#### **NEW DAY'S AHEAD**

resh Squeezed finished playing their gig for the night at Big Daddy's Sin City in Gainesville, and Dave Fiester, Bill Hoffman, my husband John Lane and I had just enough time to make it to the end of the last set of "New Day's Ahead", Kenny Cohen's band who was playing near by. This was a group of musicians, with Kenny as their leader. A group you thought couldn't get any better, but if it had been 6 months since you had seen them play, it would astonish you to hear them. My husband whom if I may


say so, is a very talented bass player, and other talented musicians would back up that statement, had set his goal when he began playing to be the bass player that he felt Kenny Cohen was. To this day John has a tremendous amount of respect for Kenny, as well as musicians such as Austin Pettit and all those who were there in the 60's and are still here today, considered the best musicians of Brevard and beyond due to the things they have achieved. So when we walked in and listened, Dave, Bill and John were all completely silent, taking in

each note from the guitars, and every lick of the drums. I can picture them as if it were yesterday, all 3 with smiles on their faces, happy to be entertained by what they considered the best. This was a time when you embraced another musicians talent, hoped for a chance to jam, and as a fellow player you went out of your way to see those you respected. Kenny was gracious enough to ask the 3 of them to sit in and they weren't going to turn that down. I believe they continued playing even after the club had closed. The world was becoming smaller all the time, here I was with Dave, Bill and John after over 5 years had passed, watching a band that had been my favorite, but once I moved to south Florida, I assumed I would never see again. Everyone knew each other, had played and jammed together, obviously had a great respect for one another, and also very obvious was the fact that Dave and Kenny were not just fellow musicians, but

friends as well.

in the band, and not a very popular or accepted thing by authority groups. They would play anywhere free just for exposure, at parties and gatherings of any sort where anyone would listen. But soon (maybe just over a year) they would be playing local teen centers such as the Bahama Club which would have as many as 1,000 teens in one night. The Tiger's Den, and the Canaveral Pier on weekend nights and Sunday afternoons, all of these at the top of the list for the most popular places. Teens would count the days until the weekend just to go to these places and see the bands, I know, I was one of them. The "Group's" reputation had already built itself up to a very high level. Everyone was beginning to know who they were. They played the Orlando Teen Club, which once you played this particular venue, people knew you were good. And with their extraordinary talent they were grouped with bands such as "The Nightcrawlers" from Daytona Beach, and "The Tropics" from Tampa who played so many gigs in Brevard you would have thought they were local bands. But the Night Crawlers became nationally known for their song "Little Black Egg", a song which was usually the first song a guitarist of that time would learn to play when first beginning. I know it was John's. And I don't think anyone, including me, is sure to this day what it was about, but it was a big hit, and I guess it doesn't matter. I suppose I'm trying to make the point that The Group was working it's way up at an

extremely fast pace, and at a time when the competition was pretty fierce and there were countless bands in the area.

Soon they were playing all over the state as the "Fantastic Group", and it wasn't for free. They were being paid what some bands make to this day! They had their "band" Volkswagen van to carry their equipment, equipment worth over \$10,000 in guitars, drums, amps, speakers, etc. The year I'm talking about is 1966. Imagine what that would amount to today. And they even had a manager. Again, it was just over a year ago they would play anywhere, anytime, for free, just to be heard. But it was also after a lot of very hard work and determination. Maybe that's why Kenny and Dave Fiester would become such very good friends and fellow musicians and remain so until Dave's passing. They had so many things in common, talent, determination, a love of music that can't be put into words which they both devoted their lives to, and the music had to be good, something they could feel proud of (you can still go listen to the sounds of Kenny today, more popular and respected than ever). But at this time where Dave and Kenny were different, Dave perhaps because he was a little younger, liked to stick close to home, whereas, Kenny a little later, seemingly thought nothing of loading up the van along with the other band members and taking off to California to take a try at it. A very brave move at such an early age. During the days of "The Fantastic Group" Kenny was 18 years old, Steve Bland 16, Ronnie Cable 17, Jimmy Rudolph 17 and Jim Nielsen 17 years old as well. It's hard to imagine when you think about it now. And most of the

other musicians of the area just weren't quiet ready for such a drastic step yet. There was no guarantee of what you might come up against, and you couldn't just drive home that night after the gig. The band had a time of it in California, but after returning home it wouldn't slow them down or lessen their determination to be able to play what and where they wanted, which they did, and their popularity continued to grow.

