# **Trading Sleds for Surfboards: Surfing Santas**

Surfing Santas return to Cocoa Beach for the tenth year on December 24th. There's a very good reason folks along Florida's Space Coast flock to Cocoa Beach's downtown oceanfront early in the morning on Christmas Eve. Everyone wants to stake out a prime viewing spot for what has become a wildly popular annual ritual in these sunny seaside parts: the celebrated arrival of the "Surfing Santas."

Over 650 Surfing Santas showed up last year to catch some of Cocoa Beach's finest waves, entertaining a beachside crowd estimated at more than 8,000. The local buzz for the 10th annual Surfing Santas extravaganza this December 24th dwells, as it always does, on just how many more Santas will take part compared to the previous year. Organizer George Trosset, who started this tradition somewhat by accident nine years ago, recently predicted that at least a thousand surfers will show up "to ride the Surfing Santas wave" at Cocoa Beach..

The 2018 event begins unfolding at 8 am along the beach near 2 Minutemen Causeway (where the causeway intersects with N. Atlantic Avenue, also known as Florida Route A1A) and is expected to continue until early afternoon. Plenty of parking is available and numerous area restaurants will be open to serve Surfing Santas participants and spectators.

"Since Santa has a busy night ahead of him on Christmas Eve, he likes to spend the morning enjoying his favorite pastime, which is surfing," smiled Trosset. "And because Cocoa Beach is the East Coast surfing capital, it's no surprise he comes here to catch the best waves and mix with his fans. Around here, this show the Surfing Santas put on is known as 'the ride of Christmas magic.' This is Central Florida's best Christmas party."

All this beachy holiday merriment is for a good cause. Proceeds from donations and sales of the official Surfing Santas T-shirt commemorating this free event benefit two local nonprofit organizations, *Grind for Life* and the Florida Surf Museum. More than \$40,000 has been collected for the two charities.

Grind for Life is a cancer support group whose mission is to provide financial assistance to cancer patients and their families when they travel long distances to visit doctors and hospitals. The 18-year-old Florida Surf Museum preserves and documents all aspects of the unique history and culture of Florida surfing, exposing visitors to the heritage and traditions of the surfing community.

Since anyone of any age can participate as a Surfing Santa, exactly how many Santas will descend on Cocoa Beach this December 24th remains to be seen. The only requirement is to show up with your board and dressed as Santa or his helpers or any other character depicting the spirit of the season. In the past, there also have been reindeer and Christmas tree Surfing Santas, Rastafarian Surfing Santas, and even a Batman Surfing Santa. There are no rules about costumes, organizers point out, as long as one remembers this is a family oriented event. A costume contest open to the public has been added in 2017. Anyone in the crowd can participate by dressing up in a winter-themed outfit.

The first, very unofficial Surfing Santas event took place in 2009, when, on Christmas Eve, Trosset and his son, George Jr., and daughter-in-law Britteny thought it would be a kick to go surfing in South Cocoa Beach dressed up as Santa Claus and his elves. When a photo of their antics hit the front page of a Florida newspaper, others wanted to join the fun. Since then, the number of Surfing Santas has grown almost exponentially each year.

"Surfing Santas has evolved into this fantastic community gathering of surfing enthusiasts coming from near and far to this very popular surf spot, in celebration of Christmas," Trosset said.

# GUESS WHO

The Guess Who is coming to town - and that's not a question...see what I did there? Part in support of their latest album, The Future is What it Used To Be, released back in September, and part because they are always touring and love to play, the blues rockers from the land of maple leaves and hockey will be swinging through our area to play a mix of their new stuff and some golden oldies at the King Center in Melbourne. It's once again an Elko concert.

Originally formed in Winnipeg, Canada under the name Allan and the Silvertones, the band began in 1958

to play local bars and restaurants. By 1962, just as they were making a name for themselves they changed their call sign to Chad Allan and the Reflections. Chad Allan was the original singer and songwriter for the group, and that wasn't his real name either...it was Allan Kowbel. So, the original line-up was Chad "Allan Kowbel" Allan on lead vocals and guitar, Bob Ashley on keys, Randy Bachman (later of Bachman-Turner Overdrive) on guitars and backing vocals, Jim Kale on bass and backing vocals, and Gary Peterson on drums and backing vocals. They called themselves "The Reflections" because it sounded a little like a British band that they liked called "The Shadows." But in 1965 that was all going to change again.

1962 saw the band's first single "Tribute to Buddy Holly" released on *Canadian-American Records*. Another

handful of singles were released between 1963 and 1964 under *Quality Records*, but nothing really went anywhere chart wise. In '65 an American group called The Reflections put out a song called "(Just Like) Romeo and Juliet" and it turned out to be a hit. It was decided shortly after that the band had to change their name again. This time they went with the moniker Chad Allan and the Expressions.

as the band was able to produce their first hit single. It was a cover of Johnny Kidd and the Pirates' "Shakin' All Over" and it hit number 1 on the Canadian charts, and 22 in America. Trying to garner some mystery to build a brand, Quality Records credited the single to "Guess Who?" You can probably see where this is going. Even after Quality Records revealed that it was Chad Allan and the Expressions on

the recording, disc jockeys continued to announce them as "Guess Who?" whenever the song was played on the radio. Eventually the band just gave into it, and that is how we now have the band The Guess Who? Trippy huh? And actually now there is no question mark after the name...that was effectively dropped in 1968.

By the end of '65 Quality was pressuring the boys to tour extensively, and Bob Ashley wasn't haven't it, so he left the group and was replaced with Burton Cummings who also shared vocals with Chad Allan. That line-up lasted five minutes. By May of '66 Chad Allan, even though he had started the group, decided to exit and go back to college leaving the lead vocals completely up to Cummings.

