' Ed & The Blues Imperials have been standing tall for almost 30 years. The band's big sound, fueled by Lil' Ed's gloriously rollicking slide work and deep blues string bending, along with his rough-edged, soulful vocals, is as real and hard-hitting as Chicago blues gets. The Chicago Sun-Times says, "Lil' Ed & The Blues Imperials are the hottest purveyors of bottleneck boogie to come out of Chicago since Hound Dog Taylor."

Lil' Ed Williams comes to the blues naturally. His uncle, Chicago slide guitar king and master songwriter J.B. Hutto, taught him how to feel, not just play the blues. Nine albums and thousands of performances later, Lil' Ed is now universally hailed as a giant of the genre. Lil' Ed and The Blues Imperials - bassist (and Ed's half-brother) James "Pookie" Young, guitarist Mike Garrett and drummer Kelly Littleton - have remained together for nearly 30 years (an extraordinary feat for any group), the band fueling Ed's songs with their rock-solid, road-tested, telepathic musicianship.

The Big Sound Of Lil' Ed & The Blues Imperials is the musically electrifying, emotionally intense and downright fun new album from the band Guitar Player calls "a snarling boogie-blues machine...they blow down the walls." The CD features Lil' Ed's incendiary playing and playful, passionate singing, with the ragged-but-right Blues Imperials cooking like mad alongside him. Produced by Williams and Alligator president Bruce Iglauer, it is a tour-de-force of authentic, deeply rooted Chicago blues. Williams wrote or co-wrote all but two of album's 14 songs, the other gems written by Uncle J.B. The Chicago Reader says the band's music "is a soundtrack for dancing and celebration infused with a sense of hard-won survival.

Williams attacks his lyrics like he attacks his guitar: with bare-bones intensity that makes each word sound like a matter of life or death."

Born in Chicago on April 8, 1955, in the heart of Chicago's tough West Side, Ed grew up surrounded by music. He was playing guitar, then drums and bass, by the time he was 12. Ed and Pookie received lessons and support from their famous uncle. "J.B. taught me everything I know," says Ed. "I wouldn't be where I am today without him." Ed and Pookie spent their teen years making music together, and in 1975 formed the first incarnation of The Blues Imperials. Over the next few years, the group played every club in the neighborhood. Even so, they still needed day jobs to pay the bills. Ed worked ten hours a day as a buffer at the Red Carpet Car Wash. Pookie drove a school bus. Night after night they played their roaring brand of blues in tiny clubs, and eventually the word reached Alligator president Bruce Iglauer. He invited the band into his recording studio which resulted in the band's debut album, Roughhousin', released in September of 1986.

Lil' Ed & The Blues Imperials released eight *Alligator* albums between 1986 and 2012. With each one, the band's national and international stature grew as their fan base - known internationally as "Ed Heads" - continued to expand. With 2006's *Rattleshake*, Ed and company reached a whole new audience. Die-hard "Ed Head" Conan O'Brien brought the band before millions of television viewers on two separate occasions. Success and accolades never stop pouring in.

The group took home the *Living Blues Award* for Best Live Performer in 2011, 2012 and 2013. They won the prestigious *Blues Music Award* for Band Of The Year in both 2007 and 2009. Meanwhile, their fiery music has more than stood the test of time. "We're not band members," says Williams, "we're family, and families stay together."



## RUCKUS

O what's all this Ruckus I hear about? Well, really it sort of started with Mayhem, a five piece band back in 2014 and after a member left they continued as a four piece until around 2017 when the singer left. The remaining members continued jamming with friends, and then Jeff came in (he was from the Long Island circuit) and they started to get some bookings and the joke went .... bring on the Ruckus! The band plays a good amount of alt rock of Foo Fighters, Alice in Chains, Blink 182, and Everlong but you'll also find them doing some reggae styled music.