The music at that time changed so quickly, along with what was expected of a band by the audience. It was the 60's, and if you didn't live them, read about it, the whole world was changing, and the impact on the younger people is something you had to be there to understand. There is no way I can describe it. But along with everything else, music changed drastically over night from Ricky Nelson and Frankie Avalon to England's newest hit, The Rolling Stones, along with The Beatles, The Byrds (whom Kenny and his band would open for at Canaveral Pier), The Kinks, James Brown, Simon and Garfunkel, and of course Bob Dylan, extremely radical for the times. Some parents would not allow their kids to listen to Dylan. There are far too many groups to name that appeared from no where and set the music scene and the feel of the times, and I'm sure it was hard as a musician to keep up, but if you didn't you got left behind. Although I think your better musicians enjoyed the challenge. If they didn't have that goal they could become bored, but that was never the case in this particular era.

The Tropics and The Nightcrawlers seemed to fade away, but the "The Fantastic Group" was not only still playing but going strong and opening for national headliners such as Percy Sledge, known for his infamous and timeless song, "When A Man Loves A Woman", still played by so many bands today, and loved by the audience who is taken back to another time. Opening for an act like this was not something just any band would have a chance to do, especially a group which was literally teenagers.

#### **R&B LEGEND LEON RUSSELL**

Room mostly as a session musician, Leon Russell has played with artists as varied as Jerry Lee Lewis, Phil Spector and The Rolling Stones. With a solo career spanning the genres of rock, blues, and gospel, Russell began his musical career at 14, lying about his age to land a gig playing backup at a Tulsa nightclub to play with Ronnie Hawkins behind Jerry Lee Lewis. Two years later, after settling in Los Angeles, he studied guitar with James Burton, and worked sessions with Dorsey Burnette and Glen Campbell.

After becoming a part of Phil Spector's studio group, Russell played backup on many of the most popular hits of the 1960s, including The Byrds, Gary Lewis and the Playboys, and Herb Alpert. He also served as Snuff Garrett's assistant on numerous productions. Russell built his own recording studio in 1967, and recorded his first LP, Look Inside the Asylum Choir, in a collaboration with Marc Benno.

His first songwriting hit was Joe Cocker's 1970 cover of "Delta Lady", and Russell went on to organise Cocker's Mad Dogs and Englishmen tour. Shortly thereafter, Russell released another solo album, Leon Russell, which included the popular "A Song for You".

For several years, he stayed largely out of the music



spotlight, releasing Anything Can Happen in 1992, and then releasing two more albums in 1998 and 1999. Russell continues touring, often on nostalgia tours, sometimes with Willie Nelson. He now tours the world with his two daughters, Tina Rose and Sugaree Noel.

#### **KENNY G**

nour current "fifteen minutes of fame, what was your name?" society, it's hard to imagine a musician achieving anything close to longevity anymore. It's hard enough for a musician to get one album made, let alone a whole career's worth. This seems to especially hold true for modern instrumental musicians, who must search for an audience somewhere between symphony season ticket holders, jazz junkies, and rock radio surfers. Somehow, even with all the changes in the current music industry, Kenny G has defined himself as one of the most successful solo instrumentalist of the last several decades. The soprano saxophone player brings his signature style to the Maxwell C. King Center for the Performing Arts on Sunday, April 9th at 7 pm.

G's visit to the Space Coast venue (that G by the way, stands for Gorelick) is in support of his tour to promote his latest musical offering, 'The Essential Kenny G.' The two disc set was released this past January and marks his seventeenth full length studio album. The records are a greatest hits collection and contain some of G's most classic tracks. 'The Essential Kenny G' comes as a followup to 2004's successful 'At Last...The Duets.' That album was a collection of covers done with notable partners, and the result is a very memorable compilation of duets. Performing on the disc with G are famous singers and songwriters like Burt Bacharach, Barbara Streisand, LeAnn Rimes and Chaka Khan.

