



### Save A Heart Fundraiser For Misti Blu Day

We have promoted many benefit concerts in the past 20 years but this one hits home. Misti Blu Day, our 26-year-old photographer and writer, mother of three lovely children, needs heart surgery. Like many young and free-lancing people, she has no health-insurance or funds to pay for an expensive operation set for July 6th at Florida Hospital in Orlando. Her only security net are we, her friends and supporters.



Misti was born with Supraventricular Tachycardia and did not get diagnosed until the age of 15. She finally had a cardiac ablation in 2003 and another one six weeks after. She had her third ablation in 2007 and finally her fourth attempt in October of 2010. which was most sucessful. She rarely has episodes of SVT now but does currently have Inappropriate Sinus Tachycardia. Doctors are assuming that during her first and second ablation, the catheter had punctured through her aortic valve, causing the Aortic Regurgitaion that she has today. She was diagnosed with Aortic Insufficentcy in 2004 after going to the ER regularly after her ablations in 2003 and complaining of chest discomfort. Most doctors dismissed her complaints since she was not having SVT episodes, though that

was not her complaint. Finally in 2004, a doctor discharged her again and said that her blood work and EKG were fine, however, he heard a heart mumur while she was not in SVT. Misti, who makes sure to get every medical report after every visit and test, knew that a murmur has never been reported. After explaining that to the doctor, she was admitted and then diagnosed.

After this long battle of doctor appointments, tests, operationsm, and hospitalizations, Misti has found the right surgeon and is ready for the surgery that she needs.

Her friends are hoping to raise money so that she can pay her medical bills, medication, and out of work expenses. This surgery is needed to prevent irriversable damage due from heart failure. Several fundraisers have been organized. The next event is the Musicathon at Murdocks in Cocoa Village on June 6th from 6 to 9pm. Performers are The Dull Blades, Misti's husband Paul Sikes from The High Fevers, Josh Miller, Russ Jones, Chuck Crawford, and more.

A non-profit organization, the Misti Blu Day Heart Fund, has been set up and if you are able to donate visit mistibluheartfund.bbnow.org.

### Beatles: Help!

Classic Albums Live is an ensemble of world-class musicians recreating the greatest Rock albums ever recorded live on stage. Note for note, cut for cut using every instrument it took to record that album exactly as you remember it. It's Rock n Roll played with the precision and fine detail of a philharmonic orchestra, only it's high energy classic Rock.

# Hulk Hogan

When I was a kid the WWF (Worldwide Wrestling Federation) was one of the highest rated shows on television, and Hulk Hogan was king of the castle. Back then it was all about the characters: Andre the Giant, Sergeant Slaughter, Superfly Jimmy Snooka, Captain Lou Albano, Mount Fuji, Sting the Ultimate Warrior, Rowdy Roddy Piper, Nature Boy Rick Flair... the list goes on and on. There was even a Saturday morning cartoon show dedicated to it. During those days it was still unclear whether or not pro wrestling was real or not. The bastard child of official Greco Roman style and Mexican theatrical wrestling - pro wrestling in America took it all to a new level. And during the eighties it exploded. Today's pro wrestling is as fake as can be when it comes to the actual fighting, but there are still a lot of very well choreographed athletic maneuvers that have to be precisely executed or the results can be extremely dangerous. After nearly thirty years in the business Hulk Hogan is still going strong and continues to be one of the most beloved personalities on the scene. He doesn't fight much anymore, due to extensive back and knee injuries, but he's still a force in the industry. Not long ago Hogan and old friend Ravishing Rick Flair started up a new wrestling company with a bit of flare from the golden hay days calling it TNA (Total Non-stop Action). Tonight we're going VIP to a TNA event being filmed for Spike TV. This is TNA and you're with the Hulkster!

Tonight's event is being filmed at Universal Studios in Orlando. After parking we walk to the gates of the park and are escorted past a long line of wrestling fans all decked in t-shirts sporting the faces of their favorite wrestling stars. Upon entering the theater we are shown to a row of chairs two rows back from the ring. My name is taped to two of the seats, so I'm assuming this is where we will watch the show. Wrong. Before long someone with the production motions asks us to stand and leads us to the other side of the ring next to the stage where the wrestlers make their grand entrances and points to two seats in front, right next to the action. I love VIP!

