






Presh Squeezed had found its next stop, and it was Daytona Beach. (I love the emails and letters I have received from those who remember and were fans of the band.) For those of you who were either too young, lived out of the area, for whatever reason may not remember the name Fresh Squeezed, it was a band consisting of Dave Fiester on lead guitar and lead vocals, Bill Hoffman on drums, Jack Sullivan also on drums and vocals, John Lane on bass and Roy Zito on keyboards and harp. Although I have to give credit where credit is due, Bill did sing a Z.Z. Topp song "Gimme Two Steps." And Jack would give Dave a break on vocals with

songs such as Howling Wolfs "Built For Comfort." As for John, to this day no one has been able to get the first note out of him, even though many have made it a challenge just to see who would win. My money will always be on John. Some may remember a different lineup of musicians in a later band with the same name, because after the break up of the original version I just mentioned, Dave chose to keep the name "Fresh Squeezed" for the next musicians he would put together as a band.

Fresh Squeezed seemed to be hanging in there as far as gigs, but there were times when it just wasn't enough, both financially and for the moral of the band members, more so the moral. They were trying to make it on their own at a time when so many clubs were basically closed out to anyone who did not have a manager, or belong to the union. This is exactly why we were all sitting around the hotel anxiously waiting for a promoter who promised that he would take Fresh Squeezed wherever and however far they wanted to go. I guess I was always a little leary of anyone who promised so much, but as I mentioned before, Dave was full of optimism at that time, and the rest of the guys, whether they were optimistic or not so sure, like



Dave, they wanted so badly to build their lives around music, they were willing to try pretty much anything. So we sat and waited, and finally he arrived, as well as I can remember, dressed in a power suit with a styled haircut that said he could do anything he promised, and a very aggressive personality with just the right amount of smooth talk, which is what it took for the club owners. not anything that would or did impress the members of the band, but that wasn't as important as impressing the club owners.

Everyone in the band gathered in the hotel room to see what he had to say. Something this big, every person had to be there to help make the decision of whether or not he was what the band needed or even wanted. So. everyone sat down and he proceeded to sell himself. But it wasn't long before the band wasn't buying anything he had to sell. He first lost everybody real fast when he started talking pink jumpsuits, which they were supposed to wear!! It was great for David Bowie at the time. but I cannot for the life of me imagine anyone in this band wearing a jumpsuit, least of all pink!! They were blue jean and work shirt guys. But least of all could I picture a 6 foot 4 inches Dave, who between his height and build made everyone else look small, bellowing out Johnny Winter and playing his guitar the way he did, being taken seriously standing there in a jumpsuit. I think there was a real good chance that this guy would have been thrown out on his ears, but I think continued next page



everyone was in shock and couldn't believe what they were hearing. And as if that weren't enough, he continued talking, telling the band what it would take to make it, which included Dave who was the front man trying to imitate and put on a show like Frankie Vallie of the "Four Seasons" for the audience. If you don't know who he is, just trust me when I say that there was no way that Dave would go for that. Putting aside the music that Dave loved, it would be like giving up his man hood.

Everyone finally took in what this guy was asking them to do, and need I tell you he was history. I'm not sure when everyone could start laughing about this incident instead of feeling insulted like they would never be insulted again, but I do remember a lot of talking about it and getting upset for the next few days, maybe even weeks. Such a disappointment and let down, what to do next. Did this guy really think for a minute that what he asked would work with and for this band? Did they hear him correctly and he really wanted them to become the type of band they thought they heard him suggest? It was still unbelievable. He was going to try (or so he thought) to take a great "Southern Rock" band and turn it into a "glitter or glam rock" band. In his mind this would make them much more marketable. But this was a band that played Allman Brothers, Lynard Skynard, Outlaws, Marshall Tucker, Molly Hatchet, and the list goes on and on. This was who Fresh Squeezed was. Even though glam/glitter rock was hitting its peak and becoming popular, only to become more popular in the next few years to come, there was no desire (even if it were possible) on anyone's part to become a group like Queen, David Bowie during his Ziggy Stardust and Alladin Sane phases, Gary Glitter, and Kiss. If they never worked again it just wasn't going to happen. This isn't who they were and that could never be changed anymore than Dave could have been convinced that he didn't care if he played blues and southern rock versus glitter and wore a pink jumpsuit versus blue jeans. I do remember some of the guys along with myself really enjoying listening to some of David Bowie's songs at the time. Who can forget "Space Odyssey"? But that was where it ended. David Bowie was who he was and the same applied to David Fiester and the rest of the guys.