Originally hailing from Seattle, Washington, G got his start in the

professional music industry while first performing with the late (and great) Barry White's Love Unlimited Orchestra in 1976. Coming from a group that dealt primarily in soul music might explain why G seems to exist in a classification of music all his own. His tendency to avoid improvisation in both his studio recordings and live performances have given him somewhat of a stigma among by-the-book jazz aficionados. While it's true that he doesn't fully embrace the highly respected musical technique, no one can claim that G doesn't have a signature style of his own. Having only been slightly influenced by jazz/R & B saxophonist Grover Washington Jr., G has clearly paved his own way to establishing a place for himself among both jazz and pop fans.

The highlight of the festival is the renowned fine art show featuring works from local areas and from around the nation. Participants compete for cash awards in several categories, and many thousands of original pieces of art will be on display and for sale, including bronzes, paintings, photography, wood, clay, metal and glass sculptures, jewelry, batiks and more!

The MAF has been ranked in the top 100 fine art shows nationwide for over 10 years and is most recently ranked as the 25th best fine art show nationwide by Sunshine Artists Magazine. #### **MAF 2006 ROCKS:**

## **PAT TRAVERS**

Joe Perry, and Ted Nugent, Pat Travers inspired a generation of rock guitarists during the 70s and 80s the way Hendrix, Clapton, Beck, and Page did a decade earlier. And after 30 years on the international scene, he is still considered by many to be one of the finest, edgiest, and imaginative blues-based, rock guitarists around.

After touring in the early 70s with 50's rocker Ronnie Hawkins, Canadian born guitarist Pat Travers set his sights on a solo career. Just barely in his 20s, he released his blistering self-titled debut record in April 1976. Along with bassist Mars Cowling and drummer Roy Dyke, The Pat Travers Band began building a loyal European audience. However, after two more records (Making Magic and Putting It Straight), changing overseas musical tastes due to the growing popularity of punk rock created a need for the group to relocate in North America and begin focusing on the good ole' U.S. of A.

The year was 1978. Ted Nugent was overdosing on his own ego while America's other top grossing rock act Aerosmith were overdosing on other pleasures. The time was right for a new rock hero and Pat Travers stepped up to the plate and delivered arguably his finest work Heat In The Street. Although the album wasn't exactly a huge commercial success, musically Travers had "the goods" and was building momentum. Along with Cowling and new recruits, drummer Tommy Aldridge and guitarist Pat Thrall the band hit the road and they toured hard for the next year. The end result was the legendary live record Go For What You Know. Featuring the classic hit Boom, Boom, Out Go The Lights, the album perfectly captured the energy, heart and soul of this hungry (and still relatively new) band. Go For What You Know hit the Top 30 and became Pat Travers' first gold record.

Travers returned in 1980 with the album Crash And Burn. While the new studio record certainly offered die hard fans plenty of hard-hitting, blues-based gems like Born Under A Bad Sign and the monster FM hit Snortin' Whiskey, it was

also a departure of sorts as Travers began "dabbling" heavily in keyboards. Quickly, Crash And Burn became Travers's second consecutive Top 30 gold album.

Wearing glasses and sporting a short "preppy type" haircut, a "new" Pat Travers re-emerged onto the scene in 1981 with an even heavier keyboard influenced record entitled Radio Active. With his new "college professor" look and without Cowling, Aldridge, and Thrall in the band to "bring it home" live, the less "rocking" Radio Active album failed to appeal Travers core audience (or anyone else) and barely reached the Top 50.

Over the next couple of years Travers got back to basics with albums like Black Pearl and Hot Shot. His tune I La La Love You was featured on the Valley Girl movie soundtrack and he even enjoyed airplay on the fledgling MTV network in 1984 with a video for the song "Just Another Killer Day."

He continued touring with other such top-name acts as Kiss and Rainbow, however, in 1984 "hair metal" was already becoming the craze and bands like Motley Crue, Quiet Riot, and Ratt quickly began challenging "dinosaurs" like Blue Oyster Cult and Foghat for prime chart positions.


Since then Travers continued to tour and is still a wildly popular attraction overseas and on the U.S. club scene. In recent years he's gone back to his blues roots releasing records like 1993's Blues Tracks and his current album, 2005's PT=MC2.

## **RODNEY CROWELL**

Grammy winner Rodney Crowell will be performing on stage at this year's Melbourne Art Festival with guitarist Will Kimbrough. Rodney Crowell has been making waves in the music business since his arrival in Nashville in the early 1970's. He fell in with a group of "misfit songwriters" that included Townes Van Zandt, Steve Earle, John Hiatt and Guy Clark. He joined Emmy Lou Harris' legendary Hot Band in 1975 shortly after landing two of his earliest songs, "Til I Can Gain Control Again" and "Bluebird Wine" on Harris's first album.