As 1966 came to a close the band was now a quartet with their first leader gone and a band mate replaced leaving only two original members, but they were making good progress and beginning to play the same kind of venues around Canada that hosted the likes of Joni Mitchell, and Neil Young. The next year they found themselves on television as the house band for a music show for teens called Let's Go which was being hosted by none other than Chad Allan their former leader. At first they were hired to play hits off the radio, but over time they began to play their own music on the show as well which gave them even more exposure across Canada. And that exposure, it appeared, paid off because it wasn't long after that they were being recruited for an ad campaign for Coca-Cola in the form of a split LP between the Guess Who and a band from Ottawa called the Staccatos. The album was only available through mail order purchase with 10 Coke bottle caps. This is around the time they also met Don Hunter who managed them through their peak years until 1975.

In 1969, under Hunter's management, the band released their album *Wheatfield Soul* which included the ballad "These Eyes." Released at the

top of the year, 'These Eyes' became the band's first American top 10 single selling over 1 million copies and scoring them a gold record by the Recording Industry Association of America. The band followed up *Wheatfield Soul* with *Canned Wheat* later that same year containing the songs "Laughing", "Undun", and "No Time."

By 1970 the band was leaning towards a heavier rock sound. They were shying away from the pop of the 60's and wanted to explore the edgier sounds that the bands around them were starting to produce. Their first album of the year was American Woman whose title track went on to be one of their biggest hits and was even covered by Lenny Kravitz in the 1990's. The album also had another hit on it - "No Sugar Tonight". American Woman, the album, became the first Canadian album to reach number one in the States. After converting to Mormonism Randy Bachman left the band in 1971 and formed the band Brave Belt which eventually turned into Backman Turner Overdrive. He was replaced in the Guess Who by Kurt Winter and Greg Leskiw. With this new line-up the band went on to record the hit singles 'Hand Me Down World', 'Share the Land', 'Hang On to Your Life', 'Albert Flasher', and 'Rain Dance'. The albums Share the Land, and The Best of the Guess Who both reached gold record status.

1970 also saw the band at the Whitehouse performing for President Nixon and his family and guests. Although they were asked not to play their hit "American Woman" because of political interpretations of the lyrics.

Throughout the 70's the band continued to enjoy success both recording and touring. They even put out a live album recorded at the Paramount Theater in Seattle, Washington. But in 1972 the band would suffer a line-up change again as bass player Jim Kale was fired from the group. Bill Wallace was brought in to play bass and the band picked up where they left off,

and went out on tour with Three Dog Night. By the mid 70's the band was losing steam and sales were dropping. More changes were being made to the line-up and things were getting grim. In '75 they decided to call it quits and break up the band.

As it happens with so many bands after they break up, the next couple of decades saw reunions, and reformations with various new and old members. Fights over the official name, and of course, there was even a time when you could see more than one Guess Who in concert with completely different line-ups.

Then in 1999 the Premier of Manitoba requested that Cummings, Bachman, Kale and Peterson appear together as the Guess Who for the closing ceremonies of the Pan American Games at Winnipeg Stadium. This small reunion sparked something in the musicians, and they began practicing for a real reunion. In May of 2000 they embarked on a tour that spanned across Canada as well as America. In addition to the tour they released a live concert DVD called Running Back Thru Canada. In 2001 the band received honorary doctorates from Brandon University, and they were inducted into Canada's Walk of Fame. Throughout the 2000's the band has continued to tour and release new music as well as compilations of older stuff. They still change up their cast and crew every now and again, but the spirit and music remain the same.

Earlier this year long time bassist Jim Kale announced he would be permanently retiring and that Rudy Sarzo (formerly of Quiet Riot) would be replacing him.

The Guess Who will be at the King Center this month so if you haven't gotten tickets you better grab them before they are gone. This is a legendary band with a slew of great songs and a ton of history, so you won't want to miss it. See ya there!

# **Black Oak Arkansas**

Outhern rock veterans Black Oak Arkansas never quite achieved the level of success enjoyed by contemporaries like Lynyrd Skynyrd and the Allman Brothers, but have remained a popular cult band thanks to their raw. primitive energy and the testosteronefueled antics of lead vocalist/showman James "Big Jim Dandy" Mangrum. Named for Mangrum's hometown, Black Oak Arkansas eventually built up a solid following through incessant touring and enjoyed a run of ten charting albums between 1971 and 1976. The band also found itself with a Top 30 single, a cover of a LaVern Baker R&B hit called "Jim Dandy to the Rescue," which became Mangrum's signature song. When album sales declined, Mangrum re-formed the band with more musically skilled veteran players and continues to tour.

The band released a new album for *Atlantic Records/Atco Records* in 2013 titled "Back Thar N' Over Yonder". The album features a line-up of original and current members. Reunited originals Jim "Dandy" Mangrum, Rickie Lee "Risky" Reynolds, Pat "Dirty" Daughtery, and Jimmy "Soybean" Henderson, were joined by current drummer Johnnie Bolin, bassist George Hughen, lead guitarist Hal McCormack and guitarist Buddy Church.

This concert also a charity event, and if you ride in with a \$10 toy for Toys For Tots, you can enjoy the festival for free. There will be vendors, beer, a full service bar, and other local live bands performing all day.

# **Slippery When Wet**

Slippery When Wet – The Ultimate Bon Jovi Tribute was formed in 2003 by Jason Morey after answering many inquiries of "Are you Jon Bon Jovi?". Most notably comedian Dave Chappelle invited Jason backstage following one of his comedy shows thinking that he was the New Jersey icon. It was then that Jason knew he had to take advantage of the resemblance.

It's a good thing that Jason grew up on classic albums such as "Slippery When Wet" and "New Jersey". Not to mention that he was also playing a few Bon Jovi songs in his widely successful tribute to the halcyon days of metal "The White Leppard Crue".

Slippery When Wet - The Ultimate Bon Jovi Tribute has taken exact live arrangements from Bon Jovi's 2000's Crush tour, 2002's Bounce tour, 2005's Have a Nice Day tour, 2008's Lost Highway tour and 2010's The Circle tour to form what Jason refers to as an "Arena-Club Show". With further explanation Jason thinks that "Slippery When Wet has the power to turn a 600-1500 capacity club into a 20,000 seat arena for 2 1/2 hours." In 2007 the band was officially authorized by Bon Jovi to perform their highly entertaining show. In 2018 Jason Morey was chosen to perform as their only impersonator to Jon Bon Jovi in the *Legends in Concert* show in Las Vegas. Their driveshowmanship to duplicating the Bon Jovi live experience is amazing.