June 24th, 9 PM, Sebastian Beach Inn: COMMANDER CODY ROCKS SPACE COAST

Commander Cody and His Lost Planet Airmen is a rock band formed in 1967 in Ann Arbor, Michigan. The band's name was inspired by 1950s film serials featuring the character Commando Cody and by a feature version of an earlier serial, King of the Rocket Men, released under the title "Lost Planet Airmen". The band's founder and leader, George Frayne, took the stage name Commander Cody.

Commander Cody And His Lost Planet Airmen arrived in San Francisco in 1969, just in time to catch the tail end of the summer of love. They were 8 pieces strong, with the Commander himself (a.k.a. George Frayne) on the piano, three guitarists, fiddle/sax, pedal steel guitar, bass and drums - of whom four sang lead.

The repertoire stretched from old time rock and roll; 20 FLIGHT ROCK, red neck country; TRUCK DRIVIN' MAN, boogie-woogie; BEAT ME DADDY 8 TO THE BAR, Cajun; DIGGY LIGGY LO, swing/jazz; SMOKE, SMOKE, SMOKE THAT CIGARETTE, plus their self-penned party anthems; TOO MUCH FUN, I'M DOWN TO SEEDS AND STEMS AGAIN, and LOST IN THE OZONE. Basically, they represented the essence of American roots music.

Eventually, they signed with Paramount Records. The twangy HOT ROD LINCOLN was a runaway hit, reaching the top ten in 1972. A few more tunes breached the top 40 as they hit the concert trail, playing the legendary Fillmore Auditorium, and finding themselves on bills with the Grateful Dead, The Doors, The Jefferson Airplane, Alice Cooper, Led Zeppelin and The Eagles. They also backed up legends Gene Vincent, Link Wray and John Lennon. Later, their 1974 album



"Live From Deep in the Heart of Texas" was named as one of Rolling Stones 100 Greatest of all times!

As always, the old Commander Cody himself is behind the piano, leading the musical mayhem and controlled chaos, and sporting his legendary antics and ability to spark up even the toughest crowds.

Today the Commander Cody Band is closely knit with the legendary George Frayne a.k.a. "The Commander" (leader /keyboards/vocals), Steve Barbuto (drums/vocals), Rick Mullen (bass) and Mark Emerick on lead guitar and vocals. Frequent guest steel guitar appearances by Bobby Black, Tiny Olson, John Wingren and Don E. Curtis of Scotty's Music add to the fun. This new edition of the band harks back to the instrumental virtuosity and spontaneity of the original band, and the response from critics and crowds has been overwhelmingly positive.

Steve has been back up guitarist for Razzy Bailey, Tom Wopat (Luke Duke on Dukes of Hazard), Bobby Bare, Montey Holmes, Jeannie C. Riely ("Harper Valley PTA"), Robert Nix (Atlanta Rythym Section), Artimus Pyle (Lynyrd Skynyrd) and many more.

Mark Murry, formerly of The Trunk Band, is on electric and acoustic guitar, slide guitar, and vocals. While touring, Mark has shared the stage with greats such as The Greg Allman Band, Dickey Betts, Bo Didley, Lightnin' Hopkins, Brian Setzer, Charlie Daniels and Marshall Tucker.

Pug Baker on drums, born in London England, came to the U.S.A. when he was 5 years old and was raised in Los Angeles. Some of the bands that Pug has played drums for are: Rocking Horse on RCA records, Jimmey Spheeris on Epic and Columbia, Waves on Epic Records, The Knack on Capitol Records, Chakris on Reprise Records and more. Pug wrote an entire album with Johnathan Cain, the keyboardist from Journey, which had the top 40 hit, "Holdin' On". and co-wrote the song "Photo Play" for The Terminator movie.

ROCK LEGENDS



At age 18, the Worchester England native teamed up with Steve Winwood, Jim Capaldi and Chris Wood to form the legendary band Traffic. At 19, Mason penned the song "Feelin' Alright". This song has since become a rock and roll anthem, having been recorded by well over 48 artists, the best known version is by Joe Cocker. The group's profound influence over rock music remains unquestioned.