The Texas born singer-songwriter earned a Grammy in 1988 off a cut from Diamonds and Dirt, an album that yielded five straight #1 country singles. Crowell married Rosanne Cash in 1979. Crowell produced several of Cash's hit songs and albums, including Seven Year Ache. They divorced in

1992. After the obligatory break up album, 1992's Life is Messy, he split from the music business in 1995 and retreated to life as a single parent.

After several years Crowell returned to recording in 2001 with The Houston Kid, a largely autobiographical album that delved deeply into his rough and tumble upbringing. The album earned him loads of critical praise. In 2003 he recorded and released Fate's Right Hand, a chronicle of his recent mid-life struggles.

The release of The Outsider in 2005 earned him two Grammy nominations in 2006 – one for Best Contemporary Folk Album and for Best Vocal Collaboration with Emmy Lou Harris on Dylan's "Shelter from the Storm," a cut off the album. The Outsider features Will Kimbrough on guitar, and a gaggle of great guest vocalists including Buddy and Julie Miller, John Prine, Beth Nielsen Chapman and Emmy Lou Harris.





#### THE HILLS HAVE EYES





#### CONSPIRACY? WHAT CONSPIRACY?

The Federal Reserve System was covertly and unconstitutionally created by European bankers in December of 1912. I know what you're thinking. So what? Why should I care about something



so seemingly trifling? Well, 'tis the season as they say, so I thought you might want to know the truth about the Federal Reserve Banks' goon squad: the IRS. The Internal Revenue Service is the collection agency for the Federal Reserve. All of the money you pay in income tax goes to this private corporation. Originally there were only four Federal Reserve banks. Now, I think there are twelve. All answer to the main branch in New York. Like I said before they are a private corporation, and not a part of the U.S. government. And remember, these guys take all your money. At any rate, the 16th Amendment was supposedly ratified in December of 1913.

I wish I had the space to tell the whole sordid story, but I don't. Even though most of us conspiracy nuts question the validity of the ratification of the 16<sup>th</sup> Amendment, which states. 'Congress shall have the power to lay and collect taxes on income, from whatever source derived .', it doesn't really make a difference. 



#### **REMEMBERING ANNELI ZEPKA!**

Of all the articles I have written for Brevard Live, this one is the most difficult. It is difficult because I am writing about a dear friend to all of us who past away recently.

For those of you that never had the pleasure of meeting her, you missed out on a very special person, The lady had class, style, an infectious laugh, and always had a smile. I know from personal experience that she was a true friend to a vast amount of people.

I speak for so many that knew this special woman. Our hearts and deep-felt sympathy goes out to another great friend, her husband Kevin. He adored her. She was his queen, and he treated her as such. And to Kevin and Anneli's families, even though she was with us a short time, she packed more years into life than I have ever seen.

From my wife Pam and I, this is not goodbye Anneli, this is good luck. I know right now you are somewhere drinking wine, slapping backs and singing Bo Diddley.

We will miss you dear.




Greg sings lead vocals and plays

# **DAN JUNK - Which Way**

18 Song CD

X Jow, there's so much going on here that I don't know where to begin. For starters let me say that Dan Junk is a supremely talented guy. In fact, with the exception of just one song that he co-wrote, Dan wrote every song and plays every instrument on this eclectic 18 song collection. And eclectic is the key word here. Perhaps a bit too eclectic. The opening track Antarctica is an impressive and sophisticated new age number. Unfortunately, just as I began to get totally psyched about discovering what I thought was a new Windham Hill-type hero, he switched gears on the very next tune, delivering the neighborhood brew-n-cue-ish Let's Do What We Do Best. In fact, that's really the only downer about this otherwise incredible record. Dan jumps back and forth throughout the entire hour-plus opus


Upstairs is quite different, the "Lava Bar" presents itself with the chic of a big city martini bar with decks overlooking the downtown area.

Last fall he was a hero: Brian Bobb was walking along the beach in Indialantic when he heard a swimmer calling for help. The "boardwalk musician" didn't hesitate to jump into the water and help the would-be drowning



victim, 29-year-old Jeremiah Chapman, safely to the beach.