# **Arlo Guthrie**

He is known for singing songs of protest against social injustice, and storytelling around a song. Guthrie's best-known work is his debut piece, "Alice's Restaurant Massacree," a satirical talking blues song about 18 minutes in length that has since become a Thanksgiving anthem. His only top-40 hit was a cover of Steve Goodman's "City of New Orleans". His song "Massachusetts" was named the official folk song of the state in which he has lived most of his adult life.

In his earlier years, at least from the 1960s to the 1980s, Guthrie had taken a decidedly leftist approach to American politics. In his often lengthy comments during concerts his expressed positions were consistently anti-war, anti-Nixon, pro-drugs and in favor of making nuclear power illegal. However, he apparently regarded himself as more an individualist than the major youth culture spokesperson he had been regarded as by the media. Guthrie identified as a registered Republican in 2008. He endorsed Texas Congressman Ron Paul for the 2008 Republican Party nomination. Commenting on the 2016 election, Guthrie identified himself as an independent, and said he was "equally suspicious of Democrats as I am of Republicans". In 2018, Guthrie stated "I am not a Republican," and expressed disagreement with the Trump administration's views and policies on immigration." Like his father, Woody Guthrie, Guthrie often sings songs of protest against social injustice.

# Kilt The Messenger

Brevard County band Kilt The Messenger can be described using many different words. Eclectic, raw, folk rock. The five piece band is led by singer/songwriter/guitarist/bagpiper Bob Youhaus. He's coined the term "Celtic Punkabilly". As you will soon come to know, this band is unique and should be revered.

The band consists of Youhas, his daughter Haley on drums, Dave Nelson on bass, violinist/bagpiper/vocalist Annie Padnuk and keyboardist Jim Turner. To hear Bob tell the origins of the band, it could easily be made into a movie a la "The Commitments". "I already had the best drummer I have ever worked with, my daughter Haley", Bob tells me. "She and I went over to Dave's house. He and I met when we both played in our church choir and we had formed a Christian Rock band called the Blood Lilies. We knocked on his door and told him we were putting together a Celtic Rock band with bagpipes, Dave was wholeheartedly in." Memories of Padnuk and Turner's arrival in the band, some 9 years ago, are equally intriguing. "The band got together in 2009, and we still have the original members. I was in my 18th year as a Firefighter/ Paramedic with the City of Palm Bay Fire Rescue and I was also a Fire Instructor at the Florida Fire Training Institute. I had taken up the bagpipes in 2005 and my instructor was Annie Padnuk who just happened to be

the wife of one of my students at the Fire Academy, Ryan Padnuk. I spent 4 years studying, and practicing the pipes, almost never touching my guitar, and marching with the Melbourne Pipes & Drums, a band that Annie also belonged to. I was very much into Celtic Punk bands that were using bagpipes, like the Dropkick Murphy's. In early 2009 our Fire Department brought some new hires on board and one of them was Jim Turner, who began his career at Station 1, B-shift, my station, my shift. I soon found out that Jim was a musician (keyboards), and we began talking about putting a Celtic Rock band together." With the original lineup still in tow today, Kilt The Messenger began carving their niche in the Brevard music scene.

Musician turned producer and recording studio owner Brendon Paredes has been both an ally and a friend from the very beginning. "I was a fan of Blood Lilies way back in the day", he remembers. Paredes himself was a member of scene legends The Rawtones. "I was friends with Haley, we

were all in awe of her drumming in the death metal scene. When Kilt began, it was a very natural reaction to want to work with them." I know the feeling. I first wrote about the band about 3 years ago. The combination of their influences and truthfully, their name intrigued me. Song snippets turned into the band playing the concert series Best Fest (produced by Steve Keller and Best Supporting Actor). The band, as diverse visually as they are musically, captivated the audience right from the start. All but drummer Haley wear kilts on stage. Keyboardist Turner's rig is a welcome addition to the scene's typical drums/bass/guitar set up.

"The songs are pretty much done when I show them to the band", Youhas explains. "We practice them and sometimes a change is made on someone's suggestion, but pretty much the songs are done when the band first hears them. I hope that doesn't sound arrogant. It's just that I've got so many songs constantly being written in my head and on my guitar." It is this leadership in the band as well as years as a

first responder, that is the glue that holds everything together. 2014 saw the release of "Hero Punk". From the bag pipes of "Miserable Lives" to the story telling of the title track just plain rock. With producer Paredes behind the board, the band fires on all cylinders from beginning to end. You'll laugh, you'll tear up and most of all, you'll keep listening.

Kilt The Messenger can also be described as a "band's band". One local musician actually went out and had a tshirt made that said "Listen to Kilt The Messenger" (That musician was me). Jared Campbell of Orange Tanga is equally excited about out them. "Kilt The Messenger is more than world class Celtic influenced punk rock. They are honest songwriters. Read that second sentence twice (at least) because it's important," he exclaims. "Sadly, punk rock is mostly a fashion statement these days where connoisseurs try to out Hot Topic each other - and it makes my stomach gurgle and is 180 degrees away from the point. The funny thing is that the band isn't traditional 1-2-3-4 high octane rock. They have some really wellcrafted songs, some of them happen to be fast. Kilt The Messenger is an island of authenticity in an ocean of nonconformist conformity. Real punks don't require flashy haircuts. They just have to write what is in their hearts. They do this spectacularly with unique compositions and excellent musicality. They go where most punks are too stupid to go – into their soul. We are lucky to have them in our world; they deserve celebration."

The high praise continued last month as Brevard Live CD reviewer Rob Pedrick declared, "I must say "Hellfire & Rescue" (released earlier this year) is one of the best CDs I've ever heard. It's absolutely amazing how Kilt The Messenger makes it all work." Standout tracks on the latest CD include "Coming to a Theater Near You." The band has also filmed and released via YouTube a number of music videos. Their video for *The Ballad of Vincent McCarthy*. The intro to the video explains the kinship created by Youhas, his firehouse and the retired McCarthy who died at age 93 after spending many a meal with his fellow firemen.