Mason departed from the group after their second album. In 1969 Dave headed for the USA to pursue a solo career. He struck gold with the album "Alone Together", which is considered a rock classic. This was followed by five albums for CBS/ Sony including "Dave Mason" and "Mariposa De Oro", four of which received gold albums. "Let It Flow", which has gone well over platinum, contained the classic "We Just Disagree", a top-ten single!

In addition to performing to sold-out audiences. Mason has performed on a number of albums. The Rolling Stones' "Beggars's Banquet", George Harrison's "All Things Must Pass", Paul McCartney's "Listen To What The Man Said" and Jimi Hendrix's "Electric Ladyland". One song from the "Ladyland" album, "All Along the Watchtower", featured Dave playing acoustic guitar. This song, written by Bob Dylan, remains a big favorite in Dave's live show!

In October of 1993, Dave Mason formally joined the legendary group Fleetwood Mac and spent two years touring with them around the world. The band completed an album for Warner Brothers called "Time", which was released in October 1995, and features Dave's lead vocals on songs including "Blow By Blow" and "I Wonder Why".

Dave Mason's career spans over 37 years and has encompassed producing, performing and song writing, not to mention being one of rock's great guitar players! Along with his induction as a founding member of the group Traffic into the Rock and Roll Hall Of Fame, he is currently putting the finishing touches to a brand new solo album. In January. Along with his partner Ravi Sawhney, Dave launched a brand new electric guitar company at the 2004 NAMM show, in Anaheim, CA. (www.rksguitars.com)

Spyro Gyra, a name in contemporary jazz that has come to signify excellence! Founding group member saxophonist Jay Beckenstein, is joined by keyboardist Tom Schuman, guitarist Julio Fernandez, Scott Ambush on bass, and drummer Ludwig Afonso. Take a sweet mix of vibrant contemporary jazz, fusion and R&B, add in the spirit of improvisation and you have the dynamics of this talented group of musicians. Feel the explosive excitement as the band creates infectious melodies, zesty Latin rhythms and the rich sound that is jazz!

Spyro Gyra emerged around Jay Beckenstein and keyboardist Jeremy Wall, who had met and formed a band during their high school years. Although they headed in different directions during college—Beckenstein to the State University of New York in Buffalo and Wall to Cal Arts—they spent summers together playing outdoor concerts, and Wall moved to Buffalo soon after graduating.

Beckenstein had been working in clubs in Buffalo since his junior year of college, backing various vocalists. Wall teamed up with Beckenstein, and the two started playing instrumental music—mostly covers of R&B songs—together. In Beckenstein's description of the Buffalo club scene of the time: "Not many people know it, but Buffalo was like a mini Chicago back then, with a smoking blues, soul, jazz, even rockabilly scene, of all things."

Over a year, their work evolved into Spyro Gyra. Wall has commented that their sound was a "gutbucket of rhythmic tradition. We did simple music and esoteric stuff. It all came together, this oddball mix, until we found a middle ground, our own groove". The name "Spyro Gyra" is a misspelling of spirogyra, a kind of algae on which Beckenstein had written a college biology paper years earlier. He recalls: "Before a gig in a Buffalo club that was called Jack Daniels, the owner twisted my arm for a band name. As a joke, I remembered the paper and said, 'Spirogyra'. He misspelled it 'Spyro Gyra,' advertised it that way, and it stuck."



The Rippingtons are a contemporary or Fusion jazz group known for smooth jazz. Formed in 1986 by guitarist and band leader Russ Freeman (not to be confused with the jazz pianist of the same name), their career has, so far, spanned almost two decades. In the early to mid 90s they were more of a jazz/rock instrumental band, but since 1999 they have developed into more Smooth Jazz. Current members are Russ Freeman (guitar, keyboard), Dave Karasony (drummer), Bill Heller (pianist), Kim Stone (bassist), Scott Breadman (percussionist), Eric Marienthal (saxophonist). Past members have included Jeff Kashiwa, Brandon Fields, David Benoit, Tony Morales, Kenny G, and Steve Reid, to name a few.

Ringo's "AllStarrs" Are Legends On Their Own

t's the most spectacular concert Brevard has ever seen: Legendary "Beatle" **Ringo Starr performs on July** 9th, at 7 pm, at the King Center with a line-up of musicians who are legends on their own. Within an hour after the ticket office opened, the show was sold out. Those lucky ones who walked away with a ticket may look forward to a lifetime concert with the world's most famous drummer, Ringo Starr, along with Edgar Winter, Richard Marx, Rod Argents, Mark Hudson, Sheila E. and 80's rock legend Billy Squier. To set the exiting mood for an incredible show on July 9th, Brevard Live highlights some of the legends performing in the All-Starrs Band.