But this is not the happy ending. Once the paramedics arrived, they found the rescuer, Brian Bobb, laying face down - he had suffered a heart attack, survived but became partially disabled. "I cannot perform my job as a building contractor like I did before," says Brian who owns Design by Brian Inc. "I have my good days and my bad days." Therefore funds are running low, and Brian is singing the blues. To support himself during these hard times, Brian sells his CD with the song "Rescue Sea" that he wrote after the incident for \$5 at his gigs.





# STILL GOT THE WINTER-BLUES?

We all seem to get a little down in the winter, especially during non-daylight savings time. Shorter days, less light, no tan! Is it all in our head?

Some people suffer from symptoms of depression during the winter months with symptoms subsiding during the spring and summer. This cycle of depression may be a sign of seasonal affective disorder (SAD), a mood disorder associated with depressive episodes that are related to seasonal variations of light. A significant percentage of the U.S. population, especially in northern latitudes, is affected negatively by the shorter days of fall and winter. Epidemiological studies of individuals with SAD demonstrated that four to ten percent of the general population suffers from SAD. Also, the incidence is higher in women than men. People diagnosed with SAD experience severe changes in mood, energy, and appetite.

Specifically, the SAD syndrome often consists of depression, fatigue, carbohydrate craving, weight gain, and loss of libido. For an individual to be diagnosed with SAD, the symptoms must occur only in the fall/winter and be absent in the spring/summer. In fact, the SAD symptoms

will begin to lessen as the days grow longer. However, some reports indicate that there are individuals with SAD who go to the other extreme in the spring and summer, thus experiencing a manic state. Although seasonal changes in daylight appear to influence the incidence of SAD, the exact mechanism by which SAD symptoms arise from these seasonal changes is not understood. Currently, three hypotheses exist and relate to melatonin, phase-shift, and serotonin.

Melatonin: Melatonin is a hormone produced in the pineal gland that regulates circadian rhythms (sleep-wake cycles). Its production is stimulated by darkness and inhibited by light. Research reveals that individuals with SAD have a longer period of melatonin synthesis during winter nights resulting in higher daytime levels. The melatonin hypothesis argues that SAD is due to excessive melatonin being secreted in response to the long, dark days of

winter.

Phase-shift: Lewy and Sack first formulated the phase-shift hypothesis, which proposes that in patients with SAD, the circadian rhythms have been desynchronized to the light-dark cycle. This hypothesis was constructed after research demonstrated that bright morning light could alter the circadian rhythm and lead to an anti-depressant effect.

Serotonin: Because melatonin is the immediate downstream metabolite of serotonin, the serotonin hypothesis states that low brain levels of serotonin contribute to SAD symptoms. The idea is that serotonin levels in the brain are much lower during the winter months in patients with SAD. Also, SAD patients tend to exhibit overeating and carbohydrate cravings. These symptoms can be indicative of inadequate brain serotonin.

It has been suggested the increased carbohydrate cravings in SAD may be a coping mechanism that stimulates the release of serotonin. Yet another finding adds credence to the serotonin hypothesis: ingestion of tryptophan, as well as serotonin reuptake inhibitor drugs, has been shown to improve the symptoms of SAD.

Currently there are four different therapies for SAD. Regardless of mechanism, the least invasive, most natural, and most researched treatment for SAD is light therapy. Light therapy has been shown to be an effective treatment of SAD as indicated by an overall positive treatment response of up to 70%, with rarely any side effects. Other therapies include tryptophan, St. John's wort (Hypericum perforatum), and melatonin.

So you can lay in a tanning bed, try supplements, or get a new job! The most important thing is that you get sunlight everyday! It really does make a huge difference in the way you feel. It's not just in your head! It's actually in your brain, chemistry that is! Thanks for learning with me!

Internationally acclaimed concert pianist and Professor Emeritus of Rutgers University Samuel Dilworth-Leslie will be performing at the King Center in the intimate setting of the Studio Theatre on Saturday, April 1st, at 7:30 pm. The recital will feature masterpieces of Haydn, Schumann, Faure, Ravel, Albeniz and Chopin.

Mr. Dilworth-Leslie, a resident of Magnolia Springs has performed across the U.S. and throughout Europe and is recognized by his peers as an authority on the



works of Gabriel Faure. His recordings have been highly praised by European and American critics.