A few minutes later the announcer steps into the ring with a mic and explains to the now packed house how the show works and what is expected of the audience when the cameras are on. Basically they want us all to go bat shit the whole time, and I don't think this crowd will have a problem with that. It's show time. The lights get bright the music gets loud and - 3,2,1 we're on.

Almost immediately the stage is lit with pyrotechnics and laser lights. Wrestlers seem to appear out of nowhere in all kinds of costumes, but none are out shadowed by the one and only... Hullllkkkkk Hooooooogannnn! Standing to the far right, in a frozen pose of quiet strength, Hogan watches as his crew descends upon the ring. More wrestlers appear and there seems to be some kind of altercation. Mics are handed out and we are all now privy to the verbal throw down going on between the two disagreeing parties. It doesn't last long, just a continuation of the story line that loosely runs throughout the season. There are always alliances being made and broken within the ranks. There are good guys and bad guys and sometimes even double agents. It's really kind of a live action comic book with the closest thing to super heroes we can have in the real world.

Hulk, or should I say the script, decides that he's done with the banter and he heads backstage again. And that's when it all starts. All the wrestlers on the floor jump into the ring to fight the opposing forces for their now absent general. Fist fly and almost land, heads are gently pushed into turnbuckles, guys fall on the mat after being nearly clothes lined. It's a total (fake) massacre, at least until commercial break.

As the night goes on actual matches take place and many more story lines are advanced. During commercial breaks stage hands work quickly to make various scenery changes for the next segment and characters take their places for whatever is scripted to come next. The whole machine is very well oiled and the show is seamless. It's amazing. Everything is fake of course, except for the fun and there is no shortage of that. As an added surprise one of the cast members of Jersey Shore makes his wrestling debut in an exhibition match. Clothes lined, body slammed and rolled, his hair never moves, just amazing.

After the show we are taken backstage to meet the talent. There in a room full of muscle mass and testosterone I scan frantically for the man in charge. But alas the Hulk has left the building. Having had recent back surgery Hogan suffers from pain as of late and headed out for his home Clearwater over an hour ago. Maybe another time.

Leaving the theater I wonder what my gimmick would be if I were a pro wrestler. I don't know what I would call myself, but my signature move would be the "bretzle".

## Did you know?

In 1978 Hogan took a hiatus from wrestling and managed a club in Cocoa Beach, known as the Anchor Club for a man named Whitey Bridges. Eventually, Whitey and Hogan became close friends and decided to open a gym together called Whitey and Terry's Olympic gym. It's been told that the Hulk also worked as security at Brassy's during big concerts. If you know more, please tell us at facebook.com/Brevard Live.

## **Local History**

The Henegar Center is is one of Brevard County's oldest public buildings and was designed by W.M. Christen, architect of many of Melbourne's most important historic buildings. It was constructed to become a Melbourne School Complex

Construction began in 1919 and in the fall of 1920 the building opened. It was soon to become the first of three structures to stand on the site. The first high school class, consisting of only 13 students graduated in 1921. At its highest the enrollment reached 1400. In 1963 the school was named for former Principal Ruth Henegar (1950–1951). In 1975 enrollment reached an all time low of 331 students and the decision to close the school was made. On June 11, 1975 after 55 years the doors of the school closed.

To this day the two remaining structures has housed many things prior to becoming the community cultural center that it is today. In the late 60's both outer buildings were closed as instructional buildings and the west building (Trinity Towers South now occupies this land) housed Brevard Junior College (now Brevard Community College, BCC): the center building (Henegar Center) was used by the school board and other county offices. In 1980 the West building was demolished to make room for Trinity Towers South, in 1983 a small group of local residents acted and formed a non-profit corporation- the Brevard Regional Arts Group (BRAG) and went to work to restore the two remaining buildings. In1984 The North Building Cultural Center was granted a forty- year renewable lease and BRAG was deeded the buildings by the Brevard County School System. BRAG mobilized the community and was able to raise \$2.5 million.