All of their hard work promoting the band and playing shows brings us current with the Kilt crew. "We've already got our third album written and we're just getting started recording it," says Youhas, also done at Paredes' Studio 101. "We've got a bunch of songs the band barely knows yet because we have about 4 hours worth of stuff and there's not a lot of urgency to learn more new ones just yet. The whole song writing thing is weird, miraculous, mind blowing. I truly thank God every single time he puts an idea in my head and helps me navigate through all the twists and turns till it's finished. I honestly give

Owner Tony Nardone saw the writing on the wall and decided to move across the street into a larger place with a bar, leather couches and chairs and an even bigger humidor. He acquired his wine and beer license, and downtown Melbourne's first cigar bar was born. It became a hit. A few years later he added a patio for patrons to sit outside while puffing their cigars. If you didn't know - smoking cigars and socializing belong together.

Fast forward another few years, and once again the Executive Cigar Shop & Lounge needed an extension. Past November the doors opened just two buildings down to a bigger and fancier place with a state-of-the-art bar that illuminates, a big sales counter, a huge walk-in humidor, more lounge space and lots of TVs. The entrance features patio space on either side. Any plans for the future? "Yes," says Tony Nardone, "we hope to add a liquor license down the line. Cigars pair well with Cognac and other liquors."

The Executive Cigar Shop and Lounge is open daily. They host monthly cigar meetings featuring high quality brands. There is also a regular meeting of "Fierce Fumera's Women's Cigar Group" on the first Wednesday of every month. No gender discrimination here! "I'm cool," he replies. Then, noticing my guitar he asks "Are you a musician?" I snarkily reply, "No, I just carry this around to pick up all the groovy chicks". He looks at me in wonderment as if to say, "What is this strange language you speak?" We both cracked up laughing. I apologized for my snarkiness and proceeded to tell him that, yes, I had been a musician my whole life. "Cool!", he replied, "I'm a musician too!" - "Really?" I asked, "What do you play?" He responded, "I make beats." Back to snarky mode I asked, "Make beets? Isn't that more a culinary thing?" "No, no, no. I make BEATS." He starts tapping out a rhythm on the counter. I say, "Oh, you're a drummer." - "No! I just make beats."- "So you don't play drums, how do you go about 'making beats'?" "Well, I have a machine that I can put in bass drum parts, snare drum parts, cymbal parts." - "So you read and write music?" I assumed. "Oh no, it's all done by steps, like a grid with all the beats being little squares. Then you check where you want the beats to be. They also have pre-made beats you can put together with other beats." - "It sounds

That's very impressive!" I ask him what he's doing now. He explains that now he was just hanging out trying to get a gig. "I'm a musician, too!" I exclaimed. "Yea, what do you do?" he asked. I replied "I make beats!"

Lindsey Buckingham has long been an influential monster in the world of music. With a career spanning across decades, he has proven himself as a songwriter, vocalist, and of course guitarist. Having written and performed on some, if not most, of Fleetwood Mac's biggest hits as well as a profound and successful solo career—Buckingham has built himself into a world class icon. So, when we found out that Mike Elko was bringing Lindsey's new solo tour to the King Center in Melbourne we made sure we were there.

Lindsey Buckingham is probably best known for his tenure with tumultuous band Fleetwood Mac and his 30 year on again off again romantic dance with Mac singer Stevie Nicks, but now that he is, at least for the moment, estranged from that situation he is on the road with a solo tour performing songs personally curated from a lifetime body of work—some never played on stage before. Along with hand picking selection from his own library of material Lindsey also handpicked his band from a short list of musicians he has either worked with for years, or who have impressed the hell out of him. Either way I am sure it's an honor to back such a legend, and they carried their own weight and then some.

In support of his solo outing Lindsey brought along folk singer J.S. Ondara to open the show. Sweetly singing the crowd into a tidal wave of sadness, Ondara, originally from Kenya, Nairobi, lulled the room into a collective stillness as we watched the young musician relive some of his worst romantic heartache. With a touch of showman genius Ondara prefaced his set by explaining that he was there to make us all sad before Lindsey's rock show would make us all feel better. He also injected the right amount of humor at just the perfect moments to keep the crowd engaged between songs. With his first album set to be released very soon, Ondara is definitely one to watch for.

As the lights went down the band took their places on stage and then from the wings appeared the man himself. Always clad in a stylish jacket of some sort Buckingham launched right into 'Don't Look Down' and the band followed suit. Immediately following that they rolled into 'Go Insane' before taking a short break to address the audience. Lindsey gave a very heartfelt explanation about how this tour got going in the first place. Warner Bros., he told us, recently decided to release an anthology of Buckingham's solo material and wanted Lindsey to go on tour

to support it. Things haven't been going to well with his "other band" lately and so he considers this tour a new start for him and the band. I have no doubt that he gives this speech every night he hits the stage, but I believed every word and it felt good to be sharing the night with him and everyone around me.

After rocking through a few more iconic tunes like 'Surrender the Rain', 'Not Too Late', 'Doing What I Can', and 'Trouble' Buckingham's band left the stage and he performed a short set alone. Drawing from the finger picking styles of his heroes—the Kingston Trio, Lindsey long ago cemented his place in the pantheon of guitar gods. Performing his songs 'Shut Us Down', 'Never Going Back Again', and of course the greatest of them all 'Big Love' he really got to show off his skills. One thing that really takes your breath away, aside from his mastery of the instrument, is how much heart and passion Lindsey still puts into every song every time. Maybe it really is a new start for him, and maybe that's why he is showing so much proverbial skin, but regardless of why - the outcome is sensational and of awe.