Patrick Livezey handles the drums and percussion. Patrick's musical tastes are widely diverse and therefore add a musical medley of multi-style infusion into his drumming technique giving Ruckus a unique rockin' flavor. Originally from Philadelphia, Patrick has been in the Melbourne area since 1985 where he attended Florida Institute of Technology and works as a Senior Mechanical Engineer for the Defense Industry. Some of Patrick's favorite bands are Rage against the Machine, Tool, Red Rot Chili Peppers, Led Zeppelin, Lettuce, Dumpstafunk, and Here come the Mummies. Although he was raised on Buddy Rich, John Bonham, and Neil Peart, he is heavily influenced by drummers with heavy grooves and funky beats like Danny Carey, Chad Smith, and Adam Deitch. One of his highlights in his life is when he got to meet one of his idols Buddy Rich shortly before the legend past away. Patrick has played in many different local original and cover bands over the years. He broke into the Orlando scene with Sinnkawn and Beemo, playing the larger venues like Hard Rock, House of Blues, and the Social to name a view. In Sinnkwan he shared the stage with local legend Dave Pastorius for a hot minute before Dave went on to the Nature Kids. Patrick also toured and recorded with Nashville recording artist Linda Nunez opening up for Sarah McLachlan and Pat Travers. After leaving Linda Nunez he became a founding member of Brother Bean. Brother Bean toured up and down the east coast and became a fixture in the festival circuit being on the same bill as Disco Biscuits, Lettuce, String Cheese Incident, and New Master Sounds to name a few. Another great memory was when Brother Bean was one of the finalists of the 2015 Brevard Live's Original Music Series where they went up against General Eyes with a young Jake Salter (Tru Phonic) on guitar. In 2014 Patrick joined local cover band Mayhem with John Ashley (Buck 32) and Mac Atha. After Mayhem disbanded, he found himself wanting to do more of a original funk style



and became a sub fill in percussionist for Funkle Fester out of Satellite/Cocoa beach. After Funkle Fester disbanded, Flomotion was born. Flomotion is a 8 piece original instrumental funk band with a well knit family of great people and scratches that original music itch and is currently playing in the Brevard Area. Along with throwing some pretty good parties, Patrick brings decades of Stage, Studio, and Touring experience to the musical juggernaut that is Ruckus.

Dr. Jeff MonteLeon, lead vocalist and a local Chiropractor here in South Brevard for the past 22 years, has had extensive experience as a professional performing musician and a front man for the past 37 years. Originally from NY, he toured the North East for 10 years with several acts such as The Keep, Head First, Star 69 and Scream. Among his many vocal coaches, he had the privilege of studying with a Don Lawrence protégé and 80's Heavy Metal powerhouse Tony Harnell of TNT. In the late 90's, Dr. Jeff moved to Atlanta to pursue his Chiropractic studies and simultaneously embedded himself in the local Atlanta music scene. One of his fondest musical memories during his time in Atlanta included getting to perform and play with one his favorite musical influences "Better than Ezra". His journey led him here to Brevard, where he and his wife have been taking care of the community in their Palm Bay location, LifeForce Chiropractic. After many years of musical inactivity while building their practice, Dr Jeff came across one of the founding members of Ruckus, guitarist John Ashley, who has left the group since. They were forming a project focusing on Alternative Hard Rock of the 90's and 2000's, as well as party rock favorites, just what he was looking for. One of the things Dr. Jeff loves about playing with Ruckus is the times

when the energy of the crowd clicks with the energy he and his band mates are delivering from the stage.

JT plays guitars. Originally from the Jersey shore, he started playing guitar around age 15. He grew up with guitar players in the family and took many of their influences starting with his father's influences of Led Zeppelin, Cream, Mountain, Grand Funk Railroad... and his uncle's influences of AC/DC, Black Sabbath, Judas Priest, etc. After living in Texas for a few years, he fell into the world of Stevie Ray Vaughan. He commented, "Joining Ruckus got my head out of the 60's/70's/80's rut and opened my mind to the more modern alternative music scene. Being on stage with these guys is the ultimate high. Not only are they professional focused musicians, we all get along." To pay the bills JT works for Microsoft as a software engineer. He added, "Being on stage is a great way of balancing out sitting behind a computer for 10+ hours a day. I am also a registered yoga teacher to create the perfect ying and yang."

Rob Tatum did not grow up in a musical family and as a kid didn't even know that one of the guitar players in each of his favorite bands was actually playing bass. He did however know maxing out that "bass" knob on the stereo made all music sound better. When he did learn where the bass came from, he was astonished to also find that bass was not the instrument the cool kids gravitated toward and so there were plenty of opportunities for a beginner bassist. Rob started playing bass at age 17 and was immediately in a band. In the 90's Rob played in several Brevard County rock cover bands including Meanstreak and Slick Willie and original rock bands November and Minus Ten. He was able to play with some phenomenal musicians and found himself on stage in some classic venues including, The Cedar Chest, Hotel California, The Hustler, Diggers, The Zoo/Asylum, House of Blues, Johnny's Rockin' Bistro and the 1999 Melbourne Art Festival. Rob stopped playing in 2000 to raise a family and pursue a career in IT. In 2023, a good friend reached out needing a bass player. His friend's cover band, Big Fish was scheduled to play their annual benefit show at City Church in Palm Bay and found themselves in need of a bass player at the last minute. And so, after a 23-year hiatus Rob filled in and as a result came to realize just how much he actually missed playing. In April 2024, Rob ran into John, neighbor and former Ruckus guitarist who shared the band's need for a new bassist and in May of this year Rob returned to the stage with Ruckus. He says gigging is different now being older and wiser.