He trained under some of the more notable teachers and concert pianists, including Nadia Boulanger, Rubinstein and Casadesus. In addition to his concert schedule, Mr. Dilworth-Leslie has presented numerous lectures on Chopin and Faure and has served as adjudicator for many national and international piano competitions.

# **YOLANDA SCHOFIELD**





Yolanda Schofield finds great joy in her artwork. It's wonderful to have such a passion for your work. For example, early in her career she designed window displays for women's specialty shops. To this day, she remembers that

first job fondly. "I would wake up too early to go to work. I enjoyed it so much," she said.

Art has always been the center of Schofield's life. Her mother recognized her talent early on and encouraged her, providing private tutors to help develop her talents. Schofield attended Boston University where she earned a BS degree in applied art education.

After college, she began window display work (first in Boston, then Hartford, and later in New York). As a freelance artist, clients often called her to design backgrounds for fashion shows, and she found herself especially busy during the holidays. Display work had it all. She loved the three-dimensional composition – the line, design, and color – of it. As she said, "What more could you want?"

Schofield's husband worked for the Boy Scouts of America. In 1963, he was transferred to the Transatlantic Council in Europe. First they lived in Germany for six months, and then they moved to Italy for two and a half years. When they moved to Europe, Schofield was forced to move beyond display work. During that time, she produced many watercolor sketches – a combination of pen, ink, and watercolor. She also painted with oils. To capture the essence of Italy, she focused on the antiquities and landmarks. This focus became a recurrent theme of her artwork that has continued to this day. Schofield reminisced that living in Italy, "...was a dream. I'd walk down the streets and think that this is like a stage set."

When they returned to the United States in 1966, Schofield and her husband lived in Massachusetts. At that time, she began a career teaching art to first grade through junior high students in the public schools. In 1973, her husband's job moved them to Geneva, New York. She taught art in the parochial schools in Geneva for four more years before Schofield decided to go out on her own and draw for a living.

She loved being near the Finger Lakes and once again became inspired by the many historic landmarks of that area of New York. She drew a landmark or two and took them to the editor of the paper and proposed that the paper run a series of articles where they would periodically publish one of her drawings with her text of its historical background. The paper accepted her proposal and published her historic works from 1975 until 1992.

These publications brought attention to her drawings, and she started to receive commissions to draw people's homes and other historic buildings in the area. In addition to private commissions, she received commissions from hospitals, banks, VISA companies, colleges (Syracuse University, Hobart and William Smith Colleges, Keuka College), Boy Scouts (for calendars and drawings), Girl Scouts (for posters), and Ducks Unlimited, who hired her to do their annual print.

During her time in the Finger Lakes, Schofield spent a good deal of time investigating and drawing the ruins of the Erie Canal. This resulted in a series of nineteen drawings, which she just recently sold as a set to the Lions National Bank. And, she was one of eight artists asked to exhibit in the World Canals Conference in 2000.

Brevard County is lucky that Schofield extended her interest in historic landmarks to Florida when she and her husband retired and moved to Palm Bay in 1990. After moving to Florida, she soon followed her interest in history and was commissioned to draw a visualization of Fort Ann on Merritt Island. To make the drawing, she had to slog through woods with a guard from Cape Canaveral to reach the site of the original fort, and then she visited Fort Christmas in Christmas, Florida, to see the reconstruction of a fort of similar style.

Schofield has drawn many buildings and historic landmarks in this area. She is committed to preserving the history of our county. Her statement that, "When putting in new developments, developers should be made to restore one or two historic landmarks," shows her point on this issue. She sees it as a way we can continually replenish what is important to all of us.

Since moving to Florida, Schofield has been active in the Strawbridge Art League. She has been involved in the planning of three exhibits focusing on landmarks and Florida, and she is currently the chairperson for Landmarks—Our Heritage, which will be on exhibit at the Henegar Center for the Arts in May. This exhibit will focus on ten Brevard County historic landmarks. Each year ten more landmarks will be featured and the members of the Strawbridge Art League will depict these historic treasures through their favorite mediums. Schofield hopes this will bring attention to the importance of our heritage.

"Change my own oil!" comes his response. - Schooling? "The Ear and Eye Institute for the Possibly Talented!"