A huge delight for me was when Buckingham and the boys lit into 'Holiday Road' famed as the theme song to the National Lampoon's Vacation film series. I was hoping he would play this song and was tickled a perfect shade of pink when he did. I've always thought of 'Holiday Road' as a fun retro-ish kind of ditty, but it wasn't until I saw it live that I noticed all of the little nuances and harmonies peppered throughout that really make the song bob and weave around the melody. Good job with that one Buckingham!

After 'Holiday' the band killed it with a set of Fleetwood Mac songs penned by the man of the hour. First was a rousing rendition of 'Tusk', the title track off of one of Fleetwood Mac's most famous albums. If you're not sure which one I'm talking about—this song has become famous for being the one that Mac will typically bring a marching band on stage for. 'I'm So Afraid', another of Lindsey's Fleetwood Mac songs was a nice surprise. It wasn't really a huge single from the band, and I never actually took much notice of it until Lindsey and the boys performed it in front of me, but if you want to check out a sweetly, soulful guitar solo than this is your jam. Next up was 'Go Your Own Way', a song about breaking up with Stevie Nicks in years gone by.

When Buckingham got to 'Turn It On' he took his time introducing the band. He really cares about his guys and shows them great respect when he introduces them. He tells stories about their history together, and their backgrounds in music. Most of his band has been with him on various projects for decades, and the its very evident in the chemistry that came across all night.

After the band intros Lindsey and the boys played 'Down On Rodeo', a song that takes place in reference to the famous strip in Los Angles—not to be confused with riding horses and bulls with a big hat on. The last song of the night was 'Treason', a very poignant song for the current political climate, and even though it was written years ago it still holds true today and is as relevant as ever...maybe more so.

It was a huge surprise when the news slipped out that Lindsey Buckingham and Fleetwood Mac had parted ways. People could hardly believe it...I know I couldn't. When he joined the band, it was on the condition that Stevie Nicks join as well...they were a package deal. Now she's in the band and he's not...go figure. Regardless of that fiasco it appears that Mister Buckingham is feeling no pain and continues to march on. He has great songs, an amazing band, and no plans of retiring any time soon. Thank you, *Elko Productions* and the King Center, for providing us with such a special treat.

My brother from another mother, Steve (Born) Spencer (Southern Fried Genocide, Lost Satellite) has assembled 22 (twenty-two!) Central Florida bands on one CD! Harbor City Vol. 1 is a Who's Who of Brevard, and a few who gig here often. He tells me, "I've been thinking about it for a while. I had a conversation with Ryan Speer at Nerdfest over a year ago, when Boondocks was closing. I was discussing how much of a bummer it was. He made the comment that the bands are still here. It led me to really focus on the idea of band camaraderie. In the past, locally, there was too much competition. The last couple years this competition seems to have eased to foster a rad art community. I see bands encouraged to do better; and experiment a bit. Hopefully this will be the first installment of promoting our eclectic music community." Check out the track listing of the CD on Facebook and be on the lookout to purchase it (complete with original cover art by Kyle Heinly) at upcoming shows and online, just in time for the holidays...

Also available for your eye and ear holes is the first single and video from **Never Ender**. "Nicotine and Nothing Else" was directed by O.P. Garza and filmed in EGAD in October. The song and concept of the video is a "loose story line about a relationship not working out" according to singer/guitarist Kevin Wright. Find the video and Never Ender's debut release "Make It Last" online...Although nothing is recorded as of vet, the buzz on The Easy Uzi's is undeniable. Day Day has been on the scene since I can remember. His style of horror rap and swagger have made him a local legend. He continues to release new music and play local shows like he did in October at Wynfield's in Satellite Beach. FJ **Outlaw** is looking to break out with his fresh sound. A recent CD release show in Melbourne in October adds to his exposure in the county. Add high profile shows opening for traveling musicians and he's set to make waves. Check him out online...

Rounding out our trio spotlight is Darien Torell Davis aka **Darien The Great**. He is an aspiring RnB singer out of Cocoa. To really get and understanding of who he is, we asked him to describe himself. "My sound is; different, versatile, bright, high energy, uplifting, & inspirational. It's that kind of music that'll put you in a good mood, something people can relate to, and it's new but timeless like a classic." Sounds good to us. Check him out at various locations in and around Brevard and Orlando. Online for videos and specific show information.

Our local music scene added a member since last column. Congrats to Jeff and Sandy Daughtridge on the birth of their son Clark. Jeff has also helped birth such notable bands as Jon The Liar and Blame The Tyrant. He can currently be seen and heard in Lost Satellite when he isn't on diaper duty. Also welcoming a new addition to her family is former Brevard resident Lucy Iris. She and her husband welcomed Evangeline Rose to their family (she also has 3 stepchildren) earlier this year. Lucy moved to North Carolina, and as she told me, "It was like a tornado hit my old life and a new bigger life got built on top of it." Some of our peeps suffered some set backs the last few months. Anja Conklin had to cancel some shows (including a Rock the Vote show) due to mono. She's back and better than ever, releasing a new Anja & The Dreamers CD last month. Drummer Tommy Craig's ailment and recovery time was a bit more extensive. "Freak accident. Stepped off ladder onto bucket that wasn't there before and went boom", he tells us. "Broke right arm and wrist upon preparing for the split second crash to earth. Surgery and had bionics

installed." At press time, he was set to rejoin his Pat Travers Band colleagues late last month. "Everything looks good and is healing up. Working my ass off to get back. Gonna feel so good to be back doing what I love." Music to our ears too, Tommy...Good vibes to local singer/songwriter Matt Kateb. He was involved in a serious motorcycle accident in late September that put him in a medically induced coma temporarily. The Lowdown is happy to report that he is continuing his recovery at home. He goes by MK Acoustic at gigs so check out the medical miracle on a stage near you...

Caught a great lineup put on by Blind Anxiety Entertainment back in October at Space Coast Harley. Got to see a lot of great friends/musicians including Breathing Theory (more about them next issue). I have said this out loud but never in print: if Brevard County would let our original music scene shine like it should, it would be nationally recognized. Without a doubt. Tampa's Sunshine and Bullets played a shortened set and waited patiently to entertain. They as well as all the bands that day gave it their all. The dedicated fans who come and support deserve a shout out too. The concern shouldn't be how much noise our bands are making on local news, but the actual creative and talented sounds that we make...