In 1991 the Henegar Center for the Arts opened its doors with a 493-seat Proscenium style Theatre, designed by Tony Award winning Broadway Designer Peter Feller. The original main stage curtain was from the Broadway Musical The King and I. State of the art sound and lighting equipment was installed in order to present the highest quality productions. The main building also boasts many spaces including the main ballroom, Reception room, Courtyard Garden Room, a mirrored dance studio and two additional meeting spaces. In addition, the public spaces are home to rotating exhibitions of work by local artists.

"We're setting a new course for the Henegar Center," said Wendy Brandon who is the acting executive director at this time. Not that she wanted to have another job. Wendy's schedule is quite busy being an attorny and involved in other community efforts and non-profit organizations. But it has to be done and Wendy is a powerhouse.

The days of being a mediocre community theatre are finally over. "The new Henegar Center will offer different forms of entertainment and reach many other demographics. Times have changed, and we need to change with it." Unfortunately the old administration wasn't able to handle the new course, so Wendy had to step in. That was in middle of March.

"I love this place." she said and her track record proves it: For the past 20 years Wendy has served on board of directors, three times as president and currently as treasurer. She's got what it takes to conduct the much anticipated reconstruction of the organization.

Kathy Kett is the assistant to the executive director and "invaluable in our daily operation", as Wendy put it. Kathy has been involved with the Henegar Center since 1994 with different groups and volunteer work. Five years ago she was hired as in-house marketing director creating flyers, programs, and display ads and helping out wherever she was needed. If you have been to our Brevard Live Music Awards, you've seen her busy during the intermission.

Kathy was in charge of our bar and did an incredible job.

Together these two women will make a difference. They have brought various genres of music to the Henegar Center with the help of promoter Roland Guilarte of Brevard Music Group (which includes the Brevard Jazz Series). "It's been a pleasure working with them," said Roland who has Acoustic Alchemy performing there on June 19th, 7 pm, as part of the Henegar Indie Music Series which is made possible by Harris Corporation Community Foundation for Brevard, and more concerts are in the works.

For the young ones there are summer theatre camps scheduled which are taught by experienced instructors. Your child can build their theater skills and have a great time doing so with instruction in Acting, Singing, Choreography, Stagecraft, Dance and more. There's even a High School Summer Theater Workshop that will culminate in 6 performances on The Henegar Center Mainstage.

The new theatre season features several plays and you can find out more details in the ad on page 38 or at henegar. org. Even some "cutting edge" performances are in the works, for instance *The Vagina Monologues*.

The facility also offers affordable rentals. Besides the big auditorium, the Henegar Center for the arts offers a new room with stage that seats 100 people, cost: \$200 per day.

The bottom-line - the Henegar Center is getting hip. It's about time! Heike Clarke





#### "JON PARROT"

Jon Parrot is a rarity in this town. Here's a guy that followed his dream of writing, recording and performing his original music to the masses. Already accomplished in the world of construction, he gigs at least of couple of times a week, bringing his trusty acoustic everywhere he goes. Jon's sound can best be described somewhere between Bob Seegar and Bruce Springsteen and Jon Bon Jovi. You can check out Jon online, or better yet go to one of his many gigs during the week or the tourist friendly weekend shows. Doesn't get much better than that.

#### "MURDERFLY"

Theses guys are bringing it...every time. From headlining gigs in some of the biggest original music venues in town, to high profile opening gigs like last month's Cold show at Levelz, these guys are the real deal. Original metal in our town is a welcome accomplishment. I've always said the metal fans are one of the most loyal, so let's prove to the mainstays here that if you play it, so will come...

#### "QUEEN ANNE'S REVENGE"

From the "where the hell did they go" file, Justin Elkins and crew have been travelling from their native Arkansas and back as long as I've known them. Justin once opened for BSA acoustically and tore the house down. Flawlessly channeling Johnny Cash and Johnny Rotten from one song to another. You'd be hard-pressed to find a more diverse band. Check them out when they return to our neck of the woods.

#### "ARCHITECTS OF FEAR"

When anybody asks me "who's' your favorite harpischord-based, sample-infused, mannequin-prop, keyboardist-instead-of-bass-player band in Brevard county," I always answer, Architects of Fear, hands down. Seriously, have loved they guys since I saw them seven drummers ago. Best Supporting Actor has shared many a gig with these guys and they always impress. Catch them locally before they pack up their station wagons again and travel cross-country. Check them out online to pick up their CDs and enjoy the melodic weirdness that is Architects of Fear.