From former members of such supergroups as The Eagles, The Rascals, Night Ranger and others, the rosters of high profile musicians in Ringo Starr's various "All-Starr" touring bands over the years have read like a "Who's Who" of rock royalty. This year is no exception. In addition to pop songsmith and 80s hit maker Richard Marx, percussionist extrordinaire Sheila E, former Argent front man Rod Argent and legendary keyboardist Edgar Winter this year's ensemble also features the one and only Billy Squier on guitar.

Boston native, Billy

Squier first gained (a little) national notoriety in the late 70s as a member of the short lived, ill-fated group Piper. In 1980 his debut solo album Tale Of The Tape was released on Capitol records, unfortunately also to little fanfare. However, in 1981, he mounted the international rock scene like a drunken sailor on leave and rode it hard all the way to the top of the charts with his second album Don't Say No. This multi-platinum selling sophomore effort featured such classic rock staples as In The Dark, My Kind Of Lover, and his signature anthem

The Stroke. A Top Ten album combined with a string of successful, radio friendly singles, along with a nonstop touring schedule with such arena favorites as REO Speedwagon and Foghat had made Billy Squier a rock and roll household name by the end of 1981.

Throughout the early to mid 80s Billy Squier remained hot as a pistol, continuing to taste platinum with Top Ten chartbusting albums like Emotions In Motion and Signs Of Life. Subsequent hit singles like Everybody Wants You, She's A Runner, Rock Me Tonight, Don't Say You Love Me and an appearance on the 1982 Fast Times At Ridgemont High motion picture soundtrack also helped to propel him to the heights of rock superstardom. Although little has been heard from Billy Squier in recent years, his status is forever cemented as a major name in rock history and he successfully adds even more "curb appeal" to Ringo's already stellar line-up.

In 1986, Tom Collins, a developer by profession, purchased the property known as Sebastian Inlet Marina but would become Captain Hiram's. "I liked this spot on the river," says Tom. "I felt this place had potential." Since then it has grown from a small marina into the area's largest waterfront resort and restaurants. All month of June Captain Hiram's celebrates its 20th anniversary with an official party weekend on June 23, 24, and 25.

Captain Hiram's River Raw Bar opened on June 1st, 1987 with just 28 seats. Tom Collins had partnered with Martin Carter and Jimmy Hoffman and together they pursued their visions of turning the Sebastian Inlet Marina into an area attraction. The restaurant has expanded continuously over the years and now seats in excess of 500 people. The upstairs waterfront banquet and meeting facilities replaced the apartment that housed the original owners, prior to the purchase by Tom, Martin and Jimmy.

In the mid 1990's the SandBar was added and has been continuously expanded, most recently with the addition of the Coral Bar and the Grand Sand Bandstand. Entertainment/PR director Jan Taylor picks and chooses only the best bands and musicians to perform daily. She has up to 60 gigs per month to fill and works with 36 bands. For the past years, Jan has kept the live entertainment at Captain Hiram's diversified and fresh featuring young alternative groups (like dManufacture, see page 43) along with popular classic rock bands. For this month's entertainment schedule go to the calendar section or check the website at hirams.com.

The marina has evolved over the years, growing from a facility with 14 boat slips to a full service marina with 60 slips, a ship's store and transient facilities for the boating guests.

The hotel originated in 1994 with the construction of four Captain's Quarters rooms, located over the ships store. The success of these rooms led to the development of the Key West Inn (with 70 rooms), which opened in March of 2000. With all those expansions Captain Hiram's has been changing constantly during the past 20 years, but a few things stayed the same: The dining room is not air-conditioned, but enjoys a refreshing river breeze. The dress-code is casual and you are welcomed in shorts and flip flops. (The banquet rooms and the hotel rooms are under air!)

And the faces are, for the most part, the same: Tom, Martin and Jimmy still own Captain Hiram's. The customers from way back then are still showing up, and even the waiters and waitresses are mostly here to stay.





including the Melbourne Art Festival in 2000 and 2001, Biketoberfest, and the Friday Fest street party's among others.



florida CD/DVD REVIEWS by Chris Long

BILLY CHAPMAN - Sweet Nothings 13 Song CD

Billy Chapman has been an icon of Brevard's music scene for nearly 20 years. In fact, he's been on stage entertaining us here on the Space Coast for so long that it's perhaps easy to take his talent for granted. However, this record "brought it all home" reminding me once again of how supremely talented and gifted this guy really is.