Final word of this edition is past our Sunshine State borders. In another life I was an undergrad at SUNY Fredonia in Western NY. Brian "FaFa" Fasani and I were two drummers who were going to play music even as our hair turned gray. Damned if that is exactly what we are doing. His band **51 Peg** has released *A\VOID*, their first new album in 14 years. A must listen for fans of electronic, grunge and everything in between without sounding dated. The artist in this month's Spotlight is holding it down for the folkys, the hippies, and the gentle revolutionaries. She plays her guitar with skill and purpose, and she sings like ringing a bell. Her words are strong and clear. She sings about people she loves, and she sings about problems we must face. She is about expression, not attention and for these reasons this month's Spotlight is on the incomparable Tina Eno.

When I was younger I worked for a short time at a coffee house in Cocoa Village. The best part of the job was all the live music. Every night there was someone on stage expressing themselves to a room full of caffeine junkies...it was beautiful. When I listen to Tina sing, it takes me back to those days, and that place. I wish it were still around, and I wish I was there listening to Miss Eno tell it like it is.

Eno sings with a sweet, knowing tone. Her voice sounds experienced and skilled. She takes her time...no need to rush...and she clearly explains what she wants you to know with this

ever so soft vibrator that gives me chills. In her song 'I Deserve a Home' she tells about different oppressed populations that "deserve a home," and should be treated with the same respect as anybody else. She isn't afraid to let you know about the wrongs of the world and what she thinks about it. And then she turns inward with 'Hundreds of Years Ago' and invites you into a very intimate space between her and her love. I love the range her songwriting covers, and the way she delivers is loving and true. On a big open stage, or the quiet corner of a café, Tina Eno is always at home with her music and takes you there as well.

In the landscape of today's music, I feel like we are losing touch with real singer-songwriters. Everything is so produced and slick...and loud, I feel like a piece has gone missing. Maybe a piece of the heart that used to drone the beat for revolutionaries like Dylan, and Lennon has gone silent. Or maybe you just have to look a bit harder to find it. Well, when you are ready to see for yourself what I'm talking about head on over to TinaEnomusic on Facebook and give her a listen. Even better go find her at a live venue. No matter where it is, you will think you are sitting in her living room listening to her explain the way her heart and mind navigate this crazy life.

# Double D & The Batteries Carity And Confusion

David Durst, who is originally from Fort Lauderdale but has been residing in Melbourne Beach since 1999, leads the band. All songs are written and performed by David. He does vocals, guitars, and harmonica on the CD. He is joined by Steve Martini on drums, Rich Garrihan on bass and Andrew

Walker on percussion. This is another fine recording done by FIT Studios and The Zone Studios. Mixed and produced by Andrew Walker and David Durst. This is the first CD where the artist actually sends notes about each song on the album. Pretty cool, I think. Gives me some insight lyrically on the content of the songs and what inspired the songwriter.

There were a few things that raised an eyebrow or two. At the 1:16 mark of the tune "You Already Know" I hear a floor tom or ride tom resonate a bit loud. It happens a time or two throughout the CD. On "Oceanfront View" I believe the volume level on the harmonica solo starting at 1:42 could have been a little louder in the mix as well as in the tune "Plant a Seed" at 1:21. I'd like to hear a little more separation of the instruments in the mix over all. That's about it. On to the good stuff!

David Durst is one fine songwriter. These songs are a reflection of life and times in the local area as viewed through the eyes of the artist. Each song is like one of those perfectly made sandcastles you sometimes find at the beach. The acoustical guitar tone and playing is as good as anything out there as evidenced on the tune "Between the Tides". Some excellent percussion in the song also as well as in the tune "Plant a Seed". The song "Clarity", a love song and my favorite, has a Derek and the Dominos feel to it.

All lead guitar solos are well

thought out, not overplayed and compliment the vibe of each tune like the lead on "Confusion" as heard at the 1:22 mark. Another favorite is the song "Butterflies" written about the three teenage girls who lost their lives by a train crossing the Crane Creek some time ago. All tunes on this effort are solid. The rhythm section stays nicely in the pocket as expected with this type of music. Nothing is overplayed and the band meshes well with each other.


The artist had some reservations about including the last song "Joy" on the CD. I won't comment on the content but it does remind me of a time when I played a gig down in Coconut Grove in 1975.

If you love JJ Cale, John Hiatt, Tom Waits you will love this CD. This music will go fine sitting around a bonfire at the beach or having a cold one at your favorite bar and grill! Excellent stuff! # **LOU'S BLUES**

he news hit the Space Coast like a hurricane at the end of summer: Lou's Blues was sold! Thousands of patrons and musicians were left wondering what would happen to Brevard's most popular music venue, the stage where legends had performed, where we go to hear the area's best bands perform, and where the music never stops. Worry no more! New owner Michael Pauline is no party spoiler. "We won't change the format. This place is a landmark and it's always gonna be Lou's Blues," he assures Brevard Live in an interview.

At 6'4" tall and with an infectious smile on his face, Michael is an impressive personality. He is in his early 50s, draws from tons of experience in life and the hospitality business, and the first impression is obvious - this man does not have to prove himself. He's seen it all and knows how to deal with any situation. He will need that because taking over a legendary establishment like Lou's Blues is not an amateur job.

As a matter of fact Michael has worked in the hospitality business for years. Setting up new restaurants, overseeing many venues has been his specialty for years when he worked for Darden Restaurants all over the United States. But to understand his personality we need to start with his humble beginnings.

Michael grew up in a small farming community in Illinois. He experienced family love, neighbors helping neighbors, true friendships, just simple good American values. Being tall and athletic he joined the basketball team in high school and became team captain. With



a scholarship he went off to college where he lead his team to the National Little College Championship when he was 22 years old. Yes, Michael was a great basketball player, so good that the Australian Sports Association approached him to coach in Australia. "I was supposed to stay 6 months and ended up staying 12 years," he tells Brevard Live. The first six years he spent coaching. In the meanwhile he got married to an Australian lady, Kellie Pauline. Then he was approached by a friend to help open a steakhouse in Australia, the Tripple S BBQ & Saloon. Later they opened a second location and Michael managed both. Life was good, Kellie and he had two children, a boy and a girl, everything was perfect.