# ARTISTIC ADVENTURES

How does one get recognition as an artist? How does when get recognition, while working 40+ hours a week, taking care of the house, running the errands, spending time with the family and doing all that other stuff that takes so much time and energy? This is a question that I posed about a year ago, and have been looking for the answers to ever since.

Well that was last year, this year I'm doing something about it. Having never displayed publicly, I'm going to be starting at square one. While I'm out searching for answers, I will document my findings right here in Brevard Live.

So I started by asking questions. I asked anyone and everyone I felt appropriate where and how to start. The answers I got were simple, start by displaying somewhere. I started looking for places that would let me hang some work in public. I was told coffee shops, cafes and the like often let artists display. I tried contacting a few. Ironically enough I had heard about the club before in regards to music, but I never knew they had anything to do with art. In fact, the lead bartender Heather is herself an artist, and she throws an art show the first Monday of each month at the club. I contacted her through facebook and was registered for the show painlessly.

The drive to the show was the only time I felt nervous at all, that instantly went away when I met Heather and the other artists attending the show. What a friendly bunch of people. The experience was great, and I sold a book and a pack of cards.

That's also where I met Michael Christopher Markman. He had a ton of work with him, and an equal amount to say about it all. Through our meeting he became May's featured artist at House of Joe in Melbourne. See his work in this month's Underground Gallery.

So this was all in week one of my venturing out into the art world. I've gathered first hand information on displaying, made some great connections, and hooked up a fellow artist with their own display. I can't wait to see what lies ahead.

### CD Reviews by John Leach

He's back - the one and only Wildfire Johnny aka John Leach who was a staff writer for Brevard Live in the late 90s. Back then he became our friend, and at Brevard Live it's once friends always friends. He also stepped in as MC for the Brevard Live Music Awards in 2009 when Chris Long was traveling with various bands - they're also friends forever.

Over the past year we've received respectable CDs from respectable local musicians with the request for review. Even though we dropped the column, we finally caved and... here is Johnny!

#### **Pinch**

You Got To Have It – Live
Recorded Live at The Key West Bar,
Indian Harbour Beach, FL

Booze and Rock & Roll - two great things that go great together. As Pinch launches into the first song on this disc "I Should Be Drinking Now" it quickly becomes apparent what kind of ride this is going to be. The music is aggressively loud, the mood is loose and before the ride is over TJ the bartender gets acknowledged three or four times, as well he should be - it can't be easy keeping the fuel in this fire.

The sound quality is clean and clear and avoids the muddy pitfalls of so many live recordings. All the instruments hold their own, the vocals are strong but not too out front and there's plenty of crowd noise where it's needed. The alcohol driven raw energy is all there without allowing it to take over the actual songs and performances.

The band's logo on the accompanying sticker carries the slogan Undercover Punks but there's nothing undercover about their fist in the air presentation. The music here is Pinch's own 90 proof cocktail of Jason and the Scorcher's flavored cowpunk rock & roll - one part old school UK style punk complete with the odd John Lydon yelp, two parts surf punk served up with a Jello Biafra sneer, enough "Hey, Hey, Hey!" to fill Joey Ramone's liquor cabinet and all chased down with a big frosty mug of the kind of corner bar buffoonery that makes rock music so much fun.

Tracks like "Haom Skool'd" (you won't get drugs at home school/all you get is hugs at home school), "Hard As You" (an ode to a biker chick at a stoplight) and a truly Shakespearean couplet rhyming kiss with piss in "Rock & Roll is Supposed to Hurt" come together to create a potent party punch that could inebriate any jaded rocker.

So line 'em up, count it off, get 'em up! The new Pinch release is a full tilt, hard rockin' partytime soundtrack. 1,2,3, Social!