## South Star Festival

■urricane Helene sat in the gulf staring hungrily at Florida like it was Thanksgiving dinner. You might say it's late in the season for the number of storms we've been having, but in this state hurricane season never really ends - and what's normal now anyway? So, while the rest of the peninsula was buying canned food and boarding up windows, I was packing my jeep for a road trip that would take me right along the projected path of the storm. Why? Because C3, the promotors behind Bonnaroo, Lalapalooza and a slew of other festivals, decided to start a new one called South Star right in the middle of Huntsville, Alabama. So yeah, I might run into some rain along the way. I might have to navigate downed trees and hunt for gas and electricity. I may even get all the way there and find the city underwater. I might very well be risking my life but at the end of my journey was the promise of two immersive days of live music. What's more rock n' roll than that?

C3 has an enormous roster of festivals and events they put on year after year. This year they decided to launch the inaugural South Star Festival in Huntsville boasting a line up straight off the top 100 of the 1990's. The plan was for 2 days (no camping) of back-to-back acts shifting the crowd back and forth between two stages. The price seemed a little hefty at first glance, but the lineup justified it in the end. And just like any other fest you could pay more for higher tiered tickets giving you better viewing access, better bar service and bathrooms and for a premium you could even have an actual parking spot on site. Everyone else had to find parking somewhere else in the city. Once inside, the set up was fairly standard and it was easy to see the same C3 signatures I've come across at their other festivals

The constant rain was starting to cause chaos with the infrastructure and the organizers pushed the start time back on day one essentially canceling the first band, so **Candlebox** ended up being the official opener of the very first South Star. For the first half of the day sets were 45 minutes - changing to 60 minutes later except for the

headliner who got 90 minutes. Needless to say, everyone used their time wisely and made every minute count. Candlebox was no exception as they played through hits like "Far Behind", "Change" and "Cover me" to a very appreciative crowd. CB has had a revolving door of band members over the years, but the mainstay has always been Tim Martin's immense rock voice, and he's still got it. As soon as CB hit their last note the entire crowd migrated as one herd across the grounds to the other stage. Pacing the sets with only 5 minutes in between bands, this is how the entire event would continue to play out, and I didn't mind at all. Unlike other multistage shows, there was no reason to camp out for an hour to grab a spot up front and there were no hard decisions to make about sacrificing one band to see another. You got to see it



Next up was **Gin Blossoms**. When I left Florida, it was somewhere in the 90-degree range, normal for us this time of year. By the time I got to Alabama the temp was in the low 60s with non-stop drizzling. As I stood there cold and wet singing along with one of my favorite bands from the era of my youth, I consistently experienced little jolts of nostalgia with nearly every song they played. There was a whole lot of "Oh yeah, I forgot about that one!" going on.

After a soothing shot of 90s pop rock the crowd shifted again; this time physically and musically. **Juvenile** hit the stage hard slamming the crowd with a bevy of strip club classics. "Set It Off", "Slow Motion", and of course "Back That Azz Up" had the crowd popping their backs like it was '98 - as much as they could without hurting themselves anyway.

Jane's Addiction was originally set to perform, and no one was more excited than this guy, but as you may have heard, a few weeks before the gig lead singer Perry Farrell decided to attack guitarist Dave Navarro on stage, and they subsequently canceled the rest of their "reunion tour." Everyone was disappointed by this surprise turn of events until it was announced that **Tom Morello** was taking the slot. - Jane who? - If you see one concert this year you wouldn't be wrong to see Tom Morello. Besides being one of the best guitarists on the planet Morello truly loves what he does, and it shows, rock hard and right to the point. In addition to his insane solo material, he also played covers from greats like Bruce Springsteen, MC5 and John Lennon. Highlights of course included instrumental Rage Against the Machine songs and Audioslave's "Like a Stone."