He was 36 years old when he got the news that his mother was diagnosed with cancer. Michael, being a good son, decided to relocate back to the USA so his mother would have some time to spend with him, his wife and the grand children. His parents had located from Illinois to Alabama, so the Pauline family moved there. Considering his experiences it wasn't hard for Michael to find a good position, first

as assistant manager in a local Longhorn Steakhouse, soon he became a managing partner. He kept on climbing the ladder from regional manager to director of operations. Six years ago he even went to Saudi Arabia to set up a Longhorn Steakhouse. There are probably a lot more career highlights, but Michael is not the bragging type, rather holding back with his interesting career stories. One thing is clear, Michael has done a lot of travelling, setting up businesses, hiring and training people. He recognizes people's potential and knows how to delegate work to the right people. In business that's a rare asset, a know-how which is hard to find. Michael has always been a perfect "team captain" in life.

In 2005 his job led him to Merritt Island, his homestead from where he managed 9 Longhorn Steakhouses on the East Coast and Orlando. He spent a lot of time travelling from location to location, and when Darden asked him to oversee a couple of Bahama Breeze restaurants, he did that too.

When he decided to become his own entrepreneur, it wasn't a difficult choice. "Everyone knows Lou's Blues. Even though I was travelling all the time, I knew it was one of the best venues in Brevard. When I found out it was for sale, it was a no-brainer," explains Michael his next move. After some negotiations, he bought the entire business, property and all.

So what is going to change at Lou's Blues? "Well, the owners," says Michael and points out that his wife Kellie is his partner, even though she still works an intense job as ER nurse. "We are trying to improve the food. The ground beef are fresh patties and we use different fries," he explains, "So far we have received 2 complaints and 40 compliments. We actually have a smaller profit margin on some items but our motto is - quality over price."

Other projects include "tidying up the house," he laughs. "I think we're getting all the bras on the chandelier cleaned and donate them to the Women's Center. Next year we will purchase a lot of pink bras for ladies to throw on the chandelier during October and donate the proceeds to the fight against breast cancer." Yes, Michael has fine ideas but "80 percent will stay the same" and that includes the live performances that have already been booked for the entire year of 2019. And he has some friendly words for the staff that has been nothing but supportive during the transition time. "Jessika is a great help," Michael points out; she's the one who's been booking the live music all along. How about the name? Is it going to be Michael's Blues? "No", he says obviously quite amused. "I bought the name too. It's always going to be Lou's Blues."

It was the 9th of October when Michael took over the reigns at Lou's Blues - in the middle of the Space Coast's Red Tide disaster with dead fish laying on the beach and people have trouble breathing in the air. Not a good start for beach business. But for Michael this was not a real challenge. "There was a day we only made \$20 on our deck," he says, "but I have been around here long enough to know that Red Tide is an occurrence that goes away. We just have to deal with it like storms or hurricanes. It's Florida! Every place has its challenge."

And guess who shows up almost every day? It's Louie! "He sticks his head in and asks if there's anything he can help with. That's very nice of him," laughs Michael. It seems that Michael and Lou have a nice groove.

As for Louie, he has to learn to let go. "Cantina Dos Amigos and Lou's Blues are my footprints in Indialantic," he says to *Brevard Live*. "I am proud of those places and did not want to see them go away." Then he laughs: "I stop in until they tell me to go away." Louie feels strongly that he handed both places over to the right people who will carry on his legacy and make those venues even better.

## LOU'S MOO'S

What's Louie doing? For years he's been a prominent person on the Space Coast running Lou's Blues and Cantina Dos Amigos. He also owned Little Dos in Indian Harbor Beach (which he sold a few years ago) and back in 2000 he opened up Moo's Soft Serve, an ice-cream and hot dog parlor with a patio right on A1A in Indialantic.

Over the past years Lou put Jeff Day, once a bartender at Lou's Blues, in charge of Dos Amigos, and over a month ago he sold Lou's Blues to Michael Pauline. What's left on his watch is Moo's - "just enough to keep me from getting bored," says Lou. It's a place that makes him happy. "Nobody complains about dessert, not even these days," comments Lou while we sit on his patio enjoying some ice-cream. He's having a scoop of chocolate, I indulge into the strawberry flavor with big chunks of strawberries. It tastes great! "That's because everyone else sells ice-milk. We make real ice-cream," explains Lou. That means it includes 10 percent butter fat which gives it the creamy flavor. Who knew that Lou was such an ice-creamexpert? "I didn't know any of that or how to make ice-cream," tells Lou. "We bought the Clover Oil gas station in 2000 within 3 months after I came from Michigan. I kept on looking out of the window at Dos Amigos thinking that it would make a great location for an ice-cream shop right across the beach with no other ice-cream shop around."

Once the property was acquired and remodeled he had to figure out how to make ice-cream. "We didn't even know how to swirl," says Lou, "and for the first 3 days we were given the ice-cream away while learning."

There is another little story that came with the opening: While remodelling, a runner came by every day, stopped and asked "when are you opening?" The answer was "Soon." Then on the day Moo's opened, the runner came by and Lou gave him his cone for free. A short time later several cars pulled up from the "Holy Name Catholic Church" all wanting to buy the real ice-cream. It so happened that the runner was the priest who told his congregation. Soon business was booming and to this day Moo's donates the ice-cream to the annual Fall Fair at the church. "It's this community spirit that I love," admits Louie.


And while he's feeling a lot of stress-relief lately with only one business to run, Lou has more plans for Moo's. He's ordered glass garage doors that can enclose the patio on colder or rainy days. The floor needs to be tiled. He's even bought a fire truck that will get wrapped as a cow and which he wants to take to local events. Stress-relief - really? "Yes, that's fun," is the reply. 