For starters, buyer beware. If you're looking for hip, cool, funky-fresh, street grooves that'll "rock the house" bee-atch, you ain't gonna find 'em here. Sweet Nothings is a stripped down collection of heartfelt acoustic compositions. For me, a great song needs to tell a great story and this record is full of personal stories and observations based on the life experiences of this unique artist.

Billy has been associated for so long in this town with being a singer in various projects that I had kinda lost sight of what an amazing guitarist he is. And oddly enough my two favorite tracks on this record, Scratchy and Maleguena are both amazing instrumental compositions.

At best, Sweet Nothings offers charming, raspy-throat little ditties like the lead off track, In The Moonlight and Young Wild & Free. On the other hand, Billy can also "ramble" a bit as is the case with Summer Rain. However, (for what it's worth) I really liked the record and I played it over and over at least eight or ten times in the ol' mini van before once again replacing it with my new Dresden Dolls CD.



Health-Guru Hagen Panton: MORE DAYLIGHT, MORE VITAMIN D

More than half of American women receiving drug therapy for osteoporosis are deficient in vitamin D, according to the Journal of Clinical Endocrinology and Metabolism (2005;90:3215-24). Vitamin D is essential for calcium absorption and metabolism and is required for healthy bones and to protect against osteoporosis. The new research suggests that many women with osteoporosis are using drugs to treat a problem that could be helped simply by getting sun more often or by taking a nutritional supplement.

Researchers measured blood levels of vitamin D and parathyroid hormone (which regulates calcium metabolism) in 1,526 postmenopausal women whose average age was 71. The optimal blood level of vitamin D remains a matter of debate, but the authors used 30 nanograms/ milliliter (ng/ml) as a cutoff point below which women were considered deficient. Just over half the women studied were vitamin D–deficient. Vitamin D deficiency was also more common among women who took less than 400 IU per day of vitamin D as a supplement.

The conclusions of this study are limited, because the authors studied North American women only during the winter months, when blood vitamin D levels tend to be at their lowest. Because they studied almost exclusively white women, their results cannot be extrapolated to other racial groups. Nonwhites have been reported to have an even higher rate of vitamin D insufficiency.

Osteoporosis is a common disease in which bones become porous and brittle and lose their mass. As a result, bones become more susceptible to fractures. Both men and women are affected by osteoporosis, but it is more common in women. According to the National Institutes of Health, 10 million Americans have osteoporosis and an additional 34 million have low bone mass, putting them at increased risk for the disease. In the United States. half of all women over 50

(and a quarter of all men that age) will have an osteoporosis-related fracture in their lifetime, usually of the hip, spine, or wrist. Because of the central roles nutrition and lifestyle play in bone health, osteoporosis is very much a preventable disease.

The recommended daily intake of vitamin D is 400 IU for women ages 51 to 70 and 600 IU for women 70 years and older. The most important source of vitamin D is sunshine. When the skin is exposed to ultraviolet light, it makes vitamin D (some estimates say the body can get sufficient vitamin D from a daily 20-minute exposure of face and arms). Many elderly women and men become deficient in vitamin D because they spend most or all of their time indoors. There has also been millions of dollars spent on misleading advertising by the sunscreen industry to cause you to fear sunlight and buy their products. Vitamin D is also found in foods, primarily those of animal origin, such as fish, eggs, milk products, and meats. Mushrooms are a significant nonanimal source



of vitamin D. Tanning beds and nutritional supplements containing vitamin D are also cost effective ways to obtain this essential nutrient.

In addition to getting adequate vitamin D and calcium, osteoporosis risk can be reduced by making dietary and lifestyle changes, such as eating moderate amounts of animal protein, eating less salt, avoiding caffeine and soft drinks containing phosphoric acid, quitting smoking, and getting regular weight-bearing exercise, such as walking. Exercise is necessary not only for bone health but also to keep coordination up in the event of a fall. This will allow quicker reaction times and better motor skills. Thanks for learning with me... 