**Ludacris** puts on a show that can only

be described by his name's sake. He punches hard from jump, and the energy never slows down. I don't know how many songs this man has, but it's enough that he couldn't play full songs and get through even a good chunk. Luda spent the entire set challenging the crowd to prove they were true fans by singing along to songs from early on in his career and deeper cuts that never hit the charts. The people did not disappoint and gave it back to him fast and furiously. It was mind-blowing to witness a few thousand fans rapping every lyric to "Area Codes" in perfect unison.

The next group on stage was pure delight and probably my biggest draw for this festival. I honestly never thought there would be a time when I would be watching the talented ladies of TLC do their thing right in front of me. Most people didn't think they would, or could, go on without the third leg of their tripod Lisa "Left Eye" Lopes who died in a tragic car crash in 2002. Even TLC said they wouldn't go on. Fortunately, they changed their minds and are back on stage. It's now, 30 years since the release of the massively successful album CrazySexyCool, and TLC hasn't lost a step. Their set was packed wall to wall with sing-along hits and tributes to Lopes. As a matter of fact, all of Left Eye's parts are still in the show via recorded voice and video.

Second to last was monsters of meaningful rock Shinedown. Earlier that afternoon I had the pleasure of meeting drummer Barry Kercher who told me the band was pumped and excited to be in the lineup. Never having seen a live Shinedown show myself I wasn't sure what to expect but I wasn't going to miss it if Kercher was telling the truth, and of course he was. Shinedown blew it up so big. I nearly forgot they weren't headlining. I've always known of the band but for some reason didn't pay a lot of attention. Shame on me! I'm now a true-blue fan and if you see my new bestie Barry tell him I said so.

Last but not least and definitely the most colorful was none other than the beautiful, talented, never aging Gwen Stefani. Sometimes in this business we get to hear little rumors about what the artists may or may not do during their shows: stuff the fans don't know about. Sometimes these tid-bits end up being true, sometimes not. Sometimes your friend who got to the venue early enough to catch Gwen's soundcheck tells you she's playing mostly No Doubt material, and your day gets that much better. As headliner Stefani got 90 minutes to perform, and she filled it with an entire show of No Doubt music with a few of her solo hits sprinkled in. The costumes, the dancers, the fan girls dressed as bananas; it was fantastic. Just like most of the day, Stefani's set was another sing-at-the-top-of-lungs nostalgia party. By this time most of the crowd was standing ankle deep in mud but I swear not a shit was given.

The next day I woke up to a message from the organizers stating that after all the foot traffic on the saturated grounds the day before, the city had deemed it unsafe to continue with the second half of the festival. It was disappointing news, but the first day was so good all I could do was take a breath and start wondering who they are going to get next year.







## Little Sister Reviews

Itried a new thing. Instead of going to the usual venues checking out the many awesome cover bands, I attended Steve Keller's fund raising event for *WFIT* at Derek Gores Gallery in EGAD. Although Steve and I have been contributors to *Brevard Live* for quite a while, this is the first time we met. He deserves many kudos for the relentless work that he does for local original artists.

My review is for the duet acoustic act *Little Sister*. I caught them on *Keller Radio*, 2 songs, and they really piqued my interest. So, I decided I needed to broaden my experiences with all the genres we have in our area; especially the local original acoustic scene.

I've been a plugged musician all my life. I always played for a multitude of a crowd. Acoustic performers tend to play for a small crowd. It's different! The Derek Gores crowd reminded me of what 1960's Greenwich Village must have felt like.

Little Sister are Tina Eno and Marcy Brenner. They arrived at their name from the fact that each are the youngest of three daughters in their perspective families. Both grew up in Northern Virginia. They met at an open mic session 8 years ago. Eventually, they started getting together. Tina and Marcy formed Little Sister this past Summer as both of their duo acts were folding. They started gigging doing covers just to get acquainted with each other musically. The gig at Derek Gores art gallery featuring original artists forced them to work on some of their original songs.

From the very start, as they were setting up to play, I could tell what seasoned players they were. Definitely they have done this a time or two. Relaxed, unfettered, cool and calm. Made sure the mix in the PA system was correct and all volumes were satisfactory. Time was limited so they only played 4 awesome tunes. They started out with Tina Eno's originals, "Raylene". Vocals were powerful and harmonies spot on. Tina on her Martin CEO7 and Marcy on her Collings mandolin. This was followed by "Joe Bell Flowers" an original from Marcy Brenner. Next was "Mona Savona" by Tina Eno. Then they performed Marcy's original "Pass Him By".

These ladies truly excel with their stage presence, originality, dynamic vocals, harmonies, and grasp of their instruments...and they have fun! If you like Contemporary Folk, Little Sister is definitely for you!