## **HAL SCHWARZE**

is life is dedicated to his art which includes songwriting and creating contemporary abstract oil paintings that sell well. For 22 years Hal Schwarze has lived in the Atlanta area. In 2010 he moved back to Melbourne. He sells his paintings via Facebook, visits local jams, and works with original musicians.



Hal's interest in art came at an early age, in the fourth grade, when he started doodling images in class and garnered the attention of fellow classmates. "How I got there I really have no idea other than perhaps watching cartoons like Spiderman and Batman." His love for art blossomed from there with surf magazine illustrations and comic books at the convenience store. It was about that time he landed his first job washing windows at that store in Indialantic every Wednesday after school and used the money to get a couple of the latest offerings from DC and Marvel!

Then in 1981 while at Melbourne High School he took three years of Commercial Art and two of Engineering/Architectural Drafting and continued drawing. Hal's first published work was a graphic novel strip for Further Magazine, the high school paper. "It was an imaginary story about surfers," remembers Hal who came to Brevard County at age 4 and grew up in Indialantic, back then a small surfing community. He also airbrushed surfboards.

Then music led him astray for a few years. Hal's first band was called Gladhouse and they were gigging in the area with him playing guitar and singing vocals. He started writing his first songs. To this day Hal Schwarze has written hundreds of songs, recorded some, and works with local artist KelMarie on her original music.

In 1988 Hal left Melbourne for Atlanta to attend an Illustration program at The Portfolio Center For Design. After almost two years of that he simply started painting original compositions and sitting on the side of the road with them at various busy intersections around Midtown west of the city near Little Five Points were the hippies and rockers tended to hang out. His first spot was actually the entrance access road that was built for what is now the Jimmy Carter Presidential Library. A lot of semi affluent people from the midtown area in Morningside and Virginia Highlands would cruise down and use the new access road to reach their offices downtown. Hal: "Actually one of my first big sales was to a gentleman who pulled up in a cool slightly older Mercedes Sedan who owned the local hip Pizza Franchise "Fellini's Pizza" and scooped up six paintings for \$600. I ate and drank well that night." Since 2010 he's back in Brevard, living in Melbourne creating his artwork, and sometimes even working a construction job occasionally to supplement his income.

Hal is full of anecdotes, memories from his travels that even led him abroad. He has been to Italy a couple of times, Ireland, and France. His first trip to Italy is an experience he'll never forget: "After already having looked at the books and sold hundreds of pieces of art it wasn't until November 2004 that I actually got overseas thanks to a Delta Airline stewardess friend who offered me a free first class buddy pass ticket if I were to agree to paint her a scene from the Olive Groves in Tuscany. So I did. I awoke on the second morning in a small fourth floor hotel room, oddly enough

called the Orlando Hotel, and went down to Piazza Navona. There are three of Caravaggio's paintings there being that was his favorite stomping ground betting on tennis matches and getting into drunken arguments and arrested a lot of times. One of his most notorious was being arrested for false imprisonment after locking within a sweltering hot attic space a group of so called models holding a cadaver to represent Christ for his famous "The Entombment of Christ." So I walked into the San Luigi dei Francesi Church just on edge of Piazza Navona and when I stood in front of the Triptych of Saint Matthew of Caravaggio, I started gently weeping and had to sit down in the pew cradling my face in my hands. The power and awe of the three paintings simply overwhelmed me."

Another almost equally impact experience were the Bottecellis at the Uffizi in Florence. "They have a dedicated room to house his works and as I stood mesmerized in front of the "Birth of Venus" and "Spring" the esoteric mathematical compositional design dawned upon my conscious and it was just an other worldly experience. On a similar vein seeing "The Taking Of Christ" in Dublin Ireland " was easily as powerful, if not in some way more so. The metal armor of the Temple soldiers glinting in the moonlight as Judas Iscariot leans in to kiss Jesus in front of the crowd there in the garden at Gethsemane. The man at the right with his hand in the air holding a lantern out of sight is actually a self portrait of the artist placing himself in the painting."

The above mentioned artists among the other greats from Leonardo in 1520 through to 1620 with Carravagio have made a great impression on Hal Schwarze. But his influences include all of the painters through the Neoclassical, Romantic, into the early Abstract Expressionists. There, once again in person in France, Degas, Edouard Manet, Monet, Van Gogh, etc. all had certain moments of "AHH ha....I get it!" moments for him. Meaning that Hal understood the reason why these paintings are housed in museums around the world and preserved for posterities sake. "They are something to behold not just stamped on a coffee mug on Amazon.com." Hal also likes contemporary artists including Jeremy Mann, Alex Kanevsky, and from there are numerous Atlanta artists he has known of over the years from Todd Murphy and Radcliffe Bailey in early days to artists like Tommy Taylor, the late T.L. Lange, and his younger brother Jeffrey Lange who is a dear friend to Hal. "I went to many graduating class shows from the schools in Atlanta and Athens Ga and saw student work that was simply amazing. Years of viewing others work goes deep down the hard drive registry and then informs the heart and mind and hand in lucid moments of recall."


Hal also does commissioned work. One of his most valuable sales were six large pieces sold by an Atlanta Gallery for around \$40,000 to the Federal Reserve Home Loan Bank in Atlanta. He once did a large \$3,600 painting for a


dentist who bartered that amount into dental care.

Hal's favorite medium for painting would be oil paint. Favorite overall medium of art would most definitely be music. Hal: "The future of art in my honest observation/ opinion in regards to two dimensional painting has done all it can to keep up with Music and Film and Internet. It at times is treated as an archaic throwback to a historic time when humans actually created with their hands and imaginations."

Asking Hal how he sees himself after his 55 years of life journey, he explains: "There is the deeper side of me that gets lost in contemplation and introspection, writing songs, posting annoying and abrasive internet posts to stir the pot. At the end of most days I am a bit lonely and wanting more, yet grateful for what I have. On that note would be Adelyn Grace, my 3.5 year old daughter that God dropped down on me to help me grow up in some much needed areas."