COOLIE RANX PERFORMS AT BENEFIT CONCERT

A nne White-Scruggs and George White are much more than mother and son — they are collaborators, taking inspiration from the earth and creating beautiful pottery. They make a well-balanced team with George throwing the pots and Anne creating the intricate surface decorations.

It has been a long creative journey for Anne to this collaboration with her son. It started in Tennessee where she was born. Her mother, a quilter and artist, discouraged the first signs that Anne might become a potter. She told Anne to stop playing with mud or she'd never amount to a hill of beans. We're glad Anne didn't take that to heart.

After Anne married her first husband, they moved to Montana where Anne studied with master potters at the Archie Bray Foundation and participated in seminars conducted by the great potters Shoji Hamada, Maria Martinez, and Bernard Leach. She also developed an art show for TV, taught blind students, and became involved in several state organizations. She sold her pottery in several galleries from Montana to Seattle, Washington, and she taught pottery classes in her studio.

After Montana, Anne moved back to Nashville, Tennessee, where she became the director of the Artist Guild Galleries (a position she held from 1965 until 1972), she was an art therapist for the Mental Health Association, she provided training for art educators, and she taught at a private school for girls. It's obvious that she loves children as she includes them in her work and volunteer work wherever she goes. She believes that children, and particularly troubled children, need art the most.

When Anne's children went off to college and after her divorce, she decided to move to Bell Buckle, Tennessee, a town of 453 people. She bought a Victorian home and opened a bed and breakfast. Webb School, an international boarding school, was located three blocks from her home. She helped develop the art department for the school and taught there for ten years. Anne soon saw Bell Buckle's potential for artists, and she helped to promote the restoration of the 14 downtown, historic buildings. She bought the old bank building for \$4,000, and they gave her the building next door as a bonus. She renovated both buildings and used them as her studio and shop — Bell Buckle Crafts.

Anne met her second husband, Bob Scruggs (of the musical Scruggs family), in the Bell Buckle Café. He provides the promotional component for Anne's artwork as well as being an accomplished writer and musician. They lived in Bell Buckle for 27 years. Due to her leadership in transforming Bell Buckle into a tourist destination, the Tennessee Department of Tourist Development chose Anne as a "Tennessee Treasure." She was honored along with B.B. King for her contributions to Tennessee. Anne was also honored with lifetime membership in the Tennessee Association of Craftpersons and Artists, and she was honored by Bell Buckle when they named a street after her.

George White comes by his talents naturally. His artistic tendencies started in Anne's first studio in Montana. In fact,

all three of Anne's children used to play in the studio while she worked. So, it is perfectly logical that they all grew to have talents in writing, art, and music.

George White moved to the Melbourne area approximately 20 years ago. After graduating from the University of Tennessee with a degree in journalism, he worked at the local newspapers in and around Bell Buckle. About 20 years ago when the Gannett newspaper group formed, the head of the journalism department at the University of Tennessee recommended that George write for Florida Today. He continues to write for them and provides the photography for his articles. Multi-talented, George also plays the banjo with the Buckateers, he writes poetry, and of course he throws pots. His love for children shines through with his involvement with the Indian Guides – a group for boys and girls ages 8 to 12 years.

Before Anne moved to Florida, George discovered the Horse Creek Pottery — a co-operative that provides workspace for potters, including 15 potters' wheels, a primitive wood fire kiln, and a gas-reduction firing kiln. When Anne and her husband came down for extended visits three years in a row before moving here, she joined the Horse Creek Pottery. The association with other artists and living near George made the decision to move to Florida much easier

Anne and George have merged beautifully as potters. George throws the pots ensuring that he achieves their goals of forming a beautiful shape while maintaining utility. Then it's Anne's turn. She never knows what she'll see in a pot when she starts carving, but she knows that her love of the earth, her Cherokee heritage, and her fondness for artwork depicting an Asian influence will come through. They always do.

Anne has been here for a year now. In that year, she and George have found the fellowship of other artists through the Horse Creek Pottery and the Art and Antiques Gallery (in the historic Eau Gallie area of Melbourne) where Anne and George show their work. In June, their joint show, Generations: Pottery Passed On will be highlighted by the Art and Antiques Gallery. A reception for the public is scheduled for June 2^{nd} , 5:30 to 8:30, at the gallery to kick off their show. In addition, George's book of poetry and photography, Blackbird Highway, will debut during the show. The poetry and photographs offer a reminiscent view of earlier years in the South.