#### **Ken Moores**

White Lies And Alibis
Recorded at Dave Munkoff Studios
and Master Bedroom Studios,
Cocoa, Florida 2010

Gentle as an Indian River breeze with a large tequila chaser, Ken Moores' latest release will bring out the Southern Gentleman in anyone. At times country infused, gospel tinged and easy listening, Moores' multiple influences and multi-instrumentalism have produced a record with its feet planted firmly on laid back southern ground. "Devil's Game" brings to mind the genre bending slide guitar of the late great Lowell George and 1970's Little Feat while other tunes like "Woman is Love" summon the acoustic guitar stylings of Physical Graffiti era Jimmy Page and the kind of soulful vocal that makes Eric Clapton more than just a

guitar player. There's even hints of the FM friendly blues of Robert Cray on "She's Trouble" and classic southern California country rock on "She Don't Think I Notice". There's an obvious lifetime of experience behind every tune and a few tracks like "Gettin' Old" ("Everything aches/everything's blurry...) and the title track "Alibis and Little White Lies" ("I'm out on the road, wasting my life...) reflect how long that life has been.

The song choices and flow from track to track make "White Lies and Alibis" more of a complete work than just a collection of twelve songs. It's the type of record that gets played from start to finish and has the feel of an old familiar sweater on a late autumn Florida night – now that it's on, there's just no need to take it off.

The overall production is slick without being sterile and every song is completely radio ready. All the instruments are all given room to breathe and all each component works together for the sake of the song as opposed to showy musicianship or, as is often the downside of blues style music, solos for solos sake. Moores himself must have used his entire extensive guitar collection (pictured on the cover) on this album. There's twelve string acoustic guitars, resonator guitars, mandolins and big, bad, roadhouse rockin' distorted electric guitars. The attention to detail shows.

The next time you need a sound-track for a few afternoon cocktails by the river just grab "White Lies And Alibis" and press play.




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## A Cocoa Beach Original: Meet Joel Silver

People who are into health food and/or traditional blues music have known Joel Silver all along. For them he's almost a legend. As founder and president of Sunseed Coop in Cape Canaveral, Joel brought a new concept of doing business and healthy living to the Space Coast at a time when few people were living here and nobody locked their homes or cars. Being a life-long hippie he's missing those days. His other passion is blues music, networking with national artists and inviting them to perform his hometown.


Born 1945 in Salem, Mass., he grew up in a middleclass family. His father owned a plumbing, heating, electrical supply store and Joel decided early on that he "never wanted to become a retailer. Too much work," he said and chuckled. "Then I ended up becoming just that."

However, that's not how he started off. He began playing drums at 13 years old, at age 15 he was playing in clubs. "Back then electric guitars were new and everyone wanted to play them," remembered Joel. "They all needed a drummer, so here I was." It was the time of Elvis Presley, Chuck Berry, and all the cool cats. The 45 records came in along with the hippie-movement and Joel found himself in the middle of it all - drinking, drugs, the party never seemed to stop.

In 1962 Joel began studying engineering, hated it and after one year decided to pursue a degree in photography. For quite some years he worked for newspapers, then built his own commercial photography studio and made his money shooting commercial photos for big companies. And while he earned a lot of money, he felt as if something was missing in his life.

In 1971 Joel left Boston in his VW van and started traveling around trying to find a place where he can be happy. He passed up several states until he arrived in Cocoa Beach and it was "WOW - Manjana Town. It was quiet, laid back, there was the ocean, a great beach, and very cool people." Joel smiled thinking about the paradise he discovered. "The people I met here were so spiritual and they inspired me." A few months later he decided to become a vegetarian.

One day in 1973, while reading East-West Journal, Joel came across an article about buying clubs and co-ops. The idea of starting a soup kitchen has been explored, but the health department wouldn't go for it. Instead he formed a buying-club operated out of his bedroom. It turned out that neighbors didn't like a 10-wheel truck to arrive at the house on Sundays, so the club relocated to a small store down the street.. Joel: "We started with 50 members and as interest




in natural and organic food increased, so did business." Nowadays the store has more than 5,000 members, grosses over \$3 million and has a retail space of 5,000 squ.ft. with 17 staff members. And while Joel is retired he's still the president of the co-op.

As for his love of music he's been helping local as well as national musicians along the way. His friends Bruce Katz, Corky Siegel and John Hammond have been coming to Brevard County and at times are staying at Joel's home while traveling through. Joel also picked up local drummer Tommy Dequattro last month at Orlando Airport when he returned from a trip to Massachusetts where doctors performed a life-saving operation.

At age 66 Joel is still the peace-loving hippie with good vibes and a helping hand. Now divorced he has two sons, one adorable grandson and no regrets.






